Dear Ones,

Fair warning: Stop right here if you don't like goose stories.

Did you know geese are a symbol of the Holy Spirit in Celtic Christianity? It's true. Here's a succinct explanation from the Center for Christian Ethics at Baylor University.

"The wild goose, in addition to the dove, is a Celtic Christian symbol for the Holy Spirit. Sometimes God's Spirit hovers comfortingly like a dove. But the Spirit also surprises us and disturbs our plans. Like a wild and unpredictable goose, the Holy Spirit sweeps in unexpected, astonishing directions."

I'm pretty sure I knew that, even subconsciously, when I persuaded Patrick to acquire our first geese when we got married and moved to Findley Lake 34 years ago. During those years, we had all types and breeds -purebreds and mutts, gorgeous and plain, loud and quiet. They lived in a goose penthouse we built them – half on land and half on water, with toasty houses and wind barriers for winter.

They loved "talking" to visitors both human and avian, including Canada geese, fancy migrating waterfowl and an escaped flamingo from the Erie Zoo, but that's a story for another time.

A few times, we even hatched some of their eggs in an incubator in the garage. The last three hatches were John, Meme and Maxwell, Jr. John was white, and some lake folks thought he was a lone swan because I made him stay outside the pen. But that's a story for another time.

Meme was so named because that's the sound she made while still in the shell a few days before she hatched.

John and Meme died a couple years ago. Senior citizen Maxwell was still fine – the grand old man of the lake whom kids loved meeting because he was mighty handsome and, unbelievably, older than they were! Even older than some of their parents!

Eventually, Maxwell was not fine. He died in late May. He would have been 31 years old in July.

I will never, ever be able to look out the windows or pass what used to be the goose pen without remembering Maxwell and his friends through all the years.

And those wonderful symbols, even in memory, make the Holy Spirit a story for all times.



SPECIAL DONATION OPTIONS

During the year you may want to make a special donation in memory (or in honor) of someone.

Following are the many options available:

Memorial Fund: This is a special account to collect funds to be used within the local church for worship and education related expenses. Monies can be earmarked for special projects and sometimes a plaque is dedicated to the memory of a loved one.

Endowment Fund: Generally donations (often memorials) can be directed to this Fund that is managed by the Presbyterian Church USA Foundation and their New Covenant Mutual Funds. Yearly dividends are split between missions and capital improvements for our church. As with most endowments, numerous options for bequests and investing are available.

Capital Improvement Fund (CIF/Building Fund): Donations directed to this account are used to make payments towards any loans (none at this time) and to provide 'seed money' for future projects. Recent ones were exterior painting and maintenance of the church and manse and a new bell tower roof scheduled for 2021.

General Fund: Of course donations are gratefully accepted any time to help support the general running of the church and its programs.
