World Communion Sunday



World Communion Sunday takes place on October 03, 2021. World Communion Sunday is a celebration observed by several Christian denominations, taking place on the first Sunday of every October, that promotes Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation. The tradition originated in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in 1933, was adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936, and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches), led by Jesse Moren Bader, endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide. - 5. "Oh give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever!" (Psalm 107:1)






Swiss Steak Dinner Saturday November 6th!

Stewardship 2022

October is our traditional season to engage the whole congregation in the support of our church's mission. Our theme this year is being "All In!" What is needed as this congregation celebrates our 190th year in existence in Harborcreek will be explained in a mailing to be sent out in mid-October and during regular worship services. Your prompt response is encouraged and always appreciated. Our official Dedication Sunday will be October 24th.

SPECIAL DONATION OPTIONS

During the year you may want to make a special donation in memory (or in honor) of someone.

Following are the many options available:

Memorial Fund: This is a special account to collect funds to be used within the local church for worship and education related expenses. Monies can be earmarked for special projects and sometimes a plaque is dedicated to the memory of a loved one.

Endowment Fund: Generally donations (often memorials) can be directed to this Fund that is managed by the Presbyterian Church USA Foundation and their New Covenant Mutual Funds. Yearly dividends are split between missions and capital improvements for our church. As with most endowments, numerous options for bequests and investing are available.

Capital Improvement Fund (CIF/Building Fund): Donations directed to this account are used to make payments towards any loans (none at this time) and to provide 'seed money' for future projects. Recent ones were exterior painting and maintenance of the church and manse and a new bell tower roof scheduled for 2021.

General Fund: Of course donations are gratefully accepted any time to help support the general running of the church and its programs.

There will be no school back pack program this year as the contributions provided from last year went toward this year's project. Also the Food Bank has asked community businesses for school supplies so none are needed from us.

NOMINATING & TRAINING: At the Sunday, August 22nd congregational meeting, this committee is very happy to present, for election, the name of Barb Griffith to replace Jim Watson as treasurer until December 31, 2022. Also, to help Barb with writing checks, to add Brian Griffith's name to the church's checking account signature cards. Hello, everyone! The new school year has begun and our Preschool has gotten off to a wonderful start! I am very glad to welcome back my terrific staff: Daunice Scipione (Science, Social Studies, Library, & Music); Jenny Beskid (Art & Fine Motor Skills); Karalee Space (Large Motor Skills & Spanish); Kristen Oshlick (Pre-Kindergarten Skills Room Assistant); Stephanie Battista (Art & Fine Motor Skills Room Assistant) and Ann Nesgoda (Finance). They are all dedicated and hard-working individuals and I feel very blessed to have them back "on board" again this year!



Our preschoolers are doing very well! The returning children have jumped right back in and the new children are definitely becoming comfortable with all of us. They are remembering or learning

to share with others, cleaning up after playtime, sitting for Storytime, and listening to their teachers! Even the Bears (the youngest group) are getting used to "lining up" and following teacher directions. The children are talking, playing, exploring, moving, and enjoying! We are certainly off to a great start!

During these initial weeks of school, we talk about making friends, sharing, cooperating, listening, staying in line, and the importance of circle time – all those things that are needed to acclimate us to a Preschool setting. This is done *prior* to my introducing the letters of the alphabet, which occurs toward the end of September -- by then the

children have become used to our school routine.

In order to keep everyone healthy and safe, we continue to follow the covid-19 protocols and procedures that worked for us last year: masking of all students and staff, increased disinfecting and cleaning, no adults except the staff allowed in the building, some outdoor classes, children stay in their assigned homeroom and the teachers move from room to room, etc. All the children are doing

an amazing job with all of these procedures and have already become

very used to them!

It is wonderful to see our classrooms filled with energy, enthusiasm, smiling faces, and caring hearts! There is nowhere else that we would rather be! Until next time . . . take care and may God bless you and yours!

Mission News




"May the God of Peace ... grant you peace at all times in all ways."

It was a daring prayer, all things considered, to ask the Thessalonians to pray — and it is also a daring one for us, I imagine. The second letter to the Thessalonians arrived at a time of turmoil, strife and confusion. The Christian community was experiencing persecutions so severe that some believed the time of judgment had come, while others took advantage of their doubt, spreading misinformation and sowing dissent. The letter ends with a benedictory prayer: for God's peace to be granted at all times in all ways. It might have been daring enough to consider asking them to imagine peace at "any time," much less at "all times," or to imagine peace in some sort of way at all, much less in all of them. Have you ever felt so far from God's peace that you couldn't even imagine it?

Peace is so often a daring prayer and so often provoked in the imagination, first. Artistic expression and movements for justice and peace often dance together. In turmoil, strife and confusion, visual artists and theatrical performances can point us to God's peace-creating presence in our midst. We can listen for God's voice in lamenting or angry poems, and in songs of freedom from those most vulnerable to violence and oppression. And the Church can dance with all whom God loves.

Artistic expression can light up our imaginations and lift our spirits. Our own choir is a shining example of this, as I am sure you will agree. Art may help imagine peace, as it has in Lebanon where war has been a daily reality for far too long; or at the southern U.S. border, where Presbyterians are imagining a season of peace with those who flee from violence; or it might join in songs of hope and inner peace with those considering taking their own lives. The Church joins with those imagining a new world, so we can create it, together.

Give thanks with a grateful heart!



The Peace & Global Witness Offering helps us imagine and create in each of our individual expressions, and together as a whole Church, a witness to the God of Peace. Twenty-five percent of our collection will be used by our congregation. Twenty-five percent is shared with our mid council region, and 50% is shared with our denominational partners so that our witness to peace is extended, and we help fulfill the daring prayer in 2nd Thessalonians: that the God of Peace is known "at all times in all ways."

There is so much peace we are only beginning to imagine, and so we pray hard, with our minds, our gifts, with our Church and all those who inspire a sense of God's peace.

For when we all do a little, it adds up to a lot.
