From the Rector



Welcome Our New Assistant Music Minister!

Jeremy Adams has just come on staff as our Assistant Music Minister.

As such he is leading music and the Evening Band at the 7pm service twice a month and will lead both the Morning and Evening Bands for the 11am and 7pm service anytime longtime Music Minister Linda Ellison is away.

Here's how that came about.

Linda has gotten to the stage in life that leading the music at 4 services every Sunday is wearing on her, and she'd like to spend more time with her family.

Jeremy has been part of our music ministry for several years: playing an assortment of instruments, singing in the choir, running the sound board at 11am, teaching our other sound techs how to run the board, and playing piano for the Spanish service last year along with his wife Garine.

Jeremy and Garine are working musicians – see Jeremy's list of gigs below – and feel called to church music ministry.

This is the perfect opportunity to lighten Linda's load, for her to mentor Jeremy in the art of Church Music, and for Jeremy to

grow in his skills on keyboard and leading a Church band.

You may wonder, "How are we going to pay for this when we have an Operating Deficit this year?"

With Linda's reduction in time, we're also reducing her compensation and applying that amount to Jeremy, so this staffing move is revenue neutral for the church. It doesn't cost us any more to have both of them working for us than it did for only Linda!

Here's a picture of Jeremy and some of what he'd like you to know about him:



I graduated from West Orange High School in 2008, earned my Bachelors of Music Composition in 2012 from the University of Central Florida, and my Masters in Music Composition and Electronic Music in 2014 from the University of South Florida.

From 2009-2017 I performed and toured the southeast U.S. with the Jonnie Morgan Band. We recorded 3 albums during that time: "Reflections in the Water," "Janus," and "JMB Live at Sunfest." Some notable highlights from this time include opening for Cheap Trick, Reliant K, Sammy Hagar, and Tim Reynolds of the Dave Matthews Band, as well as having the opportunity in 2017 to

I still perform music for various artists and events – primarily on bass guitar – but I also play and teach guitar, piano, classical percussion, banjo, and ukulele.

Currently, in addition to my role as the Assistant Music Minister, I am an instructor and show director at the School of

Rock Orlando and a lead instructor of "Works with Sounds" which provides free music composition classes for all ages.

As a personal note, I am thrilled to be taking on the role of Assistant Music Minister at the Church of the Messiah. This church has been a family and a second home to me for years and I am thankful for the

opportunity.

I am thrilled to have Jeremy on staff and love that we get to nurture another home-grown leader for the Kingdom of God.

Hurricane Season June 1 – November 30

Ready or Not?

Non-Floridians complain that we don't have seasons like "Up North."

I assure them we DO have seasons: "mowing" and "non-mowing!"

But even more dramatic are our other two seasons: "Hurricane" and "Non-Hurricane."

And Hurricane Season starts June 1.

Are you ready? Have you gathered what you need to get through several days without electricity, gas stations, and air-conditioning? If not, do you have an evacuation plan and a place to go?

God promises to get us through difficulties. But one way he does that is offering us wisdom and knowledge. The newspapers, local magazines, TV and radio, and government are full of advice of what to do and how to prepare. Many of their suggestions are God's Word for us.

But if you haven't paid attention to all those other sources, let me add my voice to theirs:

Get ready for Hurricane Season! Because ready or not, here it is!

To help us prepare as individuals and families, parishioner and retired Navy Captain Murph Borno has assumed the helm of DART, our Disaster Action Response Team, composed of parishioners who volunteered through the Messiah's Way to help our parish family cope with a hurricane or other disaster.

Murph and DART have procured a stack of resources from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) with helpful tips to help us



get ourselves ready in our blood families. That literature is on the Welcome Table by the main double doors on the Tilden Street side of campus.

I urge you to read and heed them.

To help us as a parish family, the DART volunteers are ready with tools (chain saws, trucks, hammers, nails, tarps, etc.) and skills to help Messiah folks in need after a storm. In addition to helping our people in their own homes, a number of parish families have volunteered to take people into their homes and feed and house any whose homes are damaged.

Murph and DART have also developed a Messiah Family Disaster Plan to help us help each other if the Day comes. It's on the next page and will be distributed in the bulletins on several Sundays this month. Please post it in your home as a reminder for when the wind picks up.

In the event of a hurricane, tornado, or other disaster:

1 PRAY! HARD!

WE WILL HAVE CHURCH

2 ON SUNDAY at the regular times, no matter what the weather or conditions are. Use your discretion whether to come or not, especially if there is a curfew.

3 BEFORE THE DISASTER: If a named storm or other disaster is upon us, please call and/or email the 2 families ahead of you in the parish directory and the 2 families after you to pray with them and see if they have any needs. If there are needs you cannot meet, please call the Church office at 407-656-3218 (Even if no one is in the office, someone will check the parish voicemail) and/or email Father Tom Rutherford at TomRutherford@earthlink.net

4 IF YOU EVACUATE, please call the Church at 407-656-3218 and/or email Father Tom Rutherford at TomRutherford@earthlink.net and let us know.

5 AFTER THE DISASTER, please call those same 4 families to pray with them and see if they're okay. Please call the Church at 407-656-3218 and/or email Father Tom Rutherford at TomRutherford@earthlink.net to share any needs you or they have, and the DART (Disaster Action Response Team) will match needs with resources in the parish and community.

6 KEEP PRAYING!

A Group Home for teenage foster girls in Winter Garden and the non-profit group Foster Friends of Central Florida is asking for help letting these girls know the community cares about them. The girls are usually between 13-17 years old and they will "age out" of the foster system on their 18th birthday. The community is being asked to provide meals for these ladies (up to 6 teenage girls plus 1 staff member) every Friday and Sunday evening at 6 pm.

FORMATION: We met in the Narthex sitting area outside the parish office, because the Library was already set up as a Lion's Den for this week's Vacation Bible School. Mary Kay Predmore led Noonday Prayer. Based on pages 126-162 of *Growing Young* (Chapter 4 "Take Jesus' Message Seriously: What's Young about the good News"), we talked about how we're doing with this and how we can improve in the Messiah family.

Outreach Team: Doreen Stachowski reports:

Posted signs in the church / handouts for the Christian Service Center garage sale on June 23, 2018.

Dillard Street School kids will receive a back-pack blessings tag that will be delivered when school starts back. The tag will read "The Church of the Messiah loves you and prays for you."

The decision to monetarily support West Orange Habitat for Humanity will be tabled until 2019. Outreach is already supporting two groups this year.

Planning continues for our Bingo fundraiser on September 22, 2018. All task owners are working on their assignments. In addition to Bingo, we

will start to sell raffle tickets mid-July for cash prizes of \$500 and \$250. Winning ticket will be drawn Bingo night. Volunteer signup sheets will be included at the raffle ticket sales table for the many volunteers we will need Bingo night.

Outside Signage: Two parishioners paid for new signs to replace the faded ones at North Dillard and East Tilden, at North Dillard and East Plant, on 535 south of Colonial Drive, and on Windermere Road. They will be installed soon.

Inside Signage: Patty Tate is working on additional informational signage. She will seek estimates to have the signs created professionally. **No others received.**

Staff Reports:

Facility: Rental Report was emailed separately. Facility Minister Amy Paredes reports:

This month I have taken care of the youth hall floors with "Radiant Services" and general maintenance of the facility.

I have with met with various clients who are interested in renting for the fall season.

We are currently working with the online "Wedding Spot" locator who helps bring in some revenue and we have reached approximately 47,685 views from prospective clients. From this source I have been able to; set up appointments, meet, and give quotes from this website.

I am working with a company (LR Risk Consulting, Inc.) who may be interested in renting the PH kitchen for a full week in January or February of 2019. I am meeting with the representative on Monday.

I have set up events for several parish families who are renting and

donating to the building fund.

Also, the entire church is scheduled for all carpets in the church, narthex floors, office rooms, workroom, library, restrooms, and lobbies to be stripped, cleaned and waxed. This cleaning will take place the week of July 23rd.

Children of the Messiah Preschool: The financial report was emailed separately.

Children's Ministry: Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports: We had a great turn out for the Aladdin cooking camp and made some delicious food! It was a great way to kick off summer vacation. We made banana peanut butter pancakes, magic carpet pizzas, black bean humus, cheese cakes and spicy pepper chicken and rice. Our next cooking camp will be in November and the theme is yet to be determined.

The past 2 weeks I have been preparing lunch for Seraph Theatre again. I like to do this because many of the kids are from COTM and will be coming to VBS, so, I get to spend extra time with them. I will be teaching them the VBS songs and motions at the end of the week.

Vacation Bible School: Thanks to Cindi Schaffer and Holy Spirit Church in Apopka we have some awesome costumes for VBS!

We had a costume fitting and training session on June 12. This year we have a great group of volunteers who are all working well together and having fun thus far. We are being blessed with many decorations and an entire 20 by 8 foot stage display from Lakeside church in Oakland. Huge thanks to Deacon Tim and Raul Lopez for getting the

U-Haul truck and picking up all of this!!

We have a good deal of kids preregistered and we usually have several walk ins. I am praying for a full house again this year. Thankfully I have a full volunteer staff and have been blessed with many donations of supplies and funds to cover the remaining VBS expenses.

In order to facilitate a speedy check in process I will be meeting with Mother Tracy to walk through the Servant Keeper e-check in system. We hope this will also help us provide a secure nursery check in system as well, as this is very appealing to new parents.

Children's Church: We have begun our summer series "Incredible Faith" which is loosely based on the Disney movie The Incredibles. We met at the movie theater on June 16 to watch the new movie. We have a "super" cool bulletin board and have made an Ark Man(Noah) mask and a cape for Mr. Obedience(Abram).

SHINE: We are continuing with our Disciples lesson series. Thank you to Regina Seguin for leading SHINE on June 10! One of my SHINE kiddos will be moving up to Activate at the end of the Summer so Janie and I are coordinating a crossover/promotion activity that will take place before school resumes.

In between VBS projects I have begun planning the fall/winter activities and have scheduled the family fall fest and Christmas party.

I have enlisted a few volunteers for the Christmas production but have not settled on a theme yet.

We are hosting a backpack blessing and Sundae party in August, and I have created backpack tags for our

kids and ordered enough to share with Dillard Street Elementary. They say on one side "Church of the Messiah loves and prays for me" and on the reverse have Joshua 1:9 written out. The verse was selected by Mother Tracy who will be offering the blessings.

Youth Ministry: Youth Minister Janie Walton reports: Activate's mission trip fundraiser, "Prom through the Decades" was held on Saturday, June 2. This was our last big fundraiser for our mission trip to Jamaica and God provided \$297 toward our mission trip fund.

Assistant Rector Tracy Dugger reports:

Vestry Meeting Minutes continued

Website: We are almost go for launch. I've had weekly meetings with the developer, and I anticipate launching an 85-90% complete website within the end of the month. The Online directory and giving buttons are working, and we will be training our folks to use these tools. Social media: you can follow COTM_wg on Instagram! And I'm recruiting teenagers to help us populate our feed. Young Adults: Revive started our Screwtape Letter Series, and we have one social event planned for June, and I'm planning a game night for July.

Pictorial Directory: Photos have been taken, and the directory should come out in a month or so.

Community Service: A local man needed to do 160 hours of court ordered community service. Tom Rutherford found that much work for him to do around the church: pressure washing the youth hall chairs, all the campus sidewalks, and the playground equipment; washing all the windows inside and out, cleaning the parish hall chairs and tables, cleaning smudges and touching up the paint in the parish hall and narthex, painting the church bathrooms, washing all the air intake vents, installing the fence around the church air conditioning unit, helping install a cleanout plug in the church sewer line, cleaning out the chiller plant enclosure and washing the new cooling fins, picking up the paper that didn't make it into the paper recycle bin, shoveling out the dumpster enclosure, and more!

DISCUSSION (to help make a decision next month): Light fixtures in the Classrooms and floor covering in the Parish Hall kitchen need to be replaced. Frank

Chase is working on getting prices for the wisest fix for both.

DECISIONS (based on the Discussion last month):
Sam Katulic's Process toward Ordination as a Deacon:

Vestry signed the final endorsement before Sam's ordination as a deacon. Though we hoped Sam could be ordained this September, it turns out his nomination was turned in too late for that to happen. He's not eligible until April of 2019.

He did his Psychological Testing. But because the psychologist is concerned about Sam's diagnosis of "Parkinson's-Like Condition," and the risk of dementia, he insists upon another evaluation by a neuro-psychologist. Sam says his neurologist says "Parkinson's-Like" manifests all the physical symptoms without the mental ones, so dementia is not an expected part of his condition. But "Parkinson's-Like" is an emerging diagnosis in the medical world, and its prognosis is not widely known. Sam's medical insurance will pay for this additional testing.

Through the Valley of the Shadow of Death Grief Group: Greer McBryde turned TVSD over to be a ministry of our parish and is working with Deacon Julie Altenbach to shift leadership to her. Vestry agreed to buy the 70 workbooks she had left at half-price for \$10 each. We will sell them to participants for full price of \$20 each, with the profit serving as seed money for when we need to reprint the workbooks.

Roof Repairs and Replacing the Youth Hall Roof: Lamar Powers came to the meeting to answer questions about our roof issues in the church, Parish Hall, and Youth Hall. We hoped the damage from squirrels and time to the church and Parish

Hall roofs would be covered by warranty. They weren't, and the repairs will be \$4,200.

While inspecting the damaged portions of the church and parish hall roofs, Calloway Roofing, who is doing the repairs, noticed the youth hall roof in bad shape. Vestry approved Calloway's replacing it for \$25,304.40. That roof was last replaced in the mid-1990's.

Operating Account: April's income was \$18,010.70 LESS than expenses, INCREASING our year-to-date deficit to \$53,445.38. PLEASE PRAY FOR GOD TO PROVIDE.

Building Fund:

We paid off one of the bridge loans we had to take out when we refinanced our mortgage, so our monthly payment dropped from \$14,709.16 to \$12,981.97!

Net Building Fund income (gifts, fundraising, and facility rental income, less expenses) was \$9,314.01 LESS that what we needed to cover the mortgage of \$12,891.97 and prepay \$2,608.83 of the principal. That money was taken from the Contingency Fund.

The meeting ended with prayer at 3:40pm.

I was busier than usual this month: I read two books and watched two DVDs.

The first book was *A Girl After God's Own Heart* by Elizabeth George. It is aimed, mostly at children from Elementary School age through the teen years; but it offers good advice for "girls" of all ages concerning "My Heart," "My Space," "My Parents," "My Family," "My School," "My Friends," "My Church," "My Self," "My Time," and "My Adventure with Jesus." The last, "My Adventure with Jesus," expresses the purpose of the whole book: to view life as an adventure with Jesus. There are also provided places to record the reader's personal reactions.

The other book was *Escape the Coming Night* by Dr. David Jeremiah. It is not as enthralling as his *Agents of the Apocalypse* (also in the library), which dramatizes the entire book of Revelation; but it is well worth the reading just the same. It also covers the entire book of Revelation, but is more pedagogic in style.

I finally viewed two DVDs I've been meaning to watch: *All Saints* and *I Can Only Imagine*.

All Saints captured my interest initially because it is about the Episcopal church in Smyrna, Tennessee, where our young people have helped out numerous summers.

It takes place in a time when the diocese wanted to shut down the church and sell the property, because the "congregation" consisted of only a handful of people. Enter a new priest. *All Saints* is his first assignment, and he wants to make a success of it. So he sends out fliers to encourage people to attend. Enter Korean refugees who swell the numbers but not the treasury.

Ironically the priest's wife encourages him to forsake tilting at windmills and go back to something more lucrative. However, he pleads his case with the diocese not to close and sell yet, because he wants to try using the property for farming, since he has an abundance of farmers in the church and plenty of land to till. They agree on the condition that in three months time the church can pay the mortgage for the month. Now it's his wife's turn to encourage him not to give up!

The balance of the movie I found rather surprising. Let's just say "God moves in mysterious ways!"

The other DVD, *I Can Only Imagine*, is about the birth of the song and the amazing grace of God that saved the composer after an abusive childhood, then saved his father, the perp of the abuse, and finally brought forth the song, "I Can Only Imagine," out of the composer's grief and want.

The only disappointment was that I never got to hear the song itself! Now I'll have to find a CD with that on it! O, well....

Martial Arts at Church of the Messiah



As we approach our one year anniversary of study at Church of the Messiah, I wanted to share with everyone some of the great memories we have had over the last year.

Many of you may not be aware that we began our classes last summer with just a handful of students eager and excited to learn. Our self-defense class is an ongoing series of lessons in the ancient forms of Kung Fu.

Qi Gong style of Kung Fu is taught to students to match their own level of fitness. Whether you are the inflexible wanting to stretch and strengthen, or if you are athletic and want to excel and enhance yourself, this class is designed for you.

Our style of Kung Fu helps us to discipline the body, awaken the mind, and enhance the spirit. For only when the body and the breath move as one: do we find our balance.

Recently we have had our first promotions of rank in the class. Rank (denoted by color sashes) within our style reflects a student's perseverance, effort, and determination to exceed their own personal limits to the best of their abilities. Joe Clemens, Terri Wetherington and Tim Wetherington have all earned the rank of Green Sash.

No achievement, whether perceived as great or small at the time, should ever be undervalued. And when that achievement is to better oneself physically, mentally and spiritually, then the effort is all the more laudable. The Green Sash represents growth and beginnings along with a thirst for knowledge. A student should thirst for and seek out

knowledge as a blooming seed seeks water for life. I am so proud of all my students and cannot wait to see what the future holds. Although the future is exciting, the present is even more fun. And presently there are other church members who are exploring the benefits of Kung Fu. Just a couple weeks

ago we held our very first Kung Fu Day Camp. We were small in number for our first year and we had a blast! We spent a week practicing Kung Fu, stretching, and overcoming all sorts of games and challenges.

Giada Mazzaluna took on the challenge of learning and performing an entire form (also known as a kata) in only 4 days. She made it look easy. Way to go!

We participated in group games with the Seraph Theatre players and even had some of the theatre players come work out with us during their rehearsal breaks. (if you didn't get a chance to go, you missed a great show...come see it next summer!)

At Messiah Academy we have added Kung Fu as a permanent course of the school curriculum as a physical education component. Messiah Academy spends so much extra effort in giving the best individualized education to each student. Utilizing Kung Fu as a structured discipline was a perfect match. The Messiah Academy students use Kung Fu in many aspects of their education. Alongside their physical calisthenics the martial disciplines teach respect and deference, problems solving, abstract learning, and most importantly: the value of making mistakes...and learning from them.

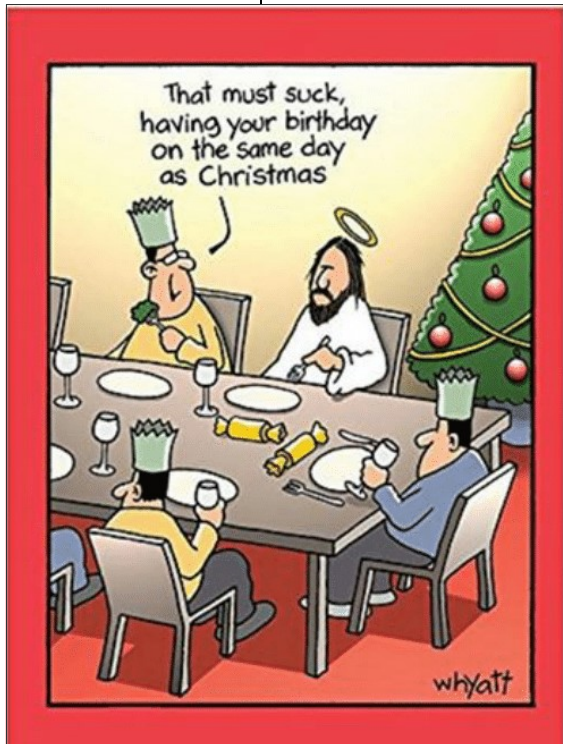
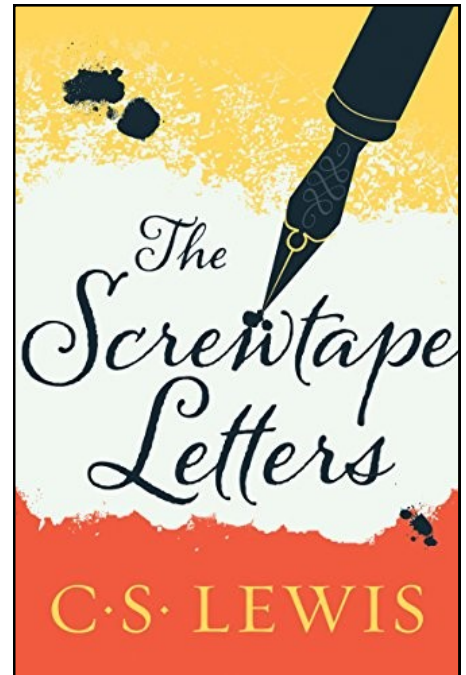

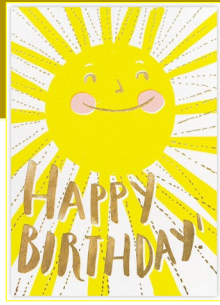
Join Mother T for Revive in Summer!
