A Message from Pastor Robin:

Greetings, Dear Ones!

In the meantime, though, aren't the online services absolutely terrific? The wonderful members responsible have been doing an exceptional job of leading worship and keeping us safe while we're alone...together (as the TV ad says.) Special thanks to Jared Mosier and Chris Thomas, both of whom have been there every week.

If you haven't yet, please tune in Sundays at 11 a.m. on our Facebook page or the church Website. And if anyone is having trouble finding it, please call a technologically adept member so they can talk you through it.

Know how I often give you homework assignments in sermons? Don't think I've ever assigned homework in a newsletter...until now. So here it is. (Eventually.)

A daily devotional written by United Church of Christ pastor Rev. Vince Amlin (Presbyterians are in "full communion with UCC) really caught my eye. Titled "The Better Part," he bases it on the Martha and Mary story, with Jesus telling Martha that "there is need of only one thing."

Amlin has a 7 a.m. reminder on his phone – "Pray for people!" He set the reminder as soon as quarantine began. He divided his list of members and prays for a few people each day.

I'll let Rev. Amlin take over from here:

"So what?!" you may be saying. "You're a minister! You should have been doing that all along!"

OK, arguably, yes. But I wasn't. Not like this.

"And yes, I'm sure there are more faithful ministers who have been at it their whole careers. And yes, there are probably more faithful ministers who, having started the practice, would keep it going after



quarantine is over. (But between you and I, the chances of that for me are not good.)

"Still, there's some value in recognizing what's important in a crisis. Like a global pandemic or God's anointed one dropping in unannounced.

"Mary seizes the moment to sit and listen. To connect. To go deeper. She understands that something is happening and her priorities need to change.


"Which is not to say that our own moment is an opportunity. Or - God forbid! - a gift. Or that there is any call to look for a silver lining.

"Just that something is happening. And we might do well to live differently, even just for the moment. In case you, like me, need reminders.

"Prayer: With all the parts of life that are missing, give us the better parts. Amen."

Assignment: Use your church directory and join me in very intentionally praying for all the members of this church family. I can testify that you're really great at it!

Community Care
