
A Tale Of Two Calendars

As our Website Team rebuilt our website, we realized the calendar on the site serves two distinct, yet overlapping, purposes:

- 1. Some folks particularly people visiting our website for the first time checking us out to see if maybe they want to come visit us in person want to know what's happening especially worship services and social events and when and where they'll be.
- 2. Other folks like Altar Guild members and people hoping to rent our facility want to know when specific rooms are being used and when they are available.

Because those needs overlap, we thought about making one calendar that showed EVERYTHING.

But because those needs are actually different, we realized putting everything on one calendar would be more confusing than helpful.



That's why we have two calendars on the website

The calendar on the front page of the website entitled Worship & Church Events addresses need #1. It lists parish events, gives you the time they start, where they are, and some promotional details to entice you to come and bring your friends.

This calendar DOES NOT include non-parish weddings, private meetings, and rental events. If an event is not open to the public, it's not on here.

This is the calendar people visiting our website for the first time will see, in order to invite them onto our campus. It also lets our Messiah family see when and where our various parish events are.

If you want to have an event at Church, please contact Facilities Minister Amy Paredes at Amy-Paredes@ChurchOfTheMessiah.com to reserve your space and time. Amy schedules everything on our campus, and if you don't check with her, you may find someone else in the space you were hoping to use when you arrive.

If you want your event to be public, after you schedule your space with Amy, please submit the event details to Parish Administrator LaVerne Woods at LaVerne-Woods@ChurchOfTheMessiah.com for inclusion in the Messenger newsletter, Sunday Bulletins, and the Worship & Church Events Calendar.

But what about Altar Guild, Coffee Hour Hosts, and other volunteers who want to know when they can arrive to set up or tear down for a parish function? Or what if someone wants to know if a particular space is available to rent on a particular day and time? The Facilities Calendar is for them.

The Facilities Calendar is the first option under the Facilities tab on the Home Page. This calendar shows how long each space is reserved for, including time for set-up and cleanup. This is where most private and all rental events will show.

Now, occasionally, last minute facility rentals do occur, and when those happen – because we like it when our facility generates income! – there may not be time to get an event on the Facilities Calendar, but this calendar will be accurate 99% of the time.


The website is where most people find us for the first time, so it's designed to be visitor-friendly and caters to non-parishioners and non-

Episcopalians; and that's why we've spent the past 8 months overhauling and rebuilding it.


But it's also for us: to let us know what's happening and when and where, and

Ready or Not?

Non-Floridians complain that we don't have seasons like "Up North."

I assure them we DO have seasons: "mowing" and "non-mowing!"

But even more dramatic are our other two seasons: "Hurricane" and "Non-Hurricane."

And Hurricane Season starts June 1.

Are you ready? Have you gathered what you need to get through several days without electricity, gas stations, and air-conditioning? If not, do you have an evacuation plan and a place to go?

God promises to get us through difficulties. But one way he does that is offering us wisdom and knowledge. The newspapers, local magazines, TV and radio, and government are full of advice of what to do and how to prepare. Many of their suggestions are God's Word for us.

But if you haven't paid attention to all those other sources, let me add my voice to theirs:

Get ready for Hurricane Season! Because ready or not, here it is!

To help us prepare as individuals and families, parishioner and retired Navy Captain Murph Borno has assumed the helm of DART, our <u>D</u>isaster <u>A</u>ction <u>R</u>esponse <u>T</u>eam, composed of parishioners who volunteered through the Messiah's Way to help

our parish family cope with a hurricane or other disaster.

Murph and DART have procured a stack of resources from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) with helpful tips to help us

get ourselves ready in our blood families. That literature is on the Welcome Table by the main double doors on the Tilden Street side of campus.

I urge you to read and heed them.

To help us as a parish family, the DART volunteers are ready with tools (chain saws, trucks, hammers, nails, tarps, etc.) and skills to help Messiah folks in need after a storm. In addition to helping our people in their own homes, a number of parish families have volunteered to take people into their homes and feed and house any whose homes are damaged.

If you'd like to volunteer to help in any of those ways, please contact Murph directly at <u>fly-inghigh@cfl.rr.com</u> (Murph flew high in the sky as a Naval aviator; NOT that OTHER kind of "high!) or 407-413-4220.

Murph and DART have also developed a Messiah Family Disaster Plan to help us help each other if the Day comes. It's on the next page and will be distributed in the bulletins on several Sundays this month. Please post it in your home as a reminder for when the wind picks up.

I love you, and I'll see you on Sunday - no matter how hard the wind blows!



Through the Valley of the Shadow of Death

Fall Session: Begins October 7th

What is this program about?

"Through the Valley of the Shadow of Death" bereavement program is a Christ –centered format to provide small groups conversations about life, death, grief, hope.

Why is this program important?

This small group setting of 6 or 7 participants provides a safe environment of trust by:

- Sharing stories of loved ones
- Listening to our feelings, thoughts, actions, and beliefs
- Learning from each other
- Providing tools for personal growth, coping skills, and moving forward in our lives
- Bonding with and supporting each other through the journey

Who is this for?

This program is for people who have suffered the death of a loved one in the recent past (3 or 4 months ago), or as long as 25 or 30 years, or as far back as you can remember.

When and Where

TVSD is held two times per year, in the fall and during Lent.



The next session will begin October 7, 2018. The sessions are held 1 hour per week for six weeks. We meet on Sundays at 11:00 A.M. in the church library. (If circumstances of the group require, we may meet in a different time or place that is agreeable to all.)

Activate enjoyed a youth group outing to Jeremiah's Italian Ice in Windermere on Sunday, September 9 in lieu of our regular youth group meeting. A big thank you to Deacon Julie Altenbach for treating all of us!

I attended the Diocesan Youth Leaders' Meeting on Wednesday, September 12. There is no regular Activate meeting in the afternoon on Sunday, September 16 as we will be attending the Parish Birthday Party.

I am starting a new lesson series on Sunday, September 23 in Activate. We are going through highlights of the Old Testament beginning with Genesis with an emphasis on tying in current world issues with what is written in Scripture, and what is our call, as Christians, in dealing with these issues.

Messiah Academy: Director Terri Wetherington did not submit a report in time to be included in this agenda. It was emailed separately.

Assistant Rector Tracy Dugger reports:

Website: The new website was introduced to the congregation on the first Sunday of August. The initial building of the website is complete and more than \$1000 dollars UNDER BUDGET. Thank you, Worship Times and Website Committee: Stacey Beck, Steve Borst, Tracy Dugger, and John Peacock. I oriented the Staff how to edit their portions and will be supplementing this training by compiling a digital manual for how to do the most basic update tasks on the website.

Technology Administration: I am compiling essential administrator info for G-Suite for Business, Servant Keeper Cloud Giving, Amazon S3 backup recovery and hosting sermons, appleID for our podcast, and church Youtube, Facebook, Instagram and Twitter. We've added all of these new tools to

our digital toolkit within the past year! We did all of this and came in under budget thanks to grants through TechSoup.

Young Adults: Trivia Tuesday was well attended this past month and will recur September 25th. I'm launching a new home group for parents of young children, and we have our first meeting September 21st. I continue to reach out to our Young Adults and am planning a fall social get together.

Rector Tom Rutherford reports: The West Orange Ministerial Association (WOMA) meets monthly to pray for our community and enjoy lunch together at Golden Pond Assisted Living Community to foster friendship and cooperation among the ministries of our community. Attendance at the lunches has declined over the past couple of years for a number of reasons, so a couple of the local pastors and I are rebooting the lunches. Instead of having them at Golden Pond, each of us will take a month and host the lunch. At the lunch, the host will have a chance to share their vision for ministry and tell about the 2 or 3 things they do really well. The goal is to help us know one another better so we can utilize each others' strengths, avoid duplicating one another's ministries, and see where the gaps are in the continuum of care in our community. We host the lunch December 6 (St Nicholas Day!).

Pictorial Directory should arrive in a month or so.

Father Soner Alexandre: Tom Rutherford is working on compiling all the information the United States Citizenship and Immigration Service wants to prove the Episcopal Church is, indeed, a real church and not a scam or fake organization; and information on every congregation in the

diocese to show the diocese is a real entity, in order to procure an R-1 visa.

<u>DISCUSSION</u> (to help make a decision next month):

The floor covering in the Parish Hall kitchen has a rotten spot that is usually covered by a water and dirt catching rug. But when the rug is out, the rotten spot is painfully obvious. Frank Chase will get estimates for what it costs to repair/replace it and report back.

Lightning stuck somewhere on our campus during the week of July 1-6 and fried the phone system, internet, and the controls for the A/C in the narthex hallway, offices, restrooms, nursery, and library.

Phone System: We are researching phone equipment vendors to find the best deal. All those bids were not available by the time of the meeting, so we'll look at them and discuss our options next month.

Youth Hall Air Conditioner: two different motors burned out simultaneously on the two units air conditioning the Youth hall. They were repaired under warranty, so we didn't have to pay for parts; only labor. The technician suspects lightning, so we're adding that expense to our lightning claim.

Prospective Delegates to Diocesan Convention: Convention is February 1-2, 2019 at Trinity Prep School in Winter Springs.

All our clergy are automatically Clergy Delegates.

We need 3 Lay Delegates and up to 3 Lay Alternate Delegates, and the Vestry is responsible for electing those. Tom Rutherford listed the folks who have volunteered to serve, and Vestry will choose next month.

Prospective Vestry nominees: A number of possible nominees were suggested. Vestry was asked NOT to mention those names to anyone until Tom Rutherford and the outgoing vestry members (Marci Babione, Frank Chase, Leo Henry, and Doreen Stachowski) vet them and see if they're willing to stand for election.

<u>DECISIONS</u> (based on the Discussion last month):

Richard Gonzalez's process toward ordination as a priest: Richard has passed the Diocesan Ordination Exam and is at the last few steps in the process that could get him ordained before the end of this year. Those steps are:

Vestry Endorsement for Candidacy: All the members present signed the document saying: We, whose names are hereunder written, testify to our belief (based on personal knowledge or on evidence satisfactory to us) that Richard Gonzalez, a confirmed adult communicant of this church in good standing, is sober, honest and godly, and qualified to be admitted a Candidate for Holy Orders for Ordination to the Priesthood.

Vestry endorsement for Ordination: All the members present signed the document saying: We do certify that, after due inquiry, we are well assured and believe that The Reverend Richard Gonzalez, Deacon since the twenty-fourth day of June in the year 2016, being the date of ordination to the Diaconate, has lived a sober, honest, and godly life, and has not written, taught, or held anything contrary to the Doctrine, Discipline, or Worship of this Church. And, moreover, we think The Reverend Richard Gonzalez a person worthy to be admitted to the Sacred Order of Priests.

Inside Signage: After our tour of the facility in July, Patty Tate had Central Florida Sign Installers come out to see what we wanted and give a bid.

Their estimate is for \$840.42 for the signs at each entrance on the doors and opposite wall, hanging outside the restrooms, over the Parish Hall double doors, and outside the Youth Hall. That would buy only the signs, and we would install them. Frank Chase volunteered to do the installation.

Tom Rutherford spoke to Kathy Barrett, who made the banners in the church, the parish banner in the narthex, painted the pictures above the Prayer Chapel, and did the calligraphy in the narthex over the doors to see if she'd paint murals and add lettering in some of the places we'd like signs. She's out of town, but will meet with Tom when she returns. Because of the probability of Kathy's doing some or all of the signage, we will wait until she makes a decision before we make a decision about buying signs.

Minutes from the August meeting: Approved

August Financial Report from Treasurer Rodger Watson: Report amended to reflect allocation of \$19,140 from the Operating Account for replacement of coils for the Chiller Plant be designated to the Building Fund. Approved as amended.

Operating Account: August's income was \$25,253.98 LESS than expenses, INCREASING our year-to-date deficit to \$78,658.19. PLEASE PRAY FOR GOD TO PROVIDE.

Building Fund: Net Building Fund income (gifts, fundraising, and facility rental income, less expenses) was \$5,112.45 LESS that what we needed to cover the mortgage of \$12,891.97.

- PaperRetriever has put a recycling dumpster on the Woodland Street side of the playground behind the Sunday School/Preschool building.

I was in C.S. Lewis mode this month. I read two of his books: *Miracles* and *The Magician's Nephew* from *The Chronicles of Narnía*.

I tried some time back to read *Miracles*, but gave it up because it was so super-intellectual; but I decided to give it another try. I had to "wade" a bit through the first seven chapters, but things improved when he finished with "preliminaries," and got on with talking about miracles. Basically his premise is that miracles are just as "natural" as what we would normally call natural; it's just that they intensify or accelerate what happens in the natural world.

For example, God has always "turned water into wine;" It's just that he normally uses a grape vine to accomplish it, whereas at Cana he did it directly. Similarly, multiplying fish is nothing new for God, nor multiplying bread, either. (In the latter case, he multiplies the seed sown in the ground.) But when he fed the five thousand "plus women and children," he again did it directly. And if you have eyes to see, you can spot God's hand in everything

that happens. Or you can choose to call things like the calm sea during World War II that indirectly saved thousands of British lives stranded in Dunkirk a "coincidence;" that's your prerogative. Or you can see God's hand. It rather reminds one of the Man of La Mancha, Don Quixote, who saw castles where others saw hovels and "pure damsels" where others saw bar maids.

I seem to remember that initially the opening book of *The Narnia* Chronicles was The Lion, The Witch And The Wardrobe, and the order of the books was somewhat random chronologically. But the set I just bought puts them in chronological order, so that the first book is *The Magician's Nephew*, which is the "Genesis" of Narnia. Diggory's Uncle Andrew, who fancies himself a magician, has discovered magic rings that he believes empower one to visit other worlds and to return from them. Being a coward, however, he won't try them himself; so he first sends a guinea pig, which accomplishes nothing except to transport one guinea pig to parts unknown. So when his nephew shows up in his study with a

female friend, Polly, he sends Polly to the same place, counting on Diggory to go after her, rescue her, and come back with the information he wants. He gets a bit more than he bargained for when the children return with the evil Witch Jadis, whom Diggory inadvertently awakened from her sleep, who followed the children to Narnia when Aslan (the Christ figure) was originally creating it, and then followed them back to Uncle Andrew's study. Trying not to reveal too much, I'll just say that all of them, plus a couple of others, end up in Narnia, where they have wonderful adventures.


