On 3 Sundays in May, Joyce Taylor and Youth Minister Janie Walton hosted a table for Compassion International to give us a chance to Change the World with Jesus: One Child at a Time.

Compassion connects compassionate donors with local churches in Third-World communities to sponsor and serve individual children by offering food, clothing, education, and medical care.

Sponsors get a picture of the child they support and information about their family and community and the opportunity to connect with that child through letters, postcards, and pictures. If they so choose, sponsors can even go visit the child in his or her

community. Debbie and I did that last summer with Rando, the 16-year-old young man we support in the Dominican Republic!

As a result of those three Sundays, the Messiah family is changing the world for 31 children around the world!



We were already sponsoring 11 children from the Compassion Sundays we had 2 years ago, and we took on 20 new sponsorships in May.

THANK YOU!!!!

We are not only changing the world for the children we sponsor; because those children live in Central and South America, the Caribbean, Africa, and Asia, we are, indeed, changing the world!

If you have your own children still at home, you are DEEP into Changing the World with Jesus: One Child – or however many you

have – at a time!

Thank you for engaging in that adventure.

But for those of us who don't have children, or whose children are grown and gone, we still can help Jesus change the world for a child... through Compassion.

OR... if you have children at home and would like to give them the opportunity to change the world for a child somewhere else in the world, Compassion is a great way to do that.

When my children were young – 30+ years ago! – we sponsored children the same ages as they were, so my kids could put a human face on human need: a face that looked a lot like theirs. Compassion helped my children grow to be more compassionate adults.

Hurricane Season June 1 – November 30

Ready or Not?

Non-Floridians complain that we don't have seasons like "Up North."

I assure them we DO have seasons: "mowing" and "non-mowing!"

But even more dramatic are our other two seasons: "Hurricane" and "Non-Hurricane."

And Hurricane Season starts June 1.

Are you ready? Have you gathered what you need to get through several days without electricity, gas stations, and air-conditioning? If not, do you have an evacuation plan and a place to go?

God promises to get us through difficulties. But one way he does that is offering us wisdom and knowledge. The newspapers, local magazines, TV and radio, and government are full of advice of what to do and how to prepare. Many of their suggestions are God's Word for us.

But if you haven't paid attention to all those other sources, let me add my voice to theirs:

Get ready for Hurricane Season!
Because ready or not, here it is!

To help us prepare as individuals and families, parishioner and retired Navy Captain Murph Borno has assumed the helm of DART, our Disaster Action Response Team, composed of parishioners who volunteered through the Messiah's Way to help our parish family cope with a hurricane or other disaster.

Murph and DART have procured a stack of resources from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) with helpful tips to help us



get ourselves ready in our blood families. That literature is on the Welcome Table by the main double doors on the Tilden Street side of campus.

I urge you to read and heed them.

To help us as a parish family, the DART volunteers are ready with tools (chain saws, trucks, hammers, nails, tarps, etc.) and skills to help Messiah folks in need after a storm. In addition to helping our people in their own homes, a number of parish families have volunteered to take people into their homes and feed and house any whose homes are damaged.

Murph and DART have also developed a Messiah Family Disaster Plan to help us help each other if the Day comes. It's on the next page and will be distributed in the bulletins on several Sundays this month. Please post it in your home as a reminder for when the wind picks up.

In the event of a hurricane, tornado, or other disaster:

1 PRAY! HARD!

WE WILL HAVE CHURCH ON SUNDAY at the regular times, no matter what the weather or conditions are. Use your discretion whether to come or not, especially if there is a curfew.

BEFORE THE DISASTER: If a named storm or other disaster is upon us, please call and/or email the 2 families ahead of you in the parish directory and the 2 families after you to pray with them and see if they have any needs. If there are needs you cannot meet, please call the Church office at 407-656-3218 (Even if no one is in the office, someone will check the parish voicemail) and/or email Father Tom Rutherford at TomRutherford@earthlink.net

IF YOU EVACUATE, please call the Church at 407-656-3218 and/or email Father Tom Rutherford at TomRutherford@earthlink.net and let us know.

AFTER THE DISASTER, please call those same 4 families to pray with them and see if they're okay. Please call the Church at 407-656-3218 and/or email Father Tom Rutherford at TomRutherford@earthlink.net to share any needs you or they have, and the DART (Disaster Action Response Team) will match needs with resources in the parish and community.

6 KEEP PRAYING!

A letter from Mother T,

Dear Parish, first and foremost I want to reassure you that I'm fine. Secondly, I want to tell you that God is Good all the Time and in all circumstances. Thirdly, I want to tell you I was diagnosed with a heart condition.

Yes I really am fine. No I am not dying. But, I will be sitting instead of kneeling sometimes. You may also see me sit instead of stand.

By the grace of God I was diagnosed with Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome. POTs for short. This condition means my blood pressure can drop dangerously when I bend over or change positions quickly. Causing dizziness, fainting or racing heart. So I'll be doing a few less pew aerobics from now on.

But this is a fully treatable, manageable condition that as long as I stay off of ladders and avoid running a marathon, is not life threatening.

I know a number of you have expressed concerned at seeing me look more tired over the past several months, and I wanted to publicly allay your concerns. Also since you will notice a change in the way I do some things at church I wanted you to hear from me Why, rather than to leave it up to your own imaginings.

If you ever doubted God worked through all things I submit my case as proof...I've had periods of dizziness, shortness of breath, and aches in my side my whole life that no one ever could figure out. When I was called to jury duty in May, it was involving the case of a boy who died after being undiagnosed with a cardiac condition. The expert witnesses in the testimony went off on a tangent to explain the boy DID NOT have Pots, but explained what Pots was and how you test for it. Following this trial I was convicted to go to my Dr. and ask for this testing. Testing confirmed within 10 minutes that I have POTs and have probably always had it. GOD WORKED THROUGH MY JURY DUTY!

Currently there is no cure and they don't know exactly what causes it, but with ample fluids (hence my new water bottle at the altar), lots of electrolytes and some special care I will be just fine for many decades to come.

While I appreciate always your prayers, I especially thank those of you who've prayed for my health. Please don't stop.

A Group Home for teenage foster girls in Winter Garden and the non-profit group Foster Friends of Central Florida is asking for help letting these girls know the community cares about them. The girls are usually between 13-17 years old and they will "age out" of the foster system on their 18th birthday. The community is being asked to provide meals for these ladies (up to 6 teenage girls plus 1 staff member) every Friday and Sunday evening at 6 pm.

If our parish provides one or two dinners a month (either Friday or Sunday), it would go a long way towards changing the world with Jesus, one person and one small community at a time. A parishioner has offered to pay for the ingredients for the meals (if needed), as well as pick up the meals and deliver them to the group home. So what we REALLY need are cooks. Why should your child attend a performing arts summer camp?

Because statistically young people who routinely participate in the arts are:

- 4 times more likely to be recognized for academic achievement;
- 3 times more likely to be elected to class office within their schools;
- 4 times more likely to participate in a math and science fair;
- 3 times more likely to win an award for school attendance;
- 4 times more likely to win an award for writing an essay or poem.

Additionally, young artists, compared to their peers, are more likely to:

- Attend music, art, and dance classes nearly three times as frequently;
- Participate in youth groups nearly four times as frequently;
- Read for pleasure nearly twice as often;
- Perform community service more than four times as often.

Messiah Academy's Seraph Theatre Summer Program is in its TENTH consecutive year. This program focuses on performing arts for children ages 7-15. During the two week session, kids learn about many aspects of theatre including singing, dance, voice projection, theater terms, costume and set design through participation in various games, activities and workshops designed to enhance self-expression, instill confidence, inspire imagination, and support individual as well as group appreciation and acceptance. Campers perform a play or musical at the conclusion of the camp, showcasing the knowledge and talent they discovered during our Summer Discovery Program.

The cost of the camp is \$300 per two week session. Hours are from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Mon. – Fri. Lunch is included. Before and after care is available for an additional fee. This year's camp dates are June 4th-15th, with a performance on Saturday the 16th at 10 a.m. So if you are bored this summer, or know someone who loves theater but doesn't know where to begin, send them over to Messiah

Academy and the Seraph Theatre's Summer Program at Church of the Messiah. It is sure to be a fun, rewarding experience.

KUNG FU DAY CAMP

Led by Sifu Benjamin Blackman

As part of the Messiah Academy curriculum this year we have integrated kung fu as a structured physical education alternative. By using exercises and disciplines of ancient kung fu teachings, I am able to instruct the students to increase their physical endurance and balance while also implementing concepts of honor, virtue, and respect. These are fundamental lessons that will permeate to all aspects of life.

Each student has their own obstacles that life has put in their path. In kung fu we find ways to embrace these obstacles, learn from them and find ways to adapt and/or overcome them.

Kung Fu Day Camp is an extension of these lessons open to Messiah Academy students, their siblings, family, friends or any kids who want to participate. KFDC includes an array of activities and kung fu inspired games designed to increase endurance and promote problem solving skills.

We teach not to be afraid of mistakes and failure (set-backs) and teach how to get back up and try again. Through cooperative and challenging outdoor activities we will take the kids through a wide range of challenges that cannot always be solved or performed by going solo, thus also working on social interactions and interpersonal relationships and trust.

The goals of Kung Fu Day Camp are to promote teamwork, trust, decision making and problem solving, planning and communication, respect and in some cases developing leadership. The most important goal to promote is self esteem.

The Outreach Team is working on a fundraiser for the Children and Youth groups for September 22nd. The profit will be used, along with their 2018 budget and other fundraisers, to assist with the mission trips and to purchase a bounce house for the children's ministry. Did we hear BINGO?

Facility: Rental Report was emailed separately. Facility Minister Amy Paredes reports:

I have been working this month with the Wedding Spot to schedule appointments with prospective clients. There have been many people who are interested, however, have not secured any firm dates, and I am working on getting those contracts. I reached out to previous clients to see if they have future events for us to host.

The facility is due for its annual maintenance, and I have contracted with "Radiant Services" to clean the Parish Hall carpets and floors, and the Narthex tile floor. That begins

June 1 when the floors will be stripped, cleaned, and polished. We had our first request to rent the facility for a same-sex wedding. Father Tom crafted a response to let the couple know our Diocesan Canons don't allow such a ceremony to occur on our campus. Tom also informed the Diocese of the request and our response, in case the situation hits social or mass media.

Children of the Messiah Preschool: The financial report was emailed separately.

Children's Ministry: Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports: Nursery news: Unfortunately, we are saying goodbye to our two childcare providers. Brittany Kolacki has started a full-time job and has moved further from the church. She has offered her occasional sitting services to some of the parents here. Nicole Paluzzi is moving at the end of May. After searching and talking with several possible candidates, we have hired Miss Allyson Forton, who has previously worked in childcare settings and is a longtime friend of Brittany's. Allyson's first full day will be May 27th. Please stop by the nursery and say hello to help her feel welcome. She will begin attending service here at either 8 am or 11 am, depending on nursery attendance.

During the search process for new nursery workers, I found 3 new volunteers who will fill in as needed. I will keep my help wanted signs posted for a few more weeks to see if there are any other takers! Our 7pm service has a lot of kids in the nursery who like to play puppets and do art projects, so I would love to have an extra person there!

In Children's Church, we are approaching the end of our "Jesus League" series and will be wrapping

up with a movie night on May 27th. We will watch Justice League and have popcorn and juice.

I am really excited about our next series: "Incredible Faith." We will be making our super hero masks, and learning about several Bible friends and how they displayed Incredible faith. In June we will have a movie field trip to see Disney's Incredibles 2.

In SHINE we have been learning about the 12 disciples. We have been focusing on their characteristics (doubtful, brave, greedy, short tempered...), how we also have those qualities, and how God can change them and/or use them to make us a light for him. We have been doing a short skit each week, and the kids love to act out the lessons. We have had some very sassy disciples. :)

I have met with all of the VBS volunteers and things are going well. We currently have 48 kids registered and I have not been able to advertise on Z88.3 yet. They will run the ad in 2 weeks. Miss Brittany has been working on some art for me and will be volunteering with the preschoolers this summer. I am very excited to have her join the VBS crew.

I had the opportunity to make "Earth Slime" with the Messiah Academy boys on April 24. I had previously made it with the SHINE kids and we had so much fun, Messiah Academy Director Terri Wetherington invited me to share the project with her crew. It was a lot of gooey fun!

On May the 4th, I hosted a Star Wars family night. We had a great themed meal, some fun games, and enjoyed watching the original movie with our Messiah family. Thanks to Tim and Terri Wetherington for being on the kitchen cleanup crew! Father Tom, Mother Tracy and Will Dugger did

amazing jobs with their costumes!

My family along with Youth Minister Janie Walton volunteered with Compassion International at the "For King and Country" concert and helped them match up 259 children with sponsors. It was an awesome experience and we look forward to doing it again.

We are partners in education with Dillard Street Elementary, and this year we were selected as their outstanding volunteer. Thank you to everyone who donated Christmas toys and school supplies this year. Next year, there will be 5 Messiah students there, so I will be looking to adopt a classroom as one of our outreach projects. On May 10 we were invited to participate in their community night. We were allowed to promote our church and the services we provide. I whipped up some Children's Ministry brochures with information about myself and our children's programs. We also had our general COTM brochures. We had a spin-to-win candy bar game as well as emoji goodie bags stuffed with candy and religious goodies. We passed out VBS invitations and offered prayer to those who were interested. I will be passing along the prayer requests to Father Tom. A huge thank you to Janie Walton and my husband Raul for helping with this event. Next year we will be better prepared for the large crowd and will likely dress in costume. The kids were super excited for free stuff! Ms. Janie and I are attending a volunteer appreciation breakfast on May 16th.

Youth Ministry: No report.

Messiah Academy: Director Terri Wetherington reports:

As Messiah Academy nears the end of our second school year, we have some great news to share about the effec-

tiveness of our program. As required, we conduct assessment tests each year. A primary benefit to these tests is that they provide benchmarks to measure the growth of each student. Our students who were with us last year, and thus have a point of comparison, have moved up significantly in the national percentile rankings. Our initial model for teaching kids outside of traditional classroom conventions is showing real promise as well as very positive and very real results.

In anticipation of growth, Messiah Academy created a part-time teacher position, and brought on Dr. Benjamin Blackman to fill the role.

Ben is a member of Church of the Messiah and a regular attendee at 11:00 services. He was already working with the kids teaching Kung Fu twice a week and will now be working with the kids for a total of 12 hours a week on traditional academic subjects as well. This will allow him several hours each week to have one-on-one tutor time with each child. The plan is to continue to grow enrollment so that Dr. Blackman can be our second full-time employee with an annual salary of 20,800. This would match Director Terri Wetherington's salary.

Messiah Academy has been reapproved to accept Dept of Education Scholarship funds for the 2018-2019 school year. On a related matter, the funds held in reserve (\$25,000) as a requirement to receive those funds, must remain in place for only one more year. Upon completion of that requirement, \$15,000 will revert to the school's general fund and \$10,000 will pay back the loan that provided the initial funds.

In keeping with the church goal of

growing a younger congregation, Messiah Academy will continue the traditions of Seraph Theatre Summer Camp run by Terri, and now in its 10th season. We are also employing Ben's skills and experience as a Kung Fu instructor to offer a Kung Fu Summer Camp that will run concurrently. Our goal is to expand our offerings to appeal to more children and families and to provide more varied enrichment activities.

With an eye for the future, our goal is to continue to grow enrollment and grow our music education program so that Messiah Academy can form a student bell choir here at Church of the Messiah.

Assistant Rector Tracy Dugger reports:

Communications and Website: A development (first draft) site is visible to our website team, and we are actively working with Worship Times (the website builder) to work out kinks and get our new site live for everyone. I'm teleconferencing weekly with the developer. We had a two and a half week setback while I was on jury duty. In spite of that, since last month we have: received a G-suite grant for non-profit organizations, which allows our staff to get email with their name@ChurchOfTheMessiah.com. Mine is tracydugger@churchofthemessiah.com, Activated 3rd party data storage so our site doesn't get clogged down and slow through sermon and video hosting, and activated our online directory for Messiah.

I need a team willing to help people sign into Servant Keeper after services on several Sundays, because our Messiah folks can only self-sign up for our online directory, online giving statements, and editing their directory info IF their email is already in the system.

We currently have only about 5% of our folks' emails in the database. DAWN WIRBEL AND MARY KAY PREDMORE VOLUNTEERED.

Young Adult- We had 20+ people for the Borsts for their BBQ in April, and a fun time was had. The Pool Party at the Winter's has been moved from May to June. I'm putting the final touches on a "Spend the Summer with Screwtape" series for REVIVE.

Diocesan Ministry:

10 of our Messiah ladies attended the ECW central deanery meeting where I spoke on Spiritual gifts. I blew them away (literally with a leaf blower) to illustrate how Spiritual gifts are God's power tools. I've already been invited to speak again next year.

My Critical Incident Stress Management training was unfortunately utilized recently. The mother of the Latino refugee families was murdered in her hotel room in Kissimmee. I provided debriefing sessions and helped my fellow clergy to meet other people's needs and process their own feelings about the event. Please pray this training won't be needed again for a long time!

Pictorial Directory: We're in the sign-up-for-your-photo-session stage.

DISCUSSION (to help make a decision next month):

Through the Valley of the Shadow of Death Grief Group: Greer McBryde has turned TVSD over to our parish and is working with Deacon Julie Altenbach to shift leadership to her. Greer has 70 books we will buy at half-price, which is \$10 each. We discussed setting set up a Designated TVSD account, from which we'll pay for those 70 books, and into which the proceeds will go when we sell them at full-price to

future participants.

The floor covering in the Parish Hall kitchen has a rotten spot that is usually covered by a water and dirt catching rug. But when the rug is out – as it was for cleaning a couple of weeks ago – the rotten spot is painfully obvious. Junior Warden Frank Chase will get some estimates for what it will cost to fix it.

DECISIONS (based on the Discussion last month):

Janie Walton's medical insurance:
Last month we discussed the possibility of taking some or all of the \$5,000 we don't have to pay for Janie Walton's husband's medical insurance and blessing Children's Minister Angela Lopez.

Vestry decided to give Angela a bonus of \$2000 for January – June.

Vestry urges Angela to submit receipts for out-of-pocket expenses on a monthly basis for reimbursement.

Sam Katulic's Process toward Ordination as a Deacon:
Sam's Parish Discernment Committee (PDC) finished their work and unanimously recommends that Sam continue on toward ordination. Vestry unanimously signed an endorsement for him to be made a Candidate for Ordination to the Diaconate.

He had to go through Psychological Testing and Screening, which cost \$650. Vestry decided to pay that out of the Easter Offering, which was \$4,331.00.

Easter Offering: after paying Sam's expenses for the testing, that leaves \$3,681.00. Vestry decided to apply that to the Operating Fund to decrease our Year-to-Date Deficit.

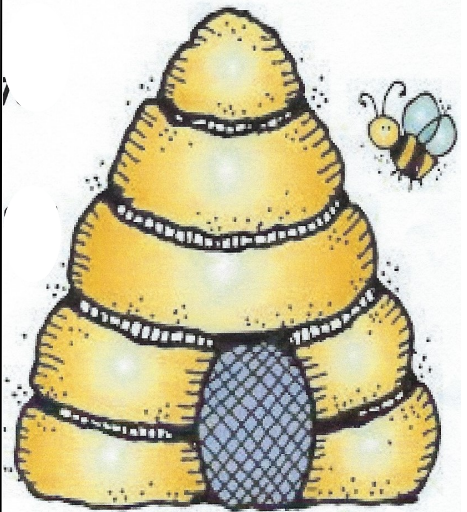
I also read *Jesus* by Max Lucado, knowing that I’ve always enjoyed his writings. I was not disappointed.
