From the Rector



Messiah Missionaries Go North & South

This summer, most of us in the Messiah family are "Going [somewhere] in peace to love and serve the Lord" as missionaries.

Some of us are doing that deliberately, and we've been planning our mission project for months.

Our Youth Mission Team flies to Bismarck, North Dakota from July 16-22 to work on the Standing Rock Sioux Reservation. We're helping the Episcopal Diocese there put on Camp St. Gabriel, a summer camp for Native American middle and high school students. We are cleaning and preparing the cabins and campground before the campers arrive, doing the food service (making the menu, buying groceries, cooking and serving the meals, and cleaning up afterward), doing whatever is helpful during the camp itself, and cleaning up the campground afterward. Since I have a Commercial Driver's License (Ask me about the drama it took to get THAT two years ago!), I'm driving the bus – both for the campers and for our group.

Our Team is Deacon Julie Altenbach, Kara Altenbach, Noah Altenbach, Murph Borno, Jessica Brueggeman, Natasha Brueggeman, Mother Tracy Dugger, Hayley

Scandura, Youth Minister Janie Walton, Chelsea Wilkinson-Borno, John Wilkinson-Borno, and me. Brittany Kolacki is going up sooner as a summer intern with the Diocese and then is coming home with us on the 22nd. PLEASE PRAY FOR US!

In early August, my wife Debbie and I are going to Luperón on the north coast of the Dominican Republic to visit Rando the teenage boy we support through Compassion International. Rando goes to school and church in a building my Tennessee youth group built in 1985, and the principal of his school is a friend of mine from that trip 32 years ago.

I'm preaching in that church on August 6, and then Debbie and I drive cross country to Punta Cana, where I'm officiating at her son Dustin's wedding. We'll be back home with you on the 11th. PLEASE PRAY FOR US.

The Youth Team and I have planned and been preparing for months for our missionary journeys, but we're NOT the only missionaries from the Messiah family.

If you're going on a vacation, family trip, or day away; you may THINK it's only for fun; but God has already planned your time and is putting good works in your path for you to walk in.

It may be to pray for the people in a wreck along the way, and the first responders there serving them.

It may be to buy lunch for a hungry person or a tank of gas for someone in need.

It may be to make friends with the folks staying next door in the hotel or set up next to you on the beach.

It may be to help a lost child find a parent.

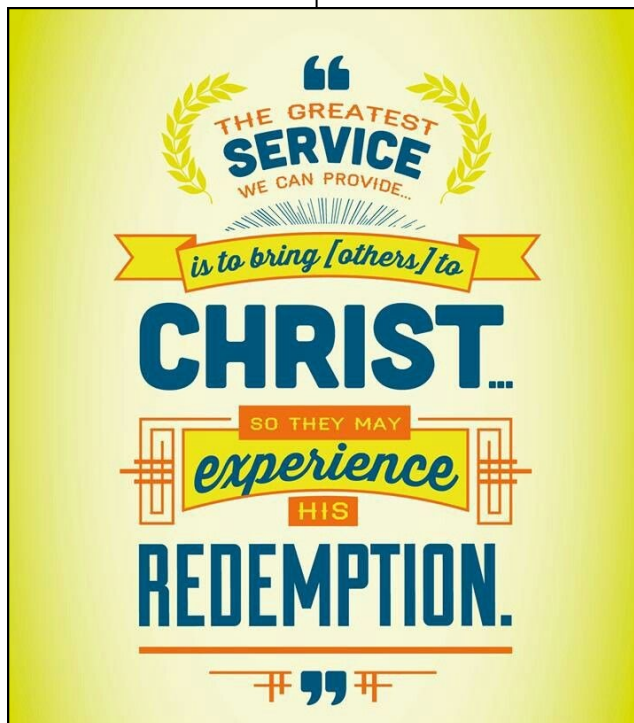
Whatever it is, God is going to put you in the

right place at the right time to be his hands and feet to serve in such a way that you change the world – even if only a little bit – for one child, one person, one family, or maybe even a whole community.

Facility: The Rental Report was
emailed separately. Facility Minis-
ter Amy Peredes reports:

About the Parish Hall: This month
I am working on signing up the fa-
cility with "The KNOT," which is
an online website offering publicity
for our facility and giving an online
presence for prospective clients.
We are currently online at the
"Wedding Spot" and "Facebook"
under Church of the Messiah Facili-
ty rentals. Also, this month I will be
working on general maintenance to
facility and will remove the Viking
stove from the Parish Hall kitchen
after Seraph Theater Camp.

About the Rental House: The con-
densation drain from the air condi-
tioner clogged up and overflowed,
leaking water under the laminate
flooring in 4 rooms. The laminate
had to be torn up, and the concrete
slab dried out and sprayed with an
anti-microbial solution. The floor-
ing couldn't be matched, so new
flooring is going down in the house.
Insurance should cover all but the
deductible for the event.

Vestry Meeting Minutes continued

After the donation of office furniture, I was able to better organize my office and realized I had several items to donate. I packaged them up and will be sending them to El Renacer Church in Puerto Rico. They have limited funds and run their children's ministry from the pockets of volunteers. The items I sent were previously used curriculum, old posters of Bible characters and verses, left over crafts and miscellaneous treasure box items.

One of the continuing perks of my participation in KidMin Academy is I get to preview new curriculums and get many free resources. I recently signed up to get month long samples from Sparkhouse. They publish a few multi age group programs that include videos and music. If the preview goes over well I will look further into pricing for next year. We will be trying out FROLIC for the preschool age and HOLY MOLY for the older mixed age group.

I had the pleasure of attend the graduation of 3 of our preschool from Children of the Messiah preschool and showing them a little love. I have several student graduating 5th grade and will presenting them with small gifts and taking them to a graduation lunch in early June. We offer 5th graders the option of moving up to youth group at the end of summer or staying with me for another year.

We have 80 children registered for VBS, that is the max we can accommodate with the current set up. I have put placed 4 kids on a waiting list for the preschool and kindergarten age group. We have to have more adults and space per younger child. The parents will be contacted if there are cancellations or no shows on Monday evening. This is an amazing problem to have and I will work on space, scheduling and budgeting to accommodate more next year.

During Seraph Theater camp, I volunteer to cook for the kids and spend time being an extra adult on standby. One of perks is getting to spend time with the kids and getting to know them, our Messiah kids and visitors. I have had 3 of the camp kids sign up for VBS and the cooking camp that I will be hosting in August. During a lunch time chat some of our Messiah kids asked why we've never had a sleep over. Since I didn't have a good answer I told the girls to brain storm and let me know what they would like to do. They took off and returned a page full of ideas, including quiet lesson time about God making beautiful things. How could I say no to that! So, I am planning a girls' lock-in for 3rd-5th grade girls. The date is yet to be determined as I will need to secure the space and a few adult volunteers. I am excited to plan this event and looking forward to all things girly!!

Children of the Messiah Preschool: The financial report was emailed separately.

Youth Ministry: Youth Minister Janie Walton reports: Longtime Activate member, Natasha Brueggeman, graduated from West Orange High School on Tuesday, May 30. She will continue to attend Activate this summer until she ages out when the new academic school year begins in August. Activate celebrated with her at a surprise graduation party on Friday, June 2.

We had several eight-graders move up to Ocoee and West Orange High Schools. We will be having a congratulatory dinner for them soon.

Activate member, Cydney Babione, is spending her summer on staff at Camp Wingmann.

We have a planned team mission trip meeting on Sunday, June 25. I am finalizing our schedule for our mission trip.

Some of our Activate students will be volunteers at this year's Vacation Bible School at the end June. I will also be volunteering as well.

There will be no Activate on Sunday, July 16 due to the mission trip.

DISCUSSION (to help make a decision next month): **Financial Gifts:** We continued our discussion of how best to manage the matching funds from Disney and the gifts from the Britt Trust and from Jess & Carol Green's estate. We will continue this discussion for several more months and not make a decision until later this year.

DECISIONS (based on the Discussion last month):

Interest/Dividends from the Britt Trust Money: The Finance Committee recommends applying the interest and dividends from the Britt Trust Gift directly to our Operating Income. Vestry APPROVED.

The July Vestry Meeting is July 16. Tom Rutherford will be in North Dakota with our Youth Mission Team that day. Senior Warden Joyce Taylor will chair the meeting (as specified by our Parish Bylaws and Diocesan and National Canons), and Paul Hickman invited us to his home in Clermont for lunch and the meeting. Vestry ACCEPTED Paul's invitation and will continue the Discussion about our Financial Gifts, but won't make a Decision about them.

Building Fund: Net Building Fund income (gifts, fundraising, and facility rental income, less expenses) was \$4,813.94 MORE than the \$14,709.16 necessary to cover the mortgage. That allowed us to pay off an extra \$2,608.83 of the Principal of our mortgage and add \$2,205.31 to the Contingency Fund-Debt Reduction.

The meeting closed with prayer at 3:40.

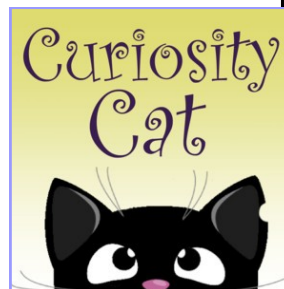

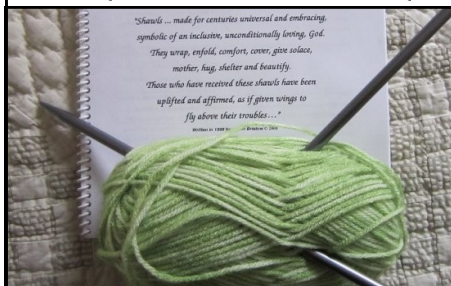

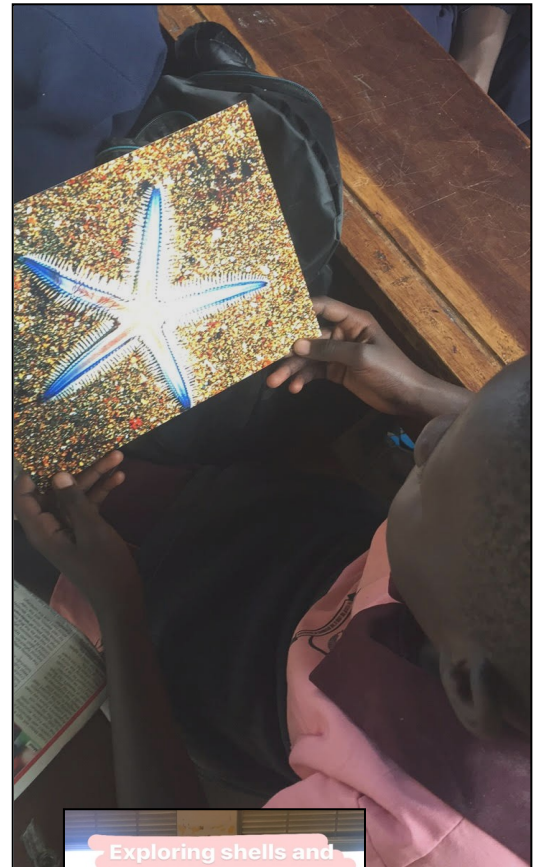
Hello from Lira, Uganda!

Book Review by Helen Farnsworth



This month I read one good book—*The Reason For My Hope* by Billy Graham—and I viewed one fabulous DVD: *GOD'S NOT DEAD 2*.

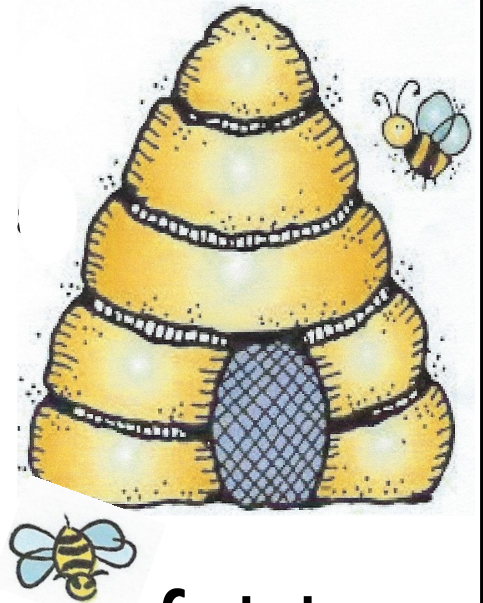
Billy Graham wrote *The Reason For My Hope* in 2012, when the catch phrase politically was “hope and change.” At that point it can be argued that there had been change, but not a whole lot of hope, at least from a worldly point of view. And the book counters this attitude of discouragement with the hope of the Gospel while, at the same time, pulling no punches as to the cost involved. Becoming a true disciple of Jesus always has and always will involve 1) acknowledgment of sin, 2) submission to the will of God, 3) self-sacrifice, and 4) persecution of one kind or another.

As Father Tom has often said, God loves us enough to accept us as we are, but He loves us too much to leave us that way. But the reward is so worth it! Dr. Graham talks about that, as well—about Heaven and also about Hell. It's a basic book that is well worth the reading.

As for *GOD'S NOT DEAD 2*, I can't say enough good things about it. I enjoyed it even more than *GOD'S NOT DEAD (1)*. It's about a High School history teacher who answers a question posed by a student

(Brook) by quoting Jesus. The class is studying Ghandi, and Brook asks if Jesus didn't advocate the same type of nonviolence. She says yes, he did, and quotes the scripture passage about loving your enemies. The School board demands a recantation and an apology, which she says she can't do; so they take her to court. And the rest is exciting, to say the least. I think you will enjoy both of these.

Mission Trip Team

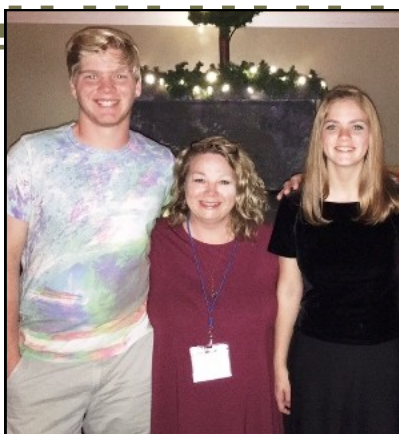
This year, Activate is thrilled to be returning to Standing Rock Lakota Sioux Reservation in North Dakota for our summer 2017 Mission Trip.

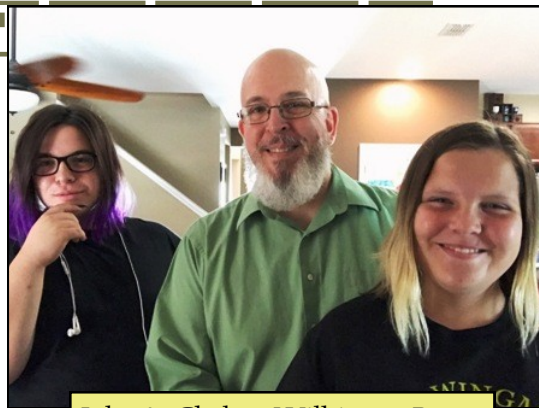

This is Noah & Kara's second mission trip and Julie's first.



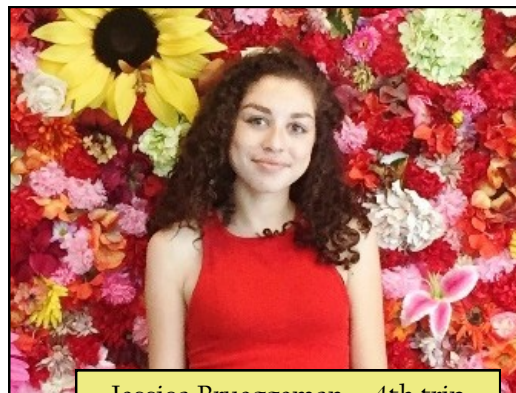
John & Chelsea Wilkinson-Borno and Murph Borno (chaperone).
This is Chelsea's 3rd mission trip and Murph & John's 4th trip.



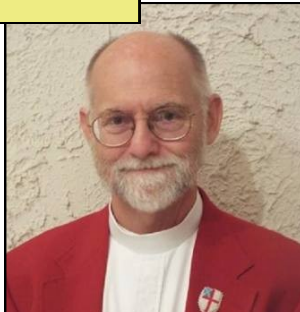
Natasha Brueggeman—this is Natasha's 5th mission trip with Activate.



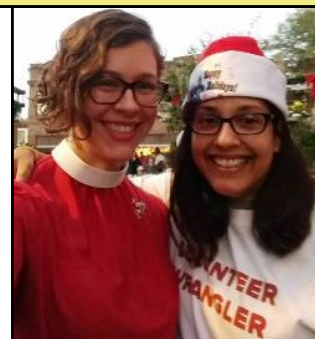
