Dear Ones,

Are you like me, wondering how the time change and early darkness came so soon, and how Advent seems so soon as well? Are you sort of amazed by how little we hear about Advent outside of church? How some kids who can't wait for Santa have no clue about Advent?



We speedy Americans crave *finish lines* and *shortcuts*, but Advent is an invitation to WAIT, to live in quiet anticipation. Our culture sees darkness and speeds on by to the light. But for us lucky church folk, Advent reminds us that things worth waiting for often begin in the dark ---next spring's seeds, God's spirit hovering over dark water, preparing to create worlds.

I appreciate the dark. It seems easier to wait in the dark, doesn't it? As Martin Luther King, Jr. reminds us, "Only in the darkness can you see the stars."

Also, Advent reminds us that God is not yet finished -- not with us and not with the world. Creation and redemption are not once-and-for-all acts of God. God created the world and keeps on actively creating it. God in Christ acted to redeem the world and God in Christ keeps on actively redeeming it.

We live in the in-between times of God's two great interventions into the world --the coming of Christ in the flesh to triumph over death, and the coming of Christ in glory at the end of time. The troubles of the world may never change in this in-between time, but there IS abundant hope because we know that the end of this story has already been written by the resurrected Christ.

In the meantime, when the world is spinning too fast and darkness comes too soon, and we seem to always be waiting, we Christians light candles and prepare our hearts.

And in the in-between time we live in, when the news is grim, and there's so much turmoil, we are called to hold up our heads and *hold up God's promised future*. We are to hold it up and live INTO it.

May we always know that no matter how dark and unprepared we feel, no matter what hymns we sing or when the tree is decorated or the gifts are bought, the light of the world will arrive exactly on time.

May we prepare our hearts with God's peace, God's justice, and God's love.

It is such a pleasure and honor to share the waiting and the Christmas miracle with you.

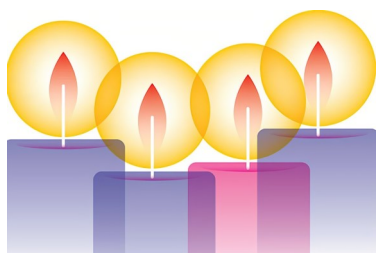

## ***Music for Advent and Christmas Worship***



Worship music for Advent and Christmas will be a bit different this year, but still gorgeous and joyous.

Until the Centers for Disease Control advises otherwise, Chancel

Choir will refrain from singing together in person. Wizard Bill Nesgoda has agreed to put together some virtual choir numbers, depending on his recovery from back surgery.

Among the music to look forward to are performances by the Harmonizers and Gil Long.

The annual cantata on the last Sunday of Advent, Dec. 19, will be “The Road to Bethlehem” by Lloyd Larson. This is also planned for virtual presentation. Linda DeAngelo and Joyce Kriner have already recorded the organ and piano parts for the eight songs.

For any choir members who have not yet performed virtually, Music Director Chris Thomas invites them to give it a try. All that’s needed are a cell phone and a computer or tablet. “If I can do it, you can do it,” Chris said.

Copies of the cantata books are available in the office during church Sunday or during Mary’s office hours Mon., Wed. and Fri. from 9 a.m. to noon.

The annual Christmas Eve service at 7:30 p.m. will feature a combination of live and virtual Chancel Choir and Bell Choir favorites.

Bell choir will continue to practice together in person Wednesdays at 6 p.m. with masks required. Chris hopes the bells can play together live a few times during Advent, and a few times virtually so the performances can be saved for future use.

“To everyone - Thanks for your patience and understanding as we continue to praise the Lord through music in the safest way possible during these crazy times,” Chris said. “Thanks for your dedication to the music program.”

## Blessing Cupboard

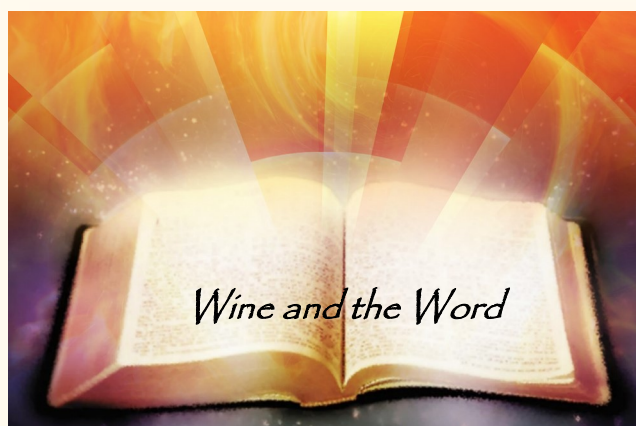
Winter weather has arrived and changes need to be made in what we are giving to the those in need through our outreach cupboard. Food in cans and jars cannot be left out in freezing temperatures. So please do not buy things to donate during the winter months.

Here are some suggestions of things to donate:

- pasta or side dish packets
- oatmeal or boxes of cereal
- granola or breakfast bars
- dried beans
- rice
- nuts
- instant soup mixes
- crackers
- boxed potatoes such as au gratin or mashed
- baking mixes for muffins or breads
- with the holidays are coming, ingredients for baking cookies.

Since we have larger shelves to use now, we are going to eliminate the box for household items. Where it is located would have real snow issues. You may still donate paper products, mouthwash and solid deodorants in the cupboard. However, do not put it soaps or laundry products which are scented and could affect food items.

**Lake Erie Presbytery Commissioner's Report:** A zoom Presbytery meeting was held on October 12, 2021. Mary Ellen attended this meeting and she reported on discussing and approving the 2022 Presbytery budget as well as new terms of calls for our General Presbyter. Also presented and voted on were 2022 terms of call for clergy, commissioned pastors and certified educators. Next presbytery meeting will be November 20, 2021.

**Trailblazer's Report:** The congregational giving for the giving boxes and cabinet has slowed down and some supplies are being purchased using funds from the Trailblazer's budget. The winter weather will soon be here so we are getting ready to change over the types of items that we ask for donations.

**Mission & Outreach:** Next St. Paul's upper room luncheon will be Oct 31<sup>st</sup>.

The peacemaking offering will be received on Oct 3<sup>rd</sup>. There will be no truck or treat this year during Halloween. On a motion from committee, Session voted to provide treats for preschool students during the holiday seasons of Thanksgiving and Christmas. Motion carried.

**Nominating & Training:** Session approved the calling of a congregational meeting to be announced both Oct 17 and 24, to be held after services on October 24<sup>th</sup> for the purpose of electing 2022 church officers and also a PNC committee. Financial Auditor for 3 year term; Ron Flowers.

Also the committee's recommendation for a PNC (pastor nominating committee) to be presented to the congregation for a vote on Oct 24<sup>th</sup> to work with Emmanuel's PNC will be the following 5 people with equal votes; Brian Griffith, Sue Kellerman, Jared Mosier, Kyle Foust, & Evan Foust. This committee will report back to Session with their thoughts and ideas, before processing forward and meeting with Emmanuel church.

Once the combined PNCs meet, Rev. Anita will meet with both Sessions and PNCs. Brian Griffith will be added to Sessions monthly agenda so he can keep Session up to date with their process
