Guess What: We're Pregnant!

No, not Debbie and me!

Our parish family!

We're birthing an exciting new ministry.

On Sunday April 7 at 3pm in the Church, Father Sonér Alexandre and an enthusiastic team of Haitian folks are launching a weekly worship service in French and Creole.

Here's how this came about.

From the time I first invited Father Sonér and his family to come among us, I've hoped, prayed, and trusted that God brought the Alexandres to us to expand our reach into the community.

Sonér agrees!

So for several months now, he's been floating the possibility of an Episcopal service with folks in the Haitian community... and a dozen or so folks are ready to start.

It's a natural, because the Episcopal Church of Haiti is a diocese of the United States Episcopal Church. There are a bunch of Haitian Episcopalians in the Orlando area who would love to worship in an Episcopal Church, but who attend Catholic, Protestant, or Pentecostal Churches with French services, because no Episcopal Church offers worship in the language of their heart... until now!

Here's the plan:

We'll celebrate Holy Eucharist at 3pm in the Church with Father Sonér leading and preaching.

We invite all the folks who come to the service to stay afterward for Christian Formation: either in French with Father Sonér or another Haitian leader, or in English with me in Diving Deeper.

And we're inviting the children and youth to plug into SHINE and ACTIVATE, because, since they all go to school in English, they're more comfortable in that language than some of the adults.

We also invite them to stay for the Sunday Supper to give our new and longtime members opportunities to get to know and love one another.

Whether you speak French or not, please pitch in and help this get off the ground.

Please pray for Father Sonér and the folks launching and leading the service.

Please pray for the Lord to raise up singers and musicians, as he's done for our other worship services.

Please pray for the word to get out to everyone the Messiah would like to bring into our parish family.

And if you know anyone who's Haitian, please invite them.

Wednesday, March 6, and lasts 40 days (not counting Sundays) and ends on Easter morning April 21. Lent is a time of deliberate "self-examination and repentance; prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and reading and meditating on God's holy Word" (*Book of Common Prayer*, p. 265).

During this "tithe" of the year, we invite God to intervene in our lives, to adjust our relationships and actions, and to make us more pleasing to himself.

Many Christians do this by adopting a "Lenten Discipline," which may be "giving up something for Lent" or "committing to doing something extra" in order to draw closer to God.

MARCH 6-ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICES

at Noon and 7pm. Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent and a day to remember our own mortality. The service includes a Litany (a long prayer) of Penitence and the "imposition of ashes," a smudge of ashes on the forehead or in the palm of the hand to remind us that "We are dust, and to dust we shall return." It is a service of great solemnity and silence, and ends with Holy Communion.

LENTEN CUSTOMS FOR WORSHIP

Lent is also a time when we change or tone down several aspects of our worship together.

The Great Litany. On the First Sunday in Lent, we will begin the service with the Great Litany, a long prayer said responsively between the leader and congregation. It is the oldest liturgy in the English language -- written in 1544, five years before the first Book of Common Prayer! It served as the Prayers of the People during Eucharist for several years and is prescribed to be used in Morning Prayer on Wednesdays and Fridays in the British *Book of Common Prayer*. In the United States, it is a tradition to use it on the first Sundays in Advent and Lent and other penitential occasions.

Penitential Order. We will begin the Sunday services with the Penitential Order, a short service of confession. There are several options within the Penitential Order, and we will use them all during Lent.

"Alleluia." During Lent we don't sing hymns with "alleluias" and omit the "Alleluia" when we break the bread.

Hymns. We tone down the music to reflect the penitential mood of the season. The somber music for six weeks will make the Easter joy even more joyful.

The Altar area will be bare and simpler. We won't have flowers or extra candles. We substitute wooden utensils for the silver and brass. This six-week barrenness will make the Easter flowers and silver and brass even more shining in their glory.

We avoid weddings and baptisms in Lent, as those are joyous occasions.

Private Confession. Many Episcopalians go to a priest for private confession. To do that, please call Father Tom Rutherford at the office to arrange a time.

EXCEPTION. If we have a funeral in Lent, it becomes Easter for that day, because the Burial service is a celebration of resurrection. For that service, we will bring out all the silver and decorations and sing and shout "Alleluia!"

Through the Valley of the Shadow of Death

Spring Session:

March 3rd—April 7, 2019

What is this program about?

“Through the Valley of the Shadow of Death” bereavement program is a Christ –centered format to provide small groups conversations about life, death, grief, hope, and moving forward. This program is under the leadership of Julie Altenbach.

Why is this program important?

This small group setting of 6 or 7 participants provides a safe environment of trust by:

- Sharing stories of loved ones
- Listening to our feelings, thoughts, actions, and beliefs

- Bonding with and supporting each other through the journey



Who is this for?

This program is for people who have suffered the death of a loved one in the recent past (3 or 4 months ago), or as long as 25 or 30 years.

When and Where

TVSD is held two times per year, in the fall and during Lent. The next session will begin **March 3, 2019**. The sessions are held 1 hour per week for six weeks. We meet on Sundays at 11:00 A.M. in the church library.

Facility: The Rental Report was emailed separately.

Children of the Messiah Preschool: The financial report was emailed separately.

Children's Ministry: Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports:

I purchased the basic and most necessary supplies needed for VBS from Concordia supply and was able to use a \$100 off and FREE shipping coupon. They should be arriving any time now. I have a leader and assistant for all the rotations as well as most of the mission specialists secured. We have our first meeting scheduled for late March. I will begin registration the week before Easter. Deacon Julie and I attended a workshop on Jan 18 where we got to see the experiments, crafts, snacks and music up close. We got several ideas. Julie is my co-director this year and we are having a great time tweaking and adding special de-

tails to the program.

The rug for the youth hall arrived this week. Patty Tate and Brian Seguin made some excellent suggestion to further assist with the sound dampening. I will discuss them with Barbara Ellerbe and see how she feels before researching any further.

On January 21, I hosted Moana Cooking Camp. We had a full house of 10 kids (that is all I can allow in the kitchen at once). We prepared some yummy meals and shared them with Clergy and staff that were in the office.

On January 22, my husband and I donated the supplies and built a new much safer ramp to the children's ministry storage shed. We also donated a hand cart and straps to make transporting the commercial bounce house easier.

Little Lesson in Lent sign-ups are posted, and my portion of the website is updated. All the supplies and lessons are ready and most of the meals have been donated so far. Looking forward to an exciting time on Wednesday nights. Little Lessons in Lent was my first official project when I joined staff 5 years ago and it is one of my most favorite projects to plan.

Children's Church has completed another HIGH VOLTAGE series and will move on to Transformers before we focus on season of faith lessons. We will go over season of the church year, Christian symbols and make a few crafts.

One of the SHINE kids earned an at-school lunch date with me, so on Feb 19 I am taking Chick-fil-A to Kaitlyn O'Brien at Ocoee Elementary school. Kaitlyn has started playing basketball for the city of Ocoee, and I attended one of her games on Feb 2. They won their second game in a row

Youth Ministry: Youth Minister Janie Walton reports:

I attended the Orlando Magic Game on Friday, January 25 at Amway Center to see Activate students, Cydney Babione and Samantha Hsu, perform with their orchestra from Olympia High School.

I attended the *Say Yes to Jesus Revival* with Presiding Bishop Michael Curry on Friday, February 1 at First Baptist Church of Orlando along with a bunch of church parishioners.

I attended the Vestry Retreat on Friday, February 8.

Activate had our Valentine's Dance Fundraiser on February 9. God blessed us with \$618 for our summer mission trip to North Dakota. Activate provided Sunday Supper on February 10.

Activate along with parents, adult volunteers and myself are attending the LIFT Tour on Friday, February 15 and Saturday, February 16 at First Baptist Church of Orlando. This is one of the most popular yearly events for our Activate youth.

Some of our youth are participating in the Absalom Jones' Celebration at All Saints Church in Winter Park on Saturday, February 23.

We are hosting the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper on Tuesday, March 5. This is also fundraiser for our summer mission trip.

Beginning Sundays in Lent, I will be doing a trial run of Middle School Church, which will run the same time and at the same services as Children's Church. If it is well received, I will continue the program. There will also be a Wednesday night program—Activate 2.0—which will run simultaneously with other program offer-

ings on Wednesdays in Lent. Children's Ministry's Little Lessons in Lent and Activate 2.0 will first start with dinner together at 6 PM and then split into our separate groups after.

On Saturday, March 16, we are having our third Bingo Fundraiser—St. Patrick's Day themed—to benefit Children's Ministry and Activate's summer mission trip.

Messiah Academy: Principal Terri Wetherington reports that Messiah Academy is closing at the end of May. We started this academic year with 3 students, lost one at Christmastime, and have another going to another school next year. We have not been able to attract enough students to be viable. All the Messiah Academy property and equipment belongs to the Church and will be distributed to any ministries that need it. The rest will be sold to parishioners or at the next Rummage Sale. The storage building will be used for ministry equipment and items so that the original storage building can be used for tools and property maintenance items. Tom Rutherford will consult with Vestry and Staff to determine how to utilize the Messiah Academy space after it closes.

Assistant Rector Tracy Dugger reports:

Young Adults:

We had a fabulous time at Trivia Tuesday this month, even though we didn't win.

My Parents' Group met on the 25th. I hosted a small Epiphany blessing service at the church and taught others how to do this at their home on the 13th.

Website and Communications: After the planning meeting, I scheduled all of the events onto the website calendar and created promotion and graphics for the next quarter to post to Facebook and the website on a regular schedule. Events will be published on Facebook roughly one month prior to the event

(if I know about it and/or it was discussed at the planning meeting). Thank you to all who came and participated. It is much more feasible and efficient for me to manage the website and Facebook in batches and allow it to publish at scheduled times. Craig Brown has been taking facility photos to improve our visibility as a rental venue on Google. Next month I will be using these photos and additional programming and backtagging to increase our visibility as a rental facility.

Facebook: Specific to our Facebook. Facebook has rolled out new business page management tools which allow us to advertise to people in Winter Garden, people who like our page, OR an audience with likes we program within a geographic radius. These ads can cost anywhere between \$5 and \$50 depending on target audience size and numbers of days run. If you would like to run an ad on Facebook similar to the old school of running an ad in the newspaper for your ministry event, please let me, Tracy Dugger know. Currently I have run ads for the past year as "experiments" out of my discretionary fund. I ran ads for Easter, Christmas, and several of our art events and other public events. As a result our page reach last year DOUBLED. We reached 5,700 people with our Facebook page in the past year and 1,800 people in the last 90 days alone! In light of these results I would propose we as a church look at included FB advertising as a budget line in future years, and/or have various ministries use some of their budget line to promote events. We have to date never used the ticketing feature which is why I crossed that off, but that remains a function we could explore in the future.

And as a pastoral note: Thank you all for the vacation time and Sunday off. Even with my time off I averaged 47 hours a week in the past month be-

tween visiting, preaching, teaching and diocesan obligations.
Laura Cook's Parish Discernment Committee is meeting and on track.

DISCUSSION (to help make a decision next month):

How we make decisions:

We discuss an issue one month and, after a month of prayer, thinking, consideration, discussing the issue with parishioners; we make a decision the next month.

Every rare once-in-a-while, an issue will arise that needs immediate attention, or we'll have a decision to make that we all agree on anyway, and we'll make a decision in the meeting the issue is introduced. An example: When the Preschool asks if they can put out envelopes for donations on Preschool Sunday, we say "Yes" to that every year, so we'll decide on that when we're first asked.

The floor covering in the Parish Hall kitchen has a rotten spot that is usually covered by a water and dirt catching rug. But when the rug is out, the rotten spot is painfully obvious. Ron Bouton will get estimates for what it costs to repair/replace it and report back.

DECISIONS (based on the Discussion last month):

Rector's Sabbatical: Doreen Stachowski is leading a team working on raising funds to help pay for Tom's travel expenses. Don Greer asked the Vestry for permission to invite parishioners to give to that fund. Vestry APPROVED.

The Parochial Report lists our parish demographics, attendance, financial details, and the names of our Clergy. The Vestry is required to approve it and send it to the Diocese and national office of the Episcopal Church in March of every year. It was all good news! Our Average Sunday Attendance (ASA) in 2018 was 301.

Only 3% of Episcopal Churches in the U.S. have an ASA of 300 or more. Our total income (Operating Fund, Building Fund, investment income, and all designated gifts) was over \$1.5 million and was \$4,400 MORE than our total expenses. We are NOT a "small church," and we are NOT "broke!" Vestry APPROVED the Report.

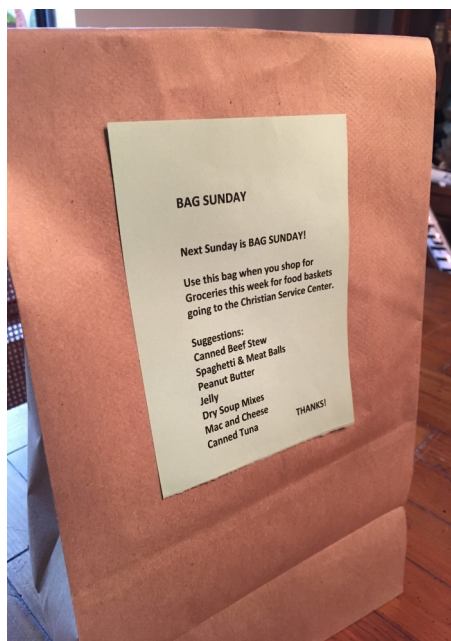

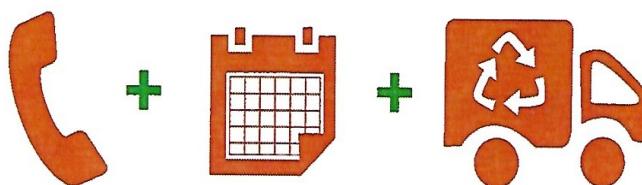

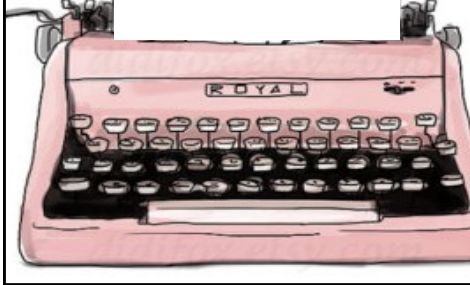

**Book Review

This month I completed the sixth of The Chronicles of Narnia: The Silver Chair, and Choose Love by Stormie Omartian. Both, predictably, lived up to my expectations.

The Silver Chair features new heroes, though we met one of them—Eustace Scrubb—in the previous story, The Voyage of the Dawn Trader. In The Silver Chair he takes a friend from school with him, Jill Pole, who manages to screw up most of what she was supposed to do, forgetting three of the four signs Aslan gave her to find and identify the young Prince Rilian, son of the now extremely old King Caspian. (The prince has disappeared for years, assumed to be a prisoner of a sorceress who murdered his mother; and he was.) In Aslan's grace, Jill's remembering the fourth sign bails them out, as does the presence of a Marshwiggle named Puddleglum. Puddleglum is always seeing the cloud in the silver lining, which becomes pretty comical; but he comes through for the children in

the end. And the prince avenges his mother's murder.

Next month I'll complete the Chronicles by reading The Last Battle, and then I'll put the full set in the Library.

Choose Love was also inspiring, having been inspired by the Holy Spirit's taking Stormie deeper in her understanding of 1 Corinthians 13. I think the book and the accompanying study book would be a marvelous adventure for Lent, and having finished the book itself, I myself plan to do the study guide during Lent. There are 84 short devotionals, each of which begins with convicting scripture, proceeds to confession, and end with absolution. There are also suggested hymns after that, but I so far have-

n't recognized the vast majority of them. But I can highly recommend the book, even though I haven't finished it, either.
