

Say "YES!" To Jesus on February 1

Bishop Greg Brewer, our diocese, our parish family, and our parish clergy and vestry are putting on a BIG event to give folks a chance to say "Yes" to Jesus.

It's a REVIVAL Friday February 1 at 7pm.

Presiding Bishop Michael Curry, whom we pray for almost every Sunday, and who preached at the royal wedding last May, is the main speaker.

We're having lots of music, testimonies from folks who have said "Yes" to Jesus, and a chance to pray and say "Yes" to Jesus ourselves.

It's at First Baptist Church of Orlando at 3000 South John Young Parkway in Orlando – not because we want to make more Baptists (!), but because that's the biggest Christian venue in town, and we hope to pack it with several thousand people.

The doors open at 5pm, and the music starts at 7.

We're taking a charter bus from Messiah to the Revival, leaving from the Main Street parking lot at 5:30 that evening. Watch the

And if you'd like to help put it on, you can volunteer to be a parking lot guide, outside greeter, inside greeter, usher, or work the sign-in table. We especially need bi-lingual folks as greeters, so if you speak Spanish, please consider volunteering.

A Plethora of Priests with a Dollop of Deacons

You may have noticed at Sunday services that the altar area is not as crowded as it has been.

That's because God has blessed us with a crowd of clergy, and, rather than having us all up there all the time, we're serving in rotation. That way each of us gets to exercise our deaconly and priestly ministries, and none of us are just altar ornaments.

Each of deacons is concentrating on one service: Tim Wetherington at 8, Richard Gonzalez at 9:30, and Julie Altenbach at 11am and 7pm. If any of them are away on a Sunday, one of the others will step up and fill in the gap. From time to time, they'll rotate services, so each gets to see all of you, and all of you get to see each of them.

We priests are doing the same. You'll see whichever ones of us are celebrating and preaching, but the others will be in the congregation or elsewhere.

This gives Father Sonér Alexandre more opportunities to improve and develop his English and allows Mother Tracy and I to be among you in the congregation, rather than always up around the altar.


Beyond our regular cast of clergy, Pastor Greer McBryde will float in and out as her health and availability allow, Deacon Richard Gonzalez will officiate for the first part of the Eucharist in preparation for his ordination to the priesthood sometime later this year, Sam Katulic will be ordained a deacon sometime this year, and Laura Cook is in the discernment process, working toward being ordained a priest in the future.

"Too many clergy" is a GREAT problem to have! It means we are both attracting and raising up leaders, not only for ourselves, but also for the wider community and world. It gives each of our clergy the freedom to concentrate on their strengths, rather than having to be "general practitioners." It offers our parish family more leaders to facilitate, initiate, develop, and maintain more ministries. And the diversity among our personalities, ages, genders, and ethnicities gives each of you at least one of us you can relate to as a sibling and friend in faith, hope, and love, instead of merely as a "priest" or "deacon," which can be intimidating at times.

I love that the Messiah family is also the Messiah Ministry Mill! As we raise up, equip, and crank out clergy, everyone wins: each of us in this parish family, our congregation as a whole, this community, our diocese, the Episcopal Church, and the Kingdom of God.

We're changing the world with Jesus, one clergyperson at a time!



Staff Reports: Facility: The Rental Report was emailed separately.

Facilities Minister Amy Paredes reports: This month has been very busy with prospective clients. I signed three contracts so far and received information to sign NACA (a homebuyers' seminar) for several Saturdays in 2019.

I introduced a new client to our facility who is promoting her new school in Central Florida, and she is using our Parish Hall for a tea party for her not-for-profit organization. In addition, I have signed for a wedding in February and Central Florida Preparatory School for their Annual Christmas party December 21st. All ministries should be gathering information to pass to me so that I can begin creating the 2019 calendar.

Children of the Messiah Preschool: The financial report was emailed separately.

Children's Ministry: Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports: The last part of November and beginning of December have been spent wrapping up end of the year commitments and planning the last few activities of 2018.

I have 3 new volunteers at 9:30 for children's church and we are working through training on the new curriculum. The kids have really enjoyed all of the characters and the extra engagement. They have enjoyed it so much that I purchased another unit from Kidz Matter to be used after Easter.

I have a rough outline of events planned for 2019 that is ready to be submitted for calendar approval. There are a few 5th Sunday Fundays, several SHINE theme nights, Parents' Nights Out and cooking camps as well as major holiday parties, little lessons in Lent and VBS.

On November 30, I volunteered at Light up Winter Garden and would like to have a booth there next year. I did not get my request in early enough this year. I think it would be helpful to have a few candle stations that offered a free snack/craft with Christmas service times advertised. This would be a great event for outreach members and I will present the idea to them at the next meeting.

Gifts are flowing in for the Angels at Dillard Street Elementary! All of the angels were picked, and the extra ones were taken as well. We will be blessing 25 kids with gifts! I, on behalf of the outreach team will be serving a light breakfast for the teachers at Dillard Street on December 18 as a holiday treat.

On December 15 we are having our Reindeer Party and on the 21st, I am getting together with some of the girls for a PJ and movie luncheon, We are watching "Elliot the Littlest Reindeer" and enjoying take out from Chili's!

The parent who was looking into sound proofing paint has informed me that it is \$200 a gallon. I moved on and purchased sound reducing drapes and hardware to hang them. I will have that done as soon as possible and will look into having a few of the acoustic panels hung around the room. The next step would be getting an area rug similar to what the preschool uses in their classrooms.

The next few weeks will be much busier than the last few!

Youth Ministry: Youth Minister Janie Walton reports: Due to December being a very busy time not only in the church, but also for our Activate students with midterms and holiday concerts for band, orchestra and choir, I have chosen not to plan too many extra activities.

We have completed our study on the Book of Genesis at Activate and are taking a break from our *Through the Bible* series during the four Sundays in Advent to focus on lessons pertaining to the coming of Jesus at Christmas and when He comes back again. This will hopefully result in less overall prep time for Sunday and ease communication. Already moving to Google drive has saved us from having one Sunday with no slideshow when the media computer was not working. We were quickly able to transition to a different computer before the service began. A big thank you to Jeremy Adams, Jessica Brueggemann, Linda Ellison, and Tom Rutherford for their contributions to this project.

Young Adults Group: My parenting class is on a hiatus for December, as well as Revive Young Adult Study. I'm in planning mode for next year and using that time on Sunday to plan, to lead an Activate Youth Group Session on grief, attend an ordination, and maybe squeeze in a little rest. Our annual progressive Christmas party is December 15th with the Mazzalunas, the Wilkinsons, and Duggers as hosts.

Laura Cook's Parish Discernment Committee is Chairperson Mary Kay Predmore, Frank Chase, Janice Hull, Doreen Stachowski, and Dawn Wirbel.

DISCUSSION (to help make a decision next month):

The floor covering in the Parish Hall kitchen has a rotten spot that is usually covered by a water and dirt catching rug. But when the rug is out, the rotten spot is painfully obvious. Frank Chase is still chasing down estimates to repair/replace it.

Youth Hall Echoes: The new ceiling and paint job are beautiful!!! BUT... now the room echoes badly. It needs sound treatment, like the Parish Hall did when we built it. Deadening will cost between \$1,000 and \$2,000, depending up what size and style treatment we choose. Wall panels like in the Parish Hall are more expensive. Foam squares we stick on the wall are least expensive. There are several other alternatives in between and we'll continue exploring them.

DECISIONS (based on the Discus-

sion last month):

Resolutions regarding Clergy Housing Allowance: PASSED 2019 Proposed Budget. The Finance Committee (Senior Warden Doreen Stachowski, Treasurer Rodger Watson, Rector Tom Rutherford, Vestry member Don Greer, and parishioner Dick Gore) proposed a Budget with the following considerations: There are no raises for Staff, other than for the Assistant Rector to meet the Diocesan Minimum Clergy Compensation Package.

The 2019 Clergy Compensation Guidelines for the Diocese of Central Florida show the rector's compensation is \$20,000 under what the Diocese recommends.

A Sabbatical for the Rector: According to the Sabbatical Policy from the Diocese and the Rector's Letter of Agreement, Tom Rutherford asks for a 3-month Sabbatical for May-July of 2019 to study, read, visit the Holy Land, and visit several churches our size and one-size larger to learn some tricks for being a more effective leader for the parish, the vestry, and staff.

Tom asks us to **bump Children's Minister Angela Lopez's position** from ½ time to ¾ time, with a corresponding increase in compensation. We do not have to provide medical insurance for Angela, as she receives that through her husband's employment.

Youth Minister Janie Walton no longer needs medical insurance, as her husband's employment provides that, thus saving the parish \$18,504 next year, which will more than cover increasing the Children's Ministry position from ½ to ¾ time.

Vestry Meeting Minutes continued.....

The Diocese now requires we pay them 12% of our Plate & Pledge Income, instead of 10%, due to General Convention's changing the Canons to require Dioceses to increase what they pay The Episcopal Church.

If our income doesn't increase to erase our deficit by the end of this year, our savings will cover it. But if income doesn't increase by mid-2019, we will need to downsize or reconfigure our staff. Tom will say more about this at the meeting.

Vestry ADOPTED the Proposed Budget with one alteration: They gave the Rector a \$10,000 raise.

MEETING MINUTES & FINANCIAL REPORT: Minutes from the November meeting: APPROVED.

November Financial Report from Treasurer Rodger Watson: APPROVED.

Operating Account: November's income was \$5,352.71 LESS than expenses, INCREASING our year-todate deficit to \$86,012.43. PLEASE PRAY FOR GOD TO PROVIDE.

Building Fund: Net Building Fund income (gifts, fundraising, and facility rental income, less expenses) was \$3,340 LESS that what we needed to cover the mortgage of \$12,891.97. That deficit was covered by our Contingency







This month I read two books: the next one in The Chronicles of Narnia by C.S. Lewis-Prince Caspian, and a book that I received as a thank you from the International Fellowship of Christians and Jews-Keys to Israel by Rabbi Yechiel Eckstein, founder and CEO of the fellowship, which both feeds needy Jews throughout the world and arranges transportation for others to Israel, giving them seed money of \$1,000.00 once they're there. And more than this, he explains how he has been building bridges of understanding between Christians and Jews.

In <u>Prince Caspian</u> the royalty of the golden age of Narnia return there: High King Peter, Queen Susan, King Edmund, and Queen Lucy, called there by Queen Susan's horn, providentially left behind when they returned to their own world.

They come to the aid of the true heir to the Narnia throne to help him defeat his evil uncle, who has tried to obliterate all memory of the "Old Narnia," when animals talked and High King Peter and his siblings reigned, and where a Lion called Aslan was supreme ruler.

Predictably, it is a very exciting and inspiring book, as the evil powers are made painfully aware that the old "legends" were actually true! The Rabbi's book, <u>Keys to Israel</u>, is also very interesting, instructive, and inspiring, as the rabbi explains Israel's history and theology (which is understandably very like our own), and ties all that to modern efforts to help Israel return to her homeland as prophecy predicts. He also gives life application lessons to be derived from Scripture and from Israel's trials and tribulations.
