Dear Ones,

The most recent presbytery meeting took place the last day of April at Titusville Presbyterian -- the church where I grew up. It was delightful to be joined by Jenn Wedzik, who attended as your voting commissioner.

Presbytery meetings are always fascinating and highly informative (really!) but this one was also brimming with holy magic.

Although I'm at the Titusville church every month for Committee on Ministry meetings, have substituted in the pulpit, and have attended other presbytery meetings there, for some reason, the one I was remembering most clearly was my one as moderator of presbytery. In that case, I was scared stiff and not noticing anything.

This week, maybe it's because Jenn was there, and she's such a

wonderful symbol of this church, or maybe it was because we began the meeting in the fellowship hall. Who knows? But there was plenty to notice.

There was my junior high youth fellowship advisor in the kitchen dishing out chicken. There was my 10th grade geography teacher handing out bulletins. There were at least three choir members who were singing when I was. And I teared up with

each instance of that lovely holy magic.



And then....discovering the massive early-1800's stained glass window of Jonathan and David (I had to look it up, too) hidden away in one of the upstairs Sunday school rooms where my Open Space group met. Such an impression did that window make on my youth as the visual centerpiece of the chapel where youth Sunday school classes were held -- since swallowed up by a new Christian education building -- that it still appears in my dreams. Lo and behold, how did I not know that all the windows and much of the antique woodwork were retained? The building went up after I left Titusville for college, so I had not seen that window for about 50 years.

And that was followed by a running exploration with Rev. Keith Sundberg (Wayside) and CLP Patti Orton Kuna (Sugar Grove) in tow through more rooms and the prayer room and down the back stairs, just glorying in the beauty of the preserved parts of that magical building that cocooned my early spiritual formation.

Good thing I was in the lead, because I was weeping. There. Admitted it.

The purpose of that long story is to bless you and thank you for all the holy magic you and your beloved church building – so filled with beauty and history – are making right now for yourselves, the youth, and all your brothers and sisters in Christ.

It's happening all the time. Every time you sing in the choir. Every time you teach a Sunday school class. Every time you visit a shut-in or deliver flowers. Every time you pray together. Every time you work in the kitchen or fix a faucet. Every time you decorate the sanctuary. Every time you get the bricks fixed or work the Swiss steak dinner.

There will be a Presbytery meeting on April 30th in

Titusville, Pa. On a motion and second, Jennifer Wedzik was elected to be our commissioner to this meeting.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Robin requested vacation for the week after Easter, April 22nd to 29^{th.} and also July 1st to 7th. Motion approved.

"Wine and the Word" book club is continuing on Mondays. Next one is on April 29th at Dave Maille's home at 7 pm. Thanks to the hosts.

As mentioned in the April newsletter, there were lots of questions about the free half-day class on computer basics. More details will be provided as they become available.

Motion and second to approve the wedding of Kyle Foust and Casey Cass Stoll on September 14th was approved. Pastor Robin will be officiating.

UNGLUDED CHURCH PROJECT: Barb reported on reflections and discussion to start this program. They also reviewed the results of the churches in the area by the Presbyterian Foundation survey. The committee seems pleased with some of the results. Continued prayers, go out from session, for all of their ongoing hard work. Next meeting will be Saturday April 27th at 10. All are invited to attend.

Motion made and seconded to send in the \$600 fee for this project into Presbytery. Motion carried.

PERSONNEL: On a motion from committee, it was requested that the church secretary's office hours be changed to Tuesday. The new schedule will be Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9 a.m. to noon. Motion carried. Note: Pastor Robin will keep her hours (Monday, Wednesday, and Friday).

PROPERTY: The building use request approved last month from the Velez family for a 1st birthday party in the fellowship hall was cancelled on April 14th and rescheduled to April 27th (2pm-5pm). A motion to approve carried.

Motion was made and seconded for Jared to purchase a compatible computer & router and to update the Wi-Fi for the church office. Motion carried.

Request for the chairs in the library to be put into the garage sale and new ones purchased. Since there was no sentimental attachment to any of them, session agreed.

On a motion and second to pursue a bid to seal the Church's parking lot, session approved. Dave Maille will seek a contract with the work to be completed before preschool starts in the fall. His best guess is around \$3000. Motion carried.

STEWARDSHIP/FINANCE: Swiss steak dinner plans are going well. Germanium sales will start after Easter.

The committee expressed Thanks to Jan Hanes for her many years of dedication and for taking care of the Memorial funds of this church.

The February Financial Report was presented. On a motion and second, session voted to approve as corrected. Treasurer Jim reported that all bank statements balanced.

THE WEB SITE: The latest word on the site is that any day we will see something. Bob Kellerman has spent hours working with the web master trying to finish up. Still in need of pictures so let him know if you have any.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: The Friday April 5th craft night hosted by the Sunday school went well. All are invited to check out their "hand crafted items" and thanks to the youth for their One Great Hour of Sharing participation.

Last day of Sunday school will be May 19th.

MEMBERSHIP CARE & DEVELOPMENT: The Membership Committee moves that we have an all-member visitation day on Sunday, May 19. The plan is for Session members, Deacons and the Membership Committee members to visit all families of the church that day, presenting each family with a free geranium and giving them a short questionnaire regarding their likes/dislikes and wishes for the future of HPC. Families will be visited by teams of two and the questionnaire/ postcard would be filled out on the spot. It is believed that each team will have 4-5 families to visit and the lists will be compiled by the Membership Committee.


Helping the Homeless
