The season of preparation to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

It begins on Ash Wednesday, March 1st, and lasts 40 days (not counting Sundays) and ends on Easter morning April 16th.

Lent is a time of deliberate "self-examination and repentance; prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and reading and meditating on God's holy Word" (*Book of Common Prayer*, p. 265).

During this "tithe" of the year, we invite God to intervene in our lives, to adjust our relationships and actions, and to make us more pleasing to himself.

Many Christians do this by adopting a "Lenten Discipline," which may be "giving up something for Lent" or "committing to doing something extra" in order to draw closer to God.

Preparing for the Resurrection

Lent is the 40 days before Easter (not counting Sundays) when we prepare ourselves to celebrate Jesus' resurrection on Easter.

It's also the perfect time to ensure we're prepared for our own resurrection.

The best way to do that is by making sure we're ready to face our own death.

The Church calls us to acknowledge that inevitability every Ash Wednesday as someone smears ashes on us and says, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

In other words: "You're going to die. Are you ready?"

Are you ready to die?

Not just spiritually by accepting Jesus' invitation to be in his family, but also relationally, physically, and financially?

Are you ready to die relationally?

 Have you apologized and asked forgiveness from the people you've hurt in your life? At least the ones you know how to contact?

- Have you forgiven the folks who have hurt you? And the ones who've hurt people you love?
- If you're married, do you tell your spouse daily, "I love you"?
- If you're a parent, have you told your children, "I'm proud of you"?
- Have you told your friends how much you appreciate them?
- The people who have helped you, taught you, coached you, supported you, encouraged you, mentored you: have you told them how they influenced you and said, "Thank you"?

If not, any or all of those would be great to do during Lent, and MUCH more beneficial than giving up chocolate!

Are you ready to die physically?

- Have you decided how much medical intervention you want, if you're so sick, it appears you won't recover?
- Have you written a living will, defining whether you want the doctors to do everything possible to keep you alive? Or you're a "DNR" ("Do NOT Resituate")? Or somewhere in between?
- Have you designated a Health Care Surrogate – someone to make medical decisions for you in the event you're too sick to make them for yourself?

If not, any or all of those would be great to do during Lent, and MUCH more beneficial than giving up alcohol.

Are you ready to die financially?

- Have you written a will? Is it current?
- Have you given someone Durable Power of Attorney to make financial decisions for you, in case you're too sick to make them for yourself?
- Have you included the Church in your will? If you've always wanted

to tithe, but never gotten around to it, you get one last chance: in your will! If there's something the Messiah family does that you really believe in and want to help it keep going, you can make provision for that in your will. If the Messiah family has blessed you in your life, this is your chance to say a final "Thank you!"

If you have not included the Messiah family in your will, but you'd like to, parishioner and estate attorney Steve Dunegan will amend your will *pro bono*, for free!

"Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return."





<u>FORMATION</u>: Frank Chase led Noonday Prayer. Based on Exodus 18:5, 7-9, 13-27, Tom Rutherford talked about Shared Leadership, so we don't repeat Moses' mistake.

INFORMATION:

Vestry Manual: Tom Rutherford invited any questions about anything in the Manual or about the Parish or how we operate. There were none.

Vestry Ministry Team Reports: SCRIP Fundraising: Since there is so much potential with this program, Wilna Brown and Doreen Stachowski are going to try once again to educate the congregation and will be holding workshops between each service in the Library on Sunday, February 26th. We will have laptops to help anyone sign in and get started using the ShopwithScrip system. So far the program has made over \$8,000 for the Church of the Messiah, and we hope to educate everyone on how easy it is to support our Church with this fundraiser.

Outreach Team will meet on February 23 to orient our new Vestry Outreach members about what we have done in previous years, what we have already planned for this year, and to get their ideas and goals for the coming year.

Staff Reports:

Facility: The Facility Rental Report was emailed separately.

Children's Ministry: Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports: This month at SHINE we celebrated some of the kids who earned a pizza and taco party! We have been learning about feelings and will soon be watching the movie "Inside Out." A favorite lesson thus far has been when we talked about Disgust and how we should not judge people by their appearance but by what's inside. We used the story of Jesus healing the 10 lepers to illustrate this. We used some oatmeal bagels as our sores. Another highlight was using brownie mix to talk about how sometimes we need to experience sadness and being broken for God to work things out in our life, such as bringing friends closer to us and creating great memories of times when somebody was there for us and comforted us when we were sad. We used the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from death for this lesson.

In Children's Church we have been working on lessons about love. We have a variety of crafts for this month including a special project planned by Debbie Rutherford. Our Valentine lesson is based on John 3:16, and Marci Babione has a craft planned that will also talk about how much God loves us.

We are doing "Little Lessons in Lent" again this year for our elementary aged children from 6-7pm starting Ash Wednesday and going through Holy Week. Our alms-giving this year is the Rice Bowl Project. Each child gets a plastic bowl that looks like it's filled with rice, but it is actually a bank. We will collect our spare

change throughout Lent and turn it in at the end. I will then submit a check to the organization, and they will purchase food for orphanages around the world. I ordered 50 of the banks. I would like to put a table out in the Narthex with some information and offer anybody who would like to participate to join along with us.

I've also been planning the Easter Party. This year I would like to put bags of empty Easter eggs in the narthex and ask for people to pick a bag and fill it with candy and return it. Filling the hundreds and hundreds of Easter eggs I usually do is quite time-consuming. I would love to offer anybody who would like it the opportunity to help me out in this area.

Our Vacation Bible School online registration site is live, and I've had several children register already. We had our first meeting for volunteers, and I have most positions filled. Everybody seems really excited about our theme for this year and is excited to start planning and preparing. I would like to put up a board listing the materials we need, instead of asking for monetary donations this year: things like rope, empty coffee cans, and marbles. I would like to hang this in the narthex in April.

Children of the Messiah Preschool: The financial report was emailed

The financial report was emailed separately. Registration for the fall started February 6 for current students and February 13 for the public. The baby room filled up the first day of Open Registration, and most of the other classes are full, with waiting lists.

Youth Ministry: Youth Minister Janie Walton reports:

Activate's tutoring sessions are now twice a month the first and third Sundays. Our first session was February 5 with students from Dillard Street Elementary School attending. We are still looking for tutors in Algebra II, Geometry, Pre-Calculus and Chemistry. Our second session is February 19.

Activate is attending Student Leadership University's Lift Tour at First Baptist Church of Orlando on Friday and Saturday, February 17 and 18. On Saturday, February 18, Youth Minister Janie Walton is part of a Youth Ministries Panel Discussion at Church of the Good Shepherd in Maitland as part of the Absalom Jones' Celebration.

The Bishop's Event Weekend is Friday and Saturday, February 24-25 at Camp Wingmann. Bishop Greg Brewer is speaking on the topic of prayer. Janie Walton is leading *Prayer for the World* as part of the breakout prayer sessions at the event.

Our Activate students are looking forward to our Annual Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper Fundraiser on February 28 in the Parish Hall.

Activate is doing a Lenten series along with Children's Ministry's Little Lessons in Lent on Wednesday nights beginning on Ash Wednesday, March

The Summer Youth Mission Project is Saturday July 15-Saturday July 22. We're going to the Standing Rock Indian Reservation south of Bismarck, North Dakota, and helping with Camp St Gabriel for Native youth, put on by the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota.

Messiah Academy: The Financial Report was emailed separately. Director Terri Wetherington reports: As reported previously we are now able to accept McKay and Gardiner Scholarship Funds through the Step Up for Students Program. So far we have received 6,500.00 with a remainder of 2000.00 to be collected when the reimbursement window opens sometime in March/April.

We have starting paying Garine Adams for student Music Lessons (100.00 per month). Her time up to now has been donated.

I have finally starting drawing a salary which is currently set at 18,000 per year. This is still well below the projected salary of 25,000 per year. As the school grows and self-funding becomes available this will change to be more in line with our planned projections.

We will be advertising and conducting an open house on Feb 25, 2017 and again on March 7th at 6-8 p.m. We are ready to grow!

Assistant Rector Tracy Dugger reports:

Social Media Ministry: Timely updates continue to occur and our total like/following the page is trending upward slowly. This means more of our members are finding us on Facebook and are keeping up to date with events on our page.

Latino Ministry: The Spanish service continues to go well. The timing is running smoother and we have found a successful bulletin format that can accommodate printing all the songs, hymns, and liturgy. I met with the diocesan Hispanic Commission and we will be represented at the March 4th Diocesan wide Spanish service at the Cathedral.

Young Adult Ministry: Revive is ongoing. I will be inviting more people to join with us in Lent to commit to reading the gospel of Mark together. I will also be hosting a Pilgrimage/ Walking group on Wednesdays in Lent while "Little lessons" and Youth

Group are meeting.

Technology/Internet- Craig Bridge upgraded our internet firmware on 2/13. Tracy advised that we need someone to measure the distance for new cable to replace our old/ inadequate cable in order to update our internet connection to better support the school(s) and the rest of the campus. Once we get the needed measurements, we can get a cost to replace the cables that are unreliable. Ir. Warden Frank Chase and Mother Tracy will work on this and report back to the vestry. We now have two different networks – one for guests and one for vestry and staff. This will greatly improve the security of our internet connection.

Ash Wednesday & Lent: With our plethora of Clergy, we are offering a plethora of Ash Wednesday and Lenten opportunities:

- Ash Wednesday services at 7am, Noon, 6pm (in Spanish), and 7pm
- Way of the Cross/Stations of the Cross every Friday, but at a different time each Friday, to make it accessible to as many people as possible: 7am, noon, 5pm, 6pm, 7pm, and 7pm in Spanish

<u>DISCUSSION</u> (to help make a decision next month): There were none.

<u>DECISIONS</u> (based on the Discussion last month):

Diocesan Pledge for 2017: We are required by canon to send 10% of our Plate and Pledge Income to the Diocese, and are asked to give more. Vestry agreed to continue sending 10% with no restrictions on how we'd like it spent.

Annual Parochial Report: A hard copy was distributed to all vestry members. The vestry approved the report and it will be sent to the Diocese and The Episcopal Church by the deadline of March 1. Good news is

that: The Messiah family has 487 active people, including 77 members under 16 years old, and an Average Sunday Attendance (ASA) of 325.

That means 2/3 of our folks are here on any given Sunday, while in most Episcopal Churches, they have very few – if any – children, and are lucky to get ½ of their people there regularly. That also makes us a "large" congregation, since only 4% of Episcopal Churches in the US have an ASA of over 300.

MEETING MINUTES & FINANCIAL REPORT:

Minutes from the January meeting: APPROVED.

January Financial Report from Treasurer Rodger Watson: APPROVED.


Operating Account: The month's income was \$741.34 MORE than expenses, so for the first time in many years, we start the year with a surplus instead of a deficit! Thank you, Jesus! Please keep praying.

Building Fund: Net Building Fund income (gifts, fundraising, and facility rental income, less expenses) was \$6,969.21 MORE than the \$14,709.16 necessary to cover the mortgage, and it was applied to Contingency Fund/Debt Reduction.

The meeting closed with prayer and adjourned at 3:30.

I read two more winners this month: *Twelve Extraordinary Women*: How God Shaped Women of the Bible and What He Wants to Do With You by John MacArthur, and *Life's Greatest Treasure*: Writings *About Discovering and Blessing Children*, compiled by Bette Bishop.

Some time back I reviewed John MacArthur's book <u>Twelve</u> <u>Ordinary Men</u>, which dealt with the Apostles, and how Christ transformed their lives; so I knew I was in for another treat. I was not disappointed. He pointed out that he used a different adjective for the ladies—"extraordinary" as opposed to "ordinary"; but in both cases these people of God became "extraordinary" because of the work of Christ within them.

Their job was to believe and to submit to whatever He called on them to do. And this was true in the Old as well as the New Testament, from Mother Eve to Lydia. (I was a bit surprised to find Eve listed; but she clearly did believe the promise of God to send a Redeemer, and she was the very first in His genealogy.)

The other women featured are Sarah, Rahab, Ruth, Hannah, Mary, Anna, the Samaritan Woman, Martha and Mary, and Mary Magdalene.

Life's Greatest Treasure, another of the books Lynne Passilla gave me, is a charming collection of poems and other writings (but mostly poems) about childhood and parenthood, some of which I remember learning as a child, myself. As usual, I thoroughly enjoyed it, too. Thanks again, Lynne!

I hope you will avail yourself of the opportunity to read these. I think your heart will be blessed.


Preschool registration is continuing. Many of our classes are already full. If you or someone you know are interested in registering a child for next fall please call the preschool office at (407) 654-8415.
