From the Rector



Why We Do Mission Trips

It's not unusual, when newcomers among us hear about our mission projects in North Dakota, Tennessee, Uganda, the Dominican Republic, or elsewhere, for them to say, "There are plenty of people who need help here in West Orange County. Why go to (fill in the blank with whichever location they think is least logical)?"

I've been fielding that question since 1985 when I went on my first mission trip as a Youth Minister, and the answers – because there are several reasons – are still the same:

- Mission projects benefit the folks we serve. EVERY project addresses genuine needs of the people where we go. Whether it's painting or repairing homes for low-income folks, conducting Vacation Bible School for children, teaching English, providing meals, or driving a bus; we meet needs no one else is.
- The projects we pick are NOT "random acts of kindness." Every one is done in partnership with people or ministries that are in the targeted community daily. We don't blast into town, do a few good deeds, and blast out, leaving the folks we served to fend for themselves. We don't show up and start a project and leave it for someone else to finish. We go to support and supplement what God is already doing through a local church, an ongoing ministry, or a faithful minister, so that what we do is not a

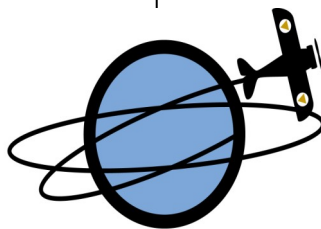
"flash in the pan," but offers long-term benefits to the folks we serve.

- We don't choose whom or where we serve randomly. We work ONLY with ministries and people I personally know and trust to be genuine men and women of God who are showing and sharing the love of God – and who have a proven track record of honesty, integrity, and financial accountability.
- Our missionaries benefit as much as those we serve. They always come away with a deep gratitude for what they have here at home: materially, spiritually, and relationally.
- That gratitude spawns compassion, opens their eyes to notice the needs of people around them here at home, and prompts them to do something about those needs in their everyday life.
- The life-lessons learned on mission projects serve our missionaries for the rest of their life: learning to cook, clean, wash dishes, sweep floors, what to take and what NOT to take on a trip, drive a nail, paint a wall, use power tools, measure a board, interact with people from another culture, speak another language, survive without parents, and get along with each other in stressful, unfamiliar, and often uncomfortable situations are all vital skills for a successful life.
- They get to experience the presence, power, protection, provision, and peace of God in ways they seldom do at home, and emerge with their faith, hope, and love challenged, strengthened, and deepened.
- Youth missionaries often grow up to be active servants and entrepreneurial leaders in their parish family, school, community, and work. After 32 years of mission trips, I've got dozens of stories from my "alumni"

how their experience as missionaries helped form them into the men and women God – and they – want them to be.

- Some go on to bigger missionary work, like our own Laura Cook, who's been serving God since she started as an acolyte here at age 8, went on several mission trips as a teenager, became a Lay Eucharistic Minister and Visitor in high school, got an educational degree in college in order to teach in an inner-city school, and

is now in Uganda serving orphans and children who'd be lost without the ministry she works for.



MISSION TRIP

- Mission projects give the folks who DON'T go – and who may never be

able to because of their health or a lack of time to do such a trip – the opportunity to serve others through their prayers, encouragement, and financial gifts. Those who DON'T go on those projects are EQUAL PARTNERS with those who do go, and those who DO go are profoundly grateful to those who DON'T for their partnership in the Gospel.

But the bottom line for why we do mission projects is Jesus' Great Commission. He says, "GO into all the world, making disciples and teaching people to obey everything I've said."

He does NOT say "Write a check, so OTHERS can go," he says, "GO" – as in "YOU go."

THAT'S why we do missions: because when the Messiah says, "GO," how can we do anything else?

The deficit was covered from Contingency Fund. The lion's share of that deficit was water damage from a leak in the rental house at 227 North Main Street, that we expect insurance to cover.

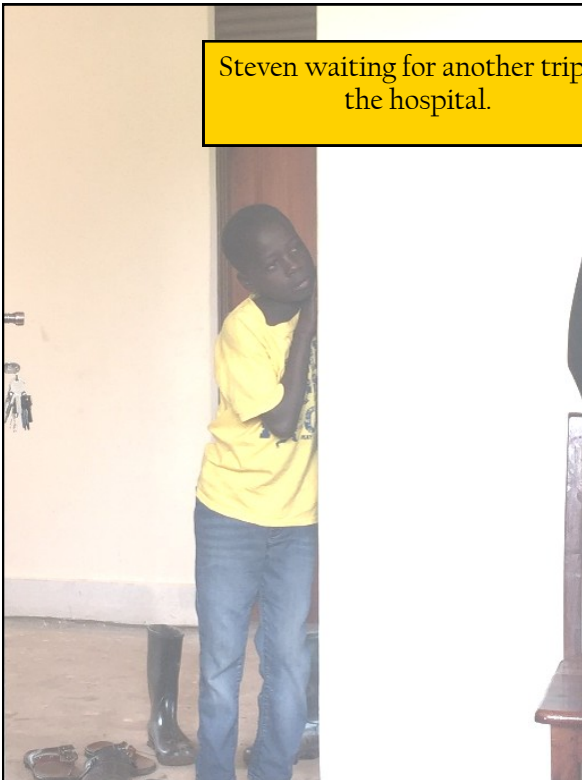

I've read two books again this month, one of which I am still working on: *God's Abundance for Women: Devotions for a More Meaningful Life*, edited by Kathy Collard Miller.

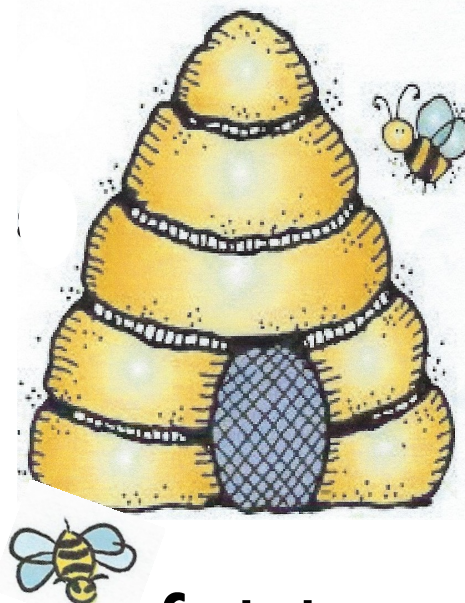

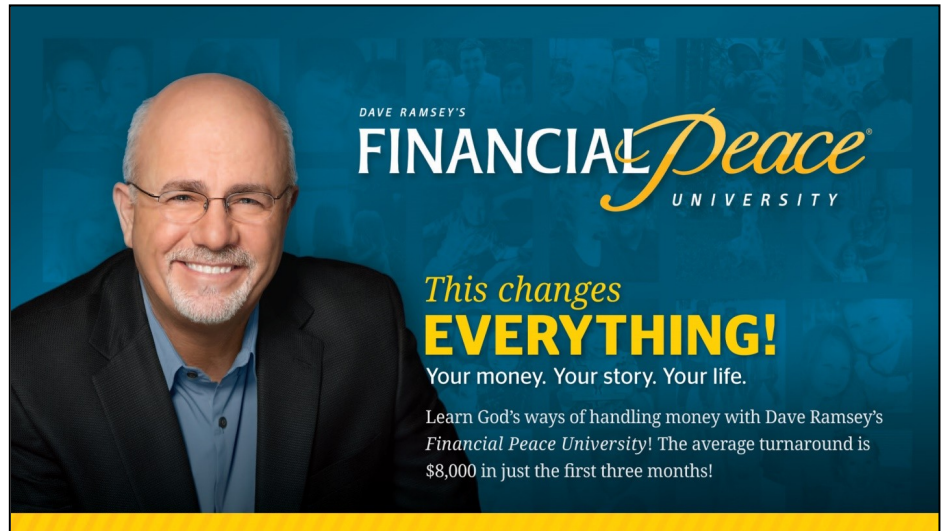
