Bang for Your Bucks!

Every Sunday I invite you to give to God through the Church of the Messiah

Many of us give because we've discovered Jesus is right: "It's more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35); that we do, indeed, "reap what we sow" (2 Corinthians 9:6-8); and that God does generously "supply all our needs according to his riches in Christ Jesus" as we are generous with Him (Philippians 4:19).

Some of us, however, are not yet convinced, and we want more return on our investment than just promises about future blessings. If we're going to give to God, we want some Bang for our Buck NOW.

Here's what your giving gets you:

Daily prayers for you and your family. The Vestry divides up the Parish Directory, and each Vestry member prays for 12-15 families in the Messiah family daily. On top of that, I pray for 10 families every day, and with about 300 families in the Messiah family, that has me praying for you and your family by name at least once a month. If you and your family are relatively healthy and

doing well, those prayers are working! And if things are tough for you, those prayers are helping you get through and are keeping your situation from being even worse than it is.

Emergency prayers in a crisis and ongoing prayer in a rough patch through the 2 dozen prayer warriors of the Prayer Chain.

<u>FORMATION</u>: Larry Book led Noonday Prayer. Based on Psalm 126:3 -4, Tom Rutherford invited us to share how God touched us through our time on Vestry.

INFORMATION:

Vestry Ministry Team Reports: None received.

Staff Reports:

Facility: The Facility Rental Report was emailed separately. Facility Minister Amy Paredes reports: I met with many prospective clients interested in renting our facility. I'm working with Tina Hoang of www.wedding-spot.com to create an ad for our venue on their website. We should start receiving prospective clients soon.

I have sent out photos, pricing, and church policies to answer questions from prospective clients.

My husband and I cleaned all the carpets and floors, and I am seeking volunteers to pressure wash the exterior sidewalks and walls.

Children's Ministry: Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports: In December, we focused on Advent and Christmas. We are now moving to a video game themed series for Children's Church and a series based on the movie "Inside Out." We're learning about five emotions and how

God planned for us to use them in SHINE Kids' Club.

We had an exciting Star Wars themed Christmas party. There was a great volunteer turnout this year! The children played Star Wars games, ate Star Wars themed foods, made Star Wars related crafts, and ended the night watching "Return of the Jedi." That same night, we offered nursery care for children of the young adults who attended the Christmas progressive dinner that Mother Tracy hosted.

I thanked all the volunteers who served in Children's Church or SHINE in 2016 with a special Christmas gift. We have a wonderful group of people who serve our children, and I am very blessed to work with them all.

The play at the Christmas Eve Children's Service went well. The children worked hard learning their lines. We had 12 speaking roles and each one of the children did an excellent job. I heard from several adults, who said they learned from the program this year. We covered the 12 symbols of Christmas and their meanings. Our last symbol was fresh baked cookies and we closed the evening out by distributing cookies at the door as people left.

One of our child care workers, Alicia Morris, retired and the position has been filled by Maritza Lawrence. The help wanted signs are still up so we can find somebody to have on standby in case our regular workers get sick or are away for a day.

I went through the Safeguarding God's Children course with a new volunteer, and have a few other people still working through theirs.

Vestry Meeting Minutes continued.....

We've begun planning for this summer's Vacation Bible School. We are going to Peru! The curriculum is from Group Publishing, and I have several people already committed to serve. I've planned monthly fun events for the next year, and those will be on the church calendar soon.

Children of the Messiah Preschool: The financial report was emailed separately.

Youth Ministry: Youth Minister Janie Walton reports:

Activate had its *Ugly Sweater Christmas Party* on Sunday, December 18, and

Kara Altenbach won.

There were no Activate meetings for Sunday, December 25 or January 1. Our tutoring session scheduled for Sunday, January 9 was postponed, but will be rescheduled for another Sunday in January.

Activate won't meet on Sunday, January 29 so all Activate students and their families can attend the Parish Annual Meeting.

Messiah Academy: The Financial Report was emailed separately. Director Terri Wetherington reports: We are awaiting payment of tuition costs for the first and second quarters of the 2016-2017 school year from Step Up for Students in the amount of \$4,500.00. The reimbursement has been submitted, approved and paid we are just waiting for the funds to be deposited. We have also submitted a request for reimbursement for the third quarter, which is pending approval.

Assistant Rector Tracy Dugger reports:

Young Adult Ministry: Our December Progressive Xmas Party was a success! Three houses hosted 19 people. Revive completed a study of Jesus's genealogy and nativity. Plans for January include another Trivia Tuesday at the Brewery.

Social Media ministry: Everything is going well. Nothing new to report.

Latino Ministry: Our first month of services went well. Our music team of 5 persons is meshing well and expanding their repertoire. The flow of the service has become smoother. We've fluctuated in attendance but seem to be averaging about 20. Beginning in January, I'll go back to preaching once a month at the English services.

Vestry Nominees: 16 people were invited to be nominees. Stacey Beck, Don Greer, and Wally Stewart accepted. We have 5 openings, however, so Tom Rutherford approached more. Elaina Paige came to Vestry meeting to see how we operate and agreed to stand for election to the 1-year term left by John Jowett's impending resignation. Tom will have our final nominee by Sunday January 22 to communicate our slate to the congregation.

2016 Annual Reports: Ministry Team reports for 2016 are due today.

Staff Bonuses: The Assistant Rector's compensation in 2016 required only \$47,764 of the \$50,000 given to cover it. The donor asked that if there were any money left over, to give it to the staff as bonuses. The leftover \$2,236 was distributed to the lay staff.

<u>DISCUSSION</u> (to help make a decision next month) – (None):

<u>DECISION</u> (based on the Discussion <u>last month</u>): The Proposed 2017 Budget:

Treasurer Rodger Watson projects a \$126,000 deficit this year if we spend what we say, and income doesn't rise to match expenses.

To give historical perspective, Tom Rutherford reminded us that this time last year, the Budget we approved projected a \$101,000 deficit for 2016. As it turned out: we prayed and communicated the need to the congregation, income was higher than anticipated, and the Vestry and Staff were frugal and spent \$37,000 less than the Budget allowed; so we ended the year with only a \$5,589 deficit. Tom expressed full confidence that we and God can do the same thing with the projected \$126,000 deficit this year: communicate the need to our people, pray fervently for God to provide, and hold off on spending if income doesn't match expenses.

Tom did the math, and for our income to cover budgeted expenses in 2017, we need \$660,192 in Operating Income + \$176,510 to cover the Mortgage. That equals \$836,702, which divides out to \$69,725 per month. That is not much more than we've needed in the past, and God has provided. Tom challenged the Vestry to pray in that amount. They agreed we can do that.

Vestry agreed last month NOT to tap the Britt gift at this point, but to spend several months thinking and praying with the Finance Committee to discern the wisest use for those funds. We've prayed frequently and faithfully for years for God to provide, and the Britt gift is certainly an answer to those prayers, but Vestry is committed NOT to be hasty or foolish with those funds.

Vestry APPROVED the Proposed Budget with the following understandings:

- We will pray faithfully for God to provide.
- We will communicate with the congregation what we do with God's money, so they see they're getting the most bang for their bucks.
- The Financial Report in the Sunday bulletins will be updated to

communicate with the congregation we need \$70,000 a month to break even.

• We will watch our finances closely and do what we've done for years: if times get tight, we will avoid spending anything not absolutely necessary.

If, in spite of all those efforts we end 2017 with a deficit in the Operating Fund, one option may be to use some of the Britt gift to cover that deficit. But we commit to do all we can to avoid that scenario.

Tom Rutherford will be ready to explain all of this at the Annual Meeting when we present the budget to the congregation.

MEETING MINUTES & FINANCIAL REPORT:

Minutes from the December meeting: APPROVED.


December Financial Report from Treasurer Rodger Watson: APPROVED.

Operating Account: The month's income was \$40,517.38 MORE than expenses, thus shrinking our year-to-date deficit to \$5,588.64. THANK YOU, JESUS!

Building Fund: Net Building Fund income (gifts, fundraising, and facility rental income, less expenses) was \$10,390.94 MORE than the \$14,709.16 necessary to cover the mortgage, and it was applied to Contingency Fund/Debt Reduction.

THE MEETING ADJOURNED WITH PRAYER AT 3:58.



OPENING PRAYER: Rector Tom Rutherford opened the meeting with prayer at 5:51pm.

ELECTION OF SECRETARY:

Joyce Taylor was elected to serve as secretary for the meeting, and Father Tom announced that he appointed Joyce to be Senior Warden this year.

VESTRY ELECTION: Stacey Beck, Steve Borst, Don Greer, Paul Hickman, and Elaina Paige agreed to stand for election to the vestry (Elaina for the 1 year left in the term of John Jowett, who resigned because he's moving away.). There were no nominations from the floor. There was a motion made to elect the 5 candidates for the 5 seats on the vestry by acclamation. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

MINISTRY REPORTS &

QUESTIONS: Fr. Tom encouraged all members to review the reports from the various committees and acknowledged and thanked all staff members present for their hard work. Fr. Tom thanked the off-going vestry members (Larry Book, Anida

Daniel, John Jowett, Paul Robertson, and Dawn Wirbel) and introduced Treasurer Rodger Watson and thanked him for his service to our parish for 39 years.

PRESENTATION OF THE 2017

BUDGET: Rodger presented the proposed 2017 Budget with some explanation by Tom Rutherford. Finance Committee Chair and newly elected Vestry member Don Greer assured the congregation that the gift from the Britt Trust will be invested to earn interest for the several months the Vestry and Finance Committee will take

praying and thinking and considering the best use for those funds. A motion was made to adopt the budget. The motion was seconded. The budget was approved unanimously.

CLOSING PRAYER: Fr. Tom offered the closing prayer and the meeting was adjourned at 6:20pm.

"Through the Valley of the Shadow of Death" bereavement program is a Christ –centered format to provide small groups conversations about life, death, grief, hope, and moving forward.


Why is this program important?

This small group setting of 6 or 7 participants provides a safe environment of trust by:

- Sharing stories of loved ones
- Listening to our feelings, thoughts, actions, and beliefs
- Learning from each other
- Providing tools for personal growth, coping skills, and moving forward in our lives
- Bonding with and supporting each other through the journey

Who is this for?

This program is for people who have suffered the death of a loved one in the recent past (3 or 4 months ago), or as long as 25 or 30 years.



When and Where

TVSD is held two times per year, in the Fall and during Lent. The next session will be announced in the Fall. The sessions are held 1 hour per week for six weeks. We meet on Sundays at 11:00 A.M. in the church library.

(If circumstances of the group require, we may meet in a different time or place that is agreeable to all participants. If you attend the 11:00 service, perhaps consider attending a different service for the six weeks of the session)

What materials are used?

We use a workbook (\$20.00) authored and published by the Reverend Greer McBryde. The group is facilitated by Jill Brown, Sarah Wolfe, and Julie Altenbach.



I read two great books again this month, one of which I knew would be—*Pilgrim's Progress* by John Bunyan—and the other of which I anticipated would be, being written by the author of *Because* of *Bethlehem*, Max Lucado—*Let The Journey Begin*. (I wasn't disappointed.)

Up until reading my mother's copy of *Pilgrim's Progress*, my only acquaintance with it was the children's video, which I highly recommend. Though it has been awhile since I watched it, I'm pretty sure it did not include Part II, which was about the journey of Pilgrim's wife Christiana and their sons, which was equally engaging.

Obviously the book doesn't need my approval, but I'll add it, anyway. To me it's akin to reading Scripture itself, which, of course, it quotes at every turn. It offers timeless advice about the wiles of "the world, the flesh, and the Devil," and how to successfully navigate through all three. If anyone really doesn't want to take the time to read the whole book (which is quite lengthy), the video is a reasonable alternative.

Max Lucado's book,

Let The Journey Begin, is one of many that Lynne Passilla gave me, and confirms the adage that "good things come in small packages." (And so does dynamite!) It is conveniently divided into 1-2-page segments which deal with a plethora of subjects; and I found it like a bag of peanuts—I couldn't eat just one! I found it hard to put down.

Thank you, Lynne! I'm putting her copy in the church library, but will definitely be buying a copy for myself.

This year for Advent we spent some time doing Star Wars themed lessons so I thought it would be fitting to have a Star Wars themed Christmas party.


