New Faces in Old Places

There are some different faces in the parish office.

Faithful 8 o'clock worshiper Elaina Paige is our new part-time Financial Minister. She works 2 days a week taking care of all our money stuff.

Deacon Extraordinaire Julie Altenbach is our new fulltime Office Minister. Her job is multi-faceted:

Recruiting, orienting, and overseeing 20-30 volunteer Office Angels to be the voice and face of Jesus to everyone who calls or comes onto our campus. They will answer phones, fold and stuff publications, water plants, and contact each parishioner monthly to see how they are and take prayer requests.

Orienting and overseeing 5-10 volunteer Tech Teamers to keep our website and social media current, keep up with our Servant Keeper membership software, and keep computers running smoothly.

Producing all our parish publications, like Sunday bulletins and the *Messenger*.

Assistant Music Minister Jeremy Adams is also now our Facilities Minister. He keeps the schedule of everything that happens on our campus, supervises our Maintenance Ministers who keep our campus clean, and markets and rents our facility to earn income to help pay the mortgage.

You may wonder why each of those roles is a "minister."

It's because no staff position in the Messiah family is "just a job." It is, indeed, a ministry.

If we don't deposit our Sunday offerings or pay our bills, life grinds to a halt as the electricity, air-conditioning, and water are turned off.

When people call the office, if they get a disembodied voice asking them to "Dial 1 for a human being," they may not stay on the line or call back. If they visit the office and encounter an empty desk, receive a grumpy greeting, or are made to feel like an interruption, they may not stay or come back. In any of those scenarios, we miss the chance to love them.

And if the facility is dirty or cluttered, with burnt out lights, nobody's going to want to come here to church. If two groups show up in the same room at the same time, there will be hurt feelings and missed opportunities. And when we don't rent our facility during the times we're not using it, we have difficulty paying the mortgage.

The Financial, Office, and Facilities Ministers are each a vital cog in the machine that is the Messiah family: helping us love God, our neighbors, and each other better than we can without them.



All three are also results of the study, prayer, and research I did while on Sabbatical that brought me home with a commitment to team-based ministry. That means I want every Vestry member, every clergy person, and especially every staff member to develop a team to do their ministry – to "equip the saints for works of ministry" (Ephesians 4:12) rather than doing those works alone.

My role is to coach, mentor, and nourish our Vestry, clergy, and staff as a team – to equip them to equip others – instead of doing so much of the ministry myself.

I knew there was no way one person could accurately manage our money AND develop a team of volunteer Office Angels, so I split the Parish Administrator job into two unequal parts.

I invited Parish Administrator LaVerne Woods to be our Financial Minister — asking her to stay on as Administrator through August and offering to pay her her fulltime compensation through September, even as she dropped to 2 days a week as Financial Minister, to have her on call to answer questions about office stuff.

She declined my offer and resigned immediately. We are paying her for the vacation time she accrued this year and carrying her medical insurance through September 30.

A team of Office Angels came to our rescue – thank you, Ken Anders, Aliena Gaye, Sue Riley, Mary Pounds, Karen Stewart, Wally Stewart, Esther Gonzalez, and Trudie Carr!

Elaina jumped in and is figuring out how to manage our money.

And Julie's been in the office with Mother Tracy teaching her how our membership software and website work and handing off those duties on her way out of town.

It's a significant transition, and there have been some bumps in the road, but I anticipate these three new ministers will help us take our next step in changing the world with Jesus: one financial decision, one phone call, one social media contact, one rental event at a time.



What We Do

- We write letters, cards, and notes to Florida Department of Corrections inmates from all over the state, making sure to include their inmate numbers on the outer envelopes and ALL correspondence. (Inmates will be assigned by the ministry coordinator.) It does not matter how much or how little we write. For many inmates, our correspondence is their only contact with the outside world.
- We keep our identities anonymous by using a made-up first name. (No last names.)
- We remember the inmates on their birthdays, Christmas, and Easter by sending them greeting cards.
- If we feel moved to do so, we have Christian books sent to the inmates from retailers. We are prohibited from sending books directly to prisoners.
- For those of us who are artistically gifted, we may share drawings with inmates who also like to sketch.
- We encourage the inmates in their spiritual growth and continually remind them that we are delighted to be their friend in Christ.

What We Don't Do

- We never reveal our true identities, nor do we mention Church of the Messiah in our correspondence.
- We do not refer to ourselves as "pen pals" as this is prohibited by the Department of Corrections.
- We never telephone the inmates, visit them in person, or send them money.


Our marriage has been strengthened by our life in the church, and we want to both continue that strengthening and give that gift to others as well.

Staff Reports:

Facility: Tom Rutherford is closing in on filling the Facilities Minister position and hiring a new Maintenance Minister to succeed Will Dugger when he leaves in September.

Children of the Messiah Preschool opened August 12 and went well! The financial report was emailed separately.

Children's Ministry: Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports:

With summer coming to an end we finished up our Children's Church series and moved onto a unit on prayer. We have a prayer wall in class where we have been taking a moment or two to pray and some of the children are taping their prayers to the well. We have talked about praying anywhere, not needing fancy words to pray and how to pray boldly. The kids have been praying for their school and teachers as well. I am preparing the next series which is called "I know it's crazy but it's true". We will go over 6 of the most amazing Bible stories ever told.

In SHINE we finished up Alien kids and moved onto a series called Stepping out in faith, a children's guide to Episcopal beliefs and traditions. It will take us a while to get through this unit as there are many schedule interruptions in August and September. So far, we have learned about sacraments in general and spent 2 weeks on Baptism and the Baptismal Covenant. We have had a lot of fun using the BCP as well. In case anyone is looking for them, I have 7 copies in the youth room that I borrowed from the library for this series.

We have started Garine Adams and her band for worship time at the beginning of SHINE. We are testing it for a few weeks to see how it works with some of the kids coming and going to the French service for communion. And of course to see how the kids are responding to this change in programing. 4th and 5th grade boys are hard to please, and when they are not into something, the rest of the crowd tends to follow.

We had our back to school party and back-pack blessing on August 3. We gave out 30 back-packs, and hundreds of dollars' worth of school supplies to kids in the community. There was a bounce house, free lunch and ice cream as well as games and music. Dillard Street Elementary advertised our event and we had a few families from there visit. The rest read it on our marquee or from church members.

In Late July I met with the new principal and the Partners In Education coordinator of Dillard Street to see how we could better serve them. We have a quite a few things planned for the year. On the Friday before

- school started the outreach team treated the teachers and stuff to lunch and snacks after their training session.
- In September, Garine Adams and I are going to set up an information table at the School for the Arts Open House to publicize the children's activities we offer here and spend time getting to know some of the families there. We will have an instrument petting zoo, a game, and plenty of church literature.
- Plans for the Ministry fair and winter are in the works.
- VBS 2020: Rather than buying a curriculum, I am writing one myself. I am dedicating one day a week toward that objective, because it is a huge project to create everything.
- Youth Ministry: Youth Minister Janie Walton resigned on August 12. She will cover Sunday ACTIVATEs for the rest of this month and use up her vacation time during the weeks. Her last day on Staff is August 31. Murph Borno agreed to lead ACTIVATE Youth Group as a volunteer for a season. Since there are only 5 teens who come regularly, Tom Rutherford does not intend to hire anyone for that position for the rest of this year, and maybe longer. Tom offered Janie a Going Away Party, but she declined. Please personally express your appreciation to her for her 8 years as Youth Minister.

Assistant Rector Tracy Dugger

- Tracy concludes her active ministry among us August 31. She has vacation time she's taking in September as she moves to Port St Lucie and starts there October 1.
- Tom Rutherford is not going to seek to replace her. Instead he will work with priests Soner Alexandre, Richard Gonzalez, and Greer McBryde to cover our sacramental needs and with Deacon Julie Altenbach and soon-to-bedeacon Sam Katulic to cover pastoral needs. This will save our parish \$7,961 per month in salary, (continued on next page)

The rental house, in which the Alexandres live has roof problems.

Parish Staff reconfiguration:

FROM TOM RUTHERFORD: One of the results of my Sabbatical study was the realization that our parish ministries need to be more Team based — starting with my developing the Vestry, Clergy, and Staff as teams, and then my helping each Vestry, Clergy, and Staff person to develop a team in

their area of ministry.

With that Team-Based approach in mind, I want to reconfigure the Staff — splitting the Parish Administrator position into two parts: A part-time Financial Minister who will concentrate on our money matters and a full-time Office Minister who will develop a Team of volunteers to staff our office and do a lot of the stuff the Parish Administrator is now doing by herself.

The Financial Minister will work 2 days a week: Monday to deal with Sunday's income and another day to pay bills and chase down good deals for the parish family. His/her Team will be Volunteers to count the Sunday collection, the Treasurer, and Audit Team.

The Office Minister will work 5 days a week, but his/her primary role is to develop a Team of 30-50 Volunteers to "do the works of ministry:" answering the phone, making copies, interacting with visitors, checking in on parishioners by phone and email, locking and unlocking doors, watering plants, turning lights on and off, etc. — many things the current Parish Administrator does alone, plus more that can happen with a Team.

A Team of folks in the office will also help pick up some of the tasks Tracy did with the website and other technical stuff, and offer extra eyes, ears, hands, and voices to care for our people in her absence.

These two new positions would cost more than we pay the Parish Administrator, but if we take the Youth Minister's compensation we are no longer paying, and combine it with the current Administrator's compensation, we can fund the two new positions and still have \$17,152 per year leftover. If it turns out we need a staff Youth Minister, we can use that \$17,000 to hire a part time person.

I don't need Vestry approval to reorganize the Staff, but I want your thoughts about this plan.

I do, however, need approval to alter the Budget.

VESTRY APPROVED Tom's proposal.

Tom will offer Parish Administrator LaVerne Woods the Financial Minister position. If she accepts his offer, she will stay Administrator through the rest of this her job will shrink to 2 day per week September 1, but we will pay her her full Administrator's salary and carry her medical insurance through the month of September to have her on call to answer questions from the Office Minister. She has some vacation time left this year, and we will also give her that time at the rate she's paid as Administrator. Her pay would drop October 1, and we would pay her the same daily rate she makes now, but for 2 day a week instead of 5.

If she declines the offer, we will have a party to celebrate her 24 years as Parish Administrator and wish her well.

July Financial Report from Treasurer Rodger Watson: APPROVED.

Operating Account: Income was \$3,199.58 LESS than expenses and increased our year-to-date deficit to \$50,241.14. PLEASE continue praying for God to provide.

Building Fund: Net Building Fund income (gifts, fundraising, and facility rental income, less expenses) was \$1,784.09 MORE than what we needed to cover the mortgage of \$12,891.97 – primarily because we didn't have a Facilities Minister to pay from the Rental Income...which will change starting next month when we again have a Facilities Minister. We did not pre-pay any of the principal on the mortgage, for which we owe \$1.4 million.

Meeting closed with prayer and adjourned at 4:10 pm
