Sabbatical????

In May, June, and July of this year, I'm going on Sabbatical.

A Sabbatical – taken from the word "Sabbath" – is NOT a "vacation;" it's structured time off for a leader to pray, listen, think, read, and learn new things to return to work refreshed, renewed, and reloaded for a new season of ministry.

In our diocese, when a parish calls a rector, they build into the Letter of Agreement a sabbatical for every 7 years of the rector's term. At each of those points in my time here, however, our parish family was in a building program, staff transition, or big project that my being away would not have been healthy... so in my 22 years here, I've never taken a sabbatical

This year, I am!

And the plan is for EVERYONE to benefit:

I win: I get three months to pray, listen to God, learn some new priest tricks, deepen my faith, hope, and love, and let God retool and re-equip me to come back as a refreshed and better Rector. SEE BELOW FOR THE DETAILS of what I'm doing in that time.

Mother Tracy wins: She gets to practice being a rector for 3 months, with the safety net of my returning in August.

Father Sonér Alexandre and Deacon Richard Gonzalez win: In my absence, they'll have more opportunities to serve, celebrate, preach, and grow – Sonér with his English, and Richard as a priest when he's ordained sometime this year.

You win! You get to hear from some other folks and experience other styles of leadership, that I trust will help you grow in faith, hope, and love.

Here are the details (so far) of my time away:

June 24-July 13 – Debbie and I are going to Jerusalem for the "Palestine of Jesus" pilgrimage with St George's Anglican College. St George's has been there for over a century and has developed trusted friendly relations with both the Palestinian and Israeli communities, which gives their students access to both sides of the story in that conflicted region. And since it's a college catering to clergy, their pilgrimages delve deeper into the theological, historical, and academic layers of the Holy Land than what interests most regular tourists, but which is EXACTLY what we historical and theological geeks LOVE!

I anticipate coming home a more knowledgeable teacher and preacher as a result of visiting all those places we hear about in the Gospel lessons. Before and after the pilgrimage, my plan is to visit a bunch of churches that are one size above us, to learn from their leadership how to be a better and more effective leader for you and our parish family. I'm especially looking to learn two things:

- How we can enhance giving, so we don't spend most of the year in a financial deficit;
- and how to develop and nurture staff, now that we've grown to need a team of staffers, instead of being an allvolunteer congregation.

Sprinkled around in among my trips, I have a stack of books I want to read to deepen my knowledge and understanding of God, the Bible, the Church, and history, to make me a wiser resource for you as a pastor, preacher, and teacher.

And through it all, I'm going to pray and listen to God for his direction for the Messiah family and my part in that for the next several years to come.

In the meantime, I'm looking forward to a glorious Epiphany, Lent and Easter with you, and then picking up again in August.

Facility: The Rental Report was emailed separately. Facilities Minister Amy Paredes' report is in the Annual Report.

Children of the Messiah Preschool: The financial report was emailed separately.

Children's Ministry: Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports: In late December some of the SHINE girls and I had a pajama party and watched the movie "Elliot the littlest Reindeer." It was about reaching for your dreams not matter how big they seem or how small you are. We had a takeout lunch from Chili's that we enjoyed picnic style. Then we had a Christmas song sing along.

Our Christmas Eve program went quite well this year. Thank you to Laura Cook for being our narrator and to Jeremy & G Adams and Joel Lopez for playing the music. It was a fun

change to have the kids select their costumes as they arrived, this allowed for many more to participate as well as allowing the more reserved children a chance to be on stage and not have to speak. Please see pictures on the SHINE pages of the Messenger.

We had a small New Year's Eve Eve party at SHINE on Dec 30. We had cookies and milk, played name that tune—the Christmas version.

In Children's Church we are looking at the Parables Jesus taught. Our series title is SAY WHAAATTT? We are looking at how some of the things Jesus said can really make you say "Say WHAAAT??!?" and scratch your head. We are learning to store up our treasures in heaven, and I sent home tiny tithe jars for the kids to collect their coins in during the week. We are collecting them for 6 weeks and will share the total when we finish. So far the kids have been excited to return the jars full each week.

The SHINE kids are enjoying our Bible Cookies lesson series in which we learn something biblical from a different cookie each week. We learned from our mega stuffed Oreo cookies that Jesus is like a great pearl, a wonderful treasure. From animal crackers we learned that God, like the father in the story of the prodigal son, gives second chances. We looked for pig shaped cookies after hearing how the son was so hungry, he wanted to eat pig slop.

I have recently taken over as staff liaison for the preschool and am excited to attend the first School Advisory Committee meeting and see how I can be of assistance to them. I am hoping to grow a deeper relationship with the families of the preschoolers and get more of them involved in our activities here. I am currently planning to purchase a large rug for the youth hall.

We (preschool staff and I) would like to remove the sound panels from the room as they are heavy and feel they are a safety hazard since they are not secured to the walls, as well as they are not making a noticeable difference in the sound.

All of my events for 2019 have been scheduled and I will hopefully squeeze in a few extra off campus activities as time allows.

I attended the Olympia High School Holiday Concert on Thursday, December 13, as well as, the West Orange High School Choir Concert on Friday, December 14, which was at First United Methodist Church of Orlando. On Tuesday, December 18, I attended the Apopka High School Choir Concert.

Activate had a great turnout for our Christmas Dinner at Servando's Restaurant on Thursday, December 20. Activate student, Delilah Brueggeman, won the "Most Festively Dressed" contest for the evening. I attended New Life Destiny Church on Sunday, December 23, with Children's Minister, Angela Lopez, to see the Ocoee High School indoor drumline perform at that church's Christmas celebration.

We did not have Activate on December 23. We had a fun Sunday on December 30 and played games with Shine Kids' Club members. I had a few fun outings with Activate students and alumni during the 12 Days of Christmas. We saw Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse, Aquaman and had some yummy food too!

A few of our Activate students helped out at the Bingo Fundraiser on Saturday, January 5.

Activate is officially back to our *Through the Bible* series as of January 6 with the Book of Exodus. We also kicked off the first Sunday of 2019 with some praise and worship thanks to Garine Adams, Murph Borno and Joél Lopez!

There will be no Activate on Sunday, January 27. I have encouraged our students to attend the Annual Parish Meeting instead.



We'll meet in the youth hall from 6-7:30 pm and have a simple meal followed by lessons and activities.





This month I only got one book actually read: <u>The Voyage of the Dawn Trader</u> from <u>The Chronicles of Narnia</u> by C. S. Lewis.

It is not my favorite of the Narnia books, but it does have some powerful theology, introduced through a new character—Eustace Scrubb, the cousin of the Pevensie children (Peter, Susan, Edmund and Lucy). He is a snob who rejects the notion that Narnia or Aslan even exist, until he is drawn into Narnia with his four cousins via a picture of a Narnian ship, which turns out to be King Caspian's ship, the Dawn Trader, on which he is exploring the eastern area of Narnia.

Eustace tries everyone's patience with his outrageous behavior until he has a very unpleasant experience on one of the islands of Narnia. While exploring on his own, he discovers a dead dragon. Then he discovers the dragon's cave, which is filled with treasures. His dragon nature kicks in, and he actually turns into a dragon! Too late he realizes his mistake. However, the Lion Aslan shows up to help him. (Lucky for him, his unbelief did not change reality!) He needs to go into the pool that's there in

order to become clean, but first he must shed his dragon exterior.

He tries several times, and although removing it himself doesn't hurt, the dragon exterior keeps returning. Then Aslan offers to remove it, and he agrees. Aslan has to dig deeply, and it hurts, but he does remove the dragon exterior. Then Eustace dips in the pool, which also hurts initially, but thoroughly cleanses him. After that, though he had occasional relapses, Eustace became a much nicer boy.

I wanted to read something about love for February, and found *Choose Love* by Stormie Omartian. However, I discovered too late that I had bought the prayer and study guide instead of the book.

However, I hope to put a copy of each in the library, because I know Stormie is a good author. So I unhesitatingly recommend it, even though I haven't read it yet. The subtitle is "The 3 Simple Choices That Will Alter the Course of Your Life." The 3 simple choices are:

- 1) Choose to receive God's love for you;
- 2) Choose to express your love to God; and

3) Choose to love others in a way that pleases God.

Finally, I thoroughly recommend the book I reviewed for May: <u>All</u> <u>Because of Love</u>, a book of meditations on the Gospel of John by Diana Carey Salcone.
