Jesus Cleanses the Temple John 2:13-22



Jerusalem's temple will be destroyed, but God is not contained there.

The temple in Jerusalem was a very sacred and holy place of worship for the people of Jesus' time. We know now that God is with us everywhere all the time, but back in the time of Jesus, the temple is where God was thought to "live." Accessing God was

thought to happen at the temple.

The temple in Jerusalem had already been destroyed and rebuilt three times when Jesus spoke of it being destroyed again, which you can imagine probably didn't sit well with the people. But Jesus wasn't referring to a building that would be destroyed. Jesus' body was the "temple" that wouldn't last forever and he reassured the people that even when his body was gone, God's love would remain forever!


