Can I rant for a few minutes? Why do stores feel like they have to completely rearrange their entire departments every few years? Walmart, for the last few months, have been moving freezers and shelves and merchandise. They had to temporary move whole sections from one place to another. There

appears that there was no strategic plan to get things to their final destination. When I needed to buy a new tablecloth, it took me over an hour to find it by the office supplies—and yes, I did ask a Walmart associate, but she had no clue either where the table cloths were temporary put.

Carts are bumping into carts. Aisles are so narrow that two carts cannot pass side-by-side. Customers are grumpy, associates are frustrated and managers are standing around leafing through store maps. I still cannot see the logic for this change—it certainly has not made this consumer's life easier!

#### Chaost

"In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light" (Genesis 1:1-3 NRSV).

In the chaos, God is there!

Throughout scripture we read about pillars of the Judeo-Christian tradition as they find themselves wrestling deeply with the reality of their humanity and the challenges it brings. We read about Noah, Abraham and Sarah, Hagar and Ishmael, Isaac, Jacob, David and the list goes on.

In each of these stories of jumbled, chaotic mess we hear the voice of God speaking. Sometimes God's words will bring comfort—God brings order to the chaos. Other times, God speaks demands that make us uncomfortable and raise difficult questions about the nature of our faith—questions for which we do not have easy answers.

But the presence of God is a constant in the lives of our forebears in the faith, just as the presence of God is a constant in our own lives, through the good times and the bad.

Life is a jumbled, chaotic mess. Every human being faces times in which everything seems to be coming apart at the seams. Some of our times of trial seem to come out of nowhere. Tragedy simply strikes. A person is fired from his or her job. An accident happens. A disease takes hold in a body. A loved one dies. A tornado hits. A war breaks out. All these turn lives upside down...inside out and life becomes a twisted, jumbled mess.

Other periods of uncertainty and strife can be predicted. The human life cycle takes each of us on a journey of growth and transition. We leave the dark, watery security of our mother's womb by violently passing through the birth canal and out into the bright, noisy, frightening world. We start out as completely dependent, helpless infants, but in a short time, we change into crawlers, walkers, skippers, and dancers. Each one of these life transitions requires us to renegotiate our relationships and our place in the world. The changes we face as we grow and develop and transition through the human lifespan throw us into periods of jumbled, chaotic mess.

In the chaos, God is there!

Just like each one of us, the people of our faith tradition faced those same life transitions. Some of their struggles—their moments of jumbled, chaotic mess—are recorded in our sacred texts.

The good news is God is with us, speaking light and live, love and hope, into the murky, jumbled, chaotic mess of the world. In fact, it is often in the chaos itself where the work of God happens most profoundly. When life feels messy, look for signs of God hard at work!

As we walk this journey with our forebears in the faith, may we look for the light of God shining brightly on the path ahead. May we listen for God's voice speaking creation into being and forming community out of chaos. And may our unjumbled jumble begin to dance, even as we sing, "It is well! It is well with my soul!"

(I offer these words as Pastor Robin heals from her recent surgery. Life has thrown her into a temporary chaotic mess. May God's light shine upon her bringing her physical healing so that she may quickly return to us. God's blessings to you, Pastor Robin! ~ Mary)





Wine and the Word will continue to meet every other Monday. We meet at different homes, so please see the church bulletin or call the church office for the place that week.




#### What's in the Bible?

# Notes from August's Session meeting:

<u>Clerk's Report</u>: Chris Thomas agreed to follow up on advertising in the Harborcreek community magazine. Session voted to spend no more than \$300 on an ad.

<u>Correspondence</u>: The 2020 general assembly to be held in Baltimore, MD. Presbytery has changed the method for choosing delegates, and is looking for anyone interested. Please ask Mary Ellen for an application if you'd like to consider it

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Pastor Robin updated us on her medical concerns. We are very happy to learn that no back surgery will be needed at this time.

She also reported on her attending a group of area pastors who meet to share ideas for community outreach and faith exploration.

The kids' reading club was very successful. Next year it was suggested to have a length of only 6 weeks instead of 12. Thanks to all who helped.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

<u>Unglued Church Project</u>: The committee reported on their meeting with updates on the details of the Family Fun Night to be held on Aug 10th.

They presented their idea for a new 9 word mission statement: "Loving and serving others as Jesus does." There is only one more meeting left in the program, but the committee will continue as they are not yet ready to dissolve and still have more ideas to explore

<u>Stewardship & Finance</u>: All accounts balanced and session voted to approve June and July's Treasurer's report.

Session voted to send \$2,000 toward presbytery loan.

<u>Christian Education</u>: On Sept. 8<sup>th</sup> Sunday school will start back up at 9:45am.

Chris Thomas will begin the Sunday school mornings with music working toward more kids singing in worship. Thanks to Marnie Logan for volunteering the last several years.

Adult breakfast & and movie will start on Sept 8<sup>th</sup>.

Membership Care & Development: We still need someone to count those attending Sunday morning worship.

4<sup>th</sup> Tues (Aug 27<sup>th</sup>) will have Ron & Mary Ellen Flowers present a slide show of their trip to Iceland.

Mission & Outreach: The Pentecost offering was \$347 on June 16 with 40% (\$138.80) retained by our church.

The June 30<sup>th</sup> Upper Room luncheon at St. Paul's Church was a success. We served about 80 people and they appreciated the small toiletries we gave out from the congregation.

Next Upper Room luncheon will be Sept 29<sup>th</sup> at which time we will distribute hats and gloves made by our shawl ministry.

**Nominating & Training**: The committee has begun working on the church officers for the year 2020.

<u>Personnel</u>: Employee evaluations have been started.

Church Secretary Mary Stewart will work on the church's web site on Tuesdays.

<u>Property</u>: The committee has been working on the playground upkeep, including the challenge of the parking lot water runoff in front of the sidewalk of the CE building. The committee will check into some repairs needed on the CE ramp before school starts.

<u>Old Business</u>: Reminder of church family pictures to be taken Oct 3<sup>rd</sup>.

The church is still looking for someone to maintain the Church's Facebook account. It is currently up and running.

<u>New Business</u>: Session asked the worship committee to research and collect bids on upgrading our sound system and this will include finding someone to run a sound booth.

Session approved the position of a nursery attendant during Sunday morning worship The church will pay for clearances needed. Chris Mosier has agreed to staff the nursery and can start as early as Aug 18<sup>th</sup>. The weekly bulletin will reflect this change.


## Helping the Homeless
