The Messiah Wants YOU to be a missionary!

Every year when our people come back from the Summer Mission Project and tell us about their adventures, a bunch of us think, "That's so cool! I'd like to do that sometime."

But then the next thought pushes out the first: "I can't do that. I'm too old/young/busy" or "I don't have time/talent/anything to offer" or "I can't afford it."

Please stick with that FIRST thought!

Because it IS cool! And you SHOULD do that sometime!

And those second thoughts are the enemy whispering in your ear, because he does NOT want you to go, because you might have a great time and change the world with Jesus while you're doing it.

Let's look at the excuses why you think you can't go:

"I'm too young or too old." If you're over 12 years old, you're not too young. And if you can still walk and get around by yourself, you're not too old.

"I'm too busy" or "I don't have time." We all are as busy as we allow ourselves to be, and we all have some flexibility in and authority over our annual calendar. The Mission Project is in July. If you plan now, you probably can carve out the time then. If it's already too late to set that time aside this year, start working now to take the time in 2021. The Messiah family is going to do at least one Mission Project EVERY year, so you can start planning now for then

"I don't have any talent." Yes, you do! If you can pray, if you can cook or clean, if you like children or adults or older people, any of those helps the Team. If you can paint or rake leaves or dig a hole or mow grass or take out trash or carry things, that helps the Team. If you have any particular skills, they are helpful, and if you don't have many skills, we will teach you some.

"I don't have anything to offer." Yes, you do! You have a whole life of experience, which is helpful, because no one else has been through what you have or knows exactly what you know. And offering your time is the most valuable commodity any of us can give.

"I can't afford it." You don't have to! If God calls you to this project, God will provide, because God always pays for what he orders. The Team will do support-raising events together, and I will show you how to contact your family and friends to share with them what you're doing, because many of them will agree to pray for you, and some will throw money at you, because they are so excited at what you're doing.

Even if you CAN afford to pay your own way, I hope you'll still help with the group support raising events and contact your family and friends. Mission Projects are a TEAM effort, and the friendships you build through working together with the other folks on the Team is a major byproduct of every Project, and the people praying for

None of those are valid excuses NOT to go. Here are some reasons TO GO:

You will make friends that will enrich your life now and help you when you have a need in the future.

You will see God move and act and provide and protect in ways you've never experienced, and you will be his partner as he does it

You will change the world with Jesus for every child, every person, and every family you touch in the community you serve.

You will grow in faith, hope, and love and end up farther along spiritually than when you started.

You will learn new skills to help you in all sorts of practical aspects of life.

But the Bottom Line for why you should offer yourself as a living sacrifice this summer is this: Jesus says, "GO!"

Jesus said, "All authority on heaven and earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

He didn't say, "Send teenagers into all the world to make disciples" or "Give money so OTHER PEOPLE can go;" He says "Go" - as in "YOU go into all the world."

The Messiah wants YOU – all of us – to be part of his changing the world, and the summer Mission Project is a great way to do that.

The project this year is July 8-18 in Smyrna, Tennessee with the Wherry Housing Community, where we've served before. The project is to interact with folks in the community to make friends and share the love of God by repairing and renovating homes for low-income families, many of whom are refugees from war-torn countries who escaped oppression and are working to assimilate into a new culture and build a new life. Most are Christians. Many others are curious about Christ, and our giving our time and energy to serve them helps them experience the self-giving love God has for them.

Details? We'll travel in rented vans, stay in a dormitory, and cook and clean for ourselves.

Even if you can go for only part of the project, please talk one of us. We can work it out!

If you can't GO this year, there are two other ways to participate: Praying for the Team, and/or helping finance the trip with your monetary gifts.

But however you choose to participate, please be part of the Team.

We have the most awesome kids. Make sure you tell them that you love them!




Hello All from the Great White North that looks like a Snow-globe!!

INFORMATION:

<u>VESTRY MINISTRY TEAM</u> REPORTS:

Mortgage Refinancing: Don Greer reports the Bank is willing to extend the loan for 6 years instead of only 5 and the interest rate will not exceed the current rate of 4.5%. Don and Tom Rutherford have gathered the information for the application. We anticipate closing in February or March. The Vestry APPROVED moving forward with the mortgage refinancing and thanked Don Greer for his hard work and dedication.

Liability and Fire Insurance: Don Greer is also researching getting our insurance from a company other than Church Insurance Company. We applied to another company in November and are still waiting for their proposal to compare with Church Insurance.

Annual Parish Meeting is January 26 (Sunday) @ 12:15pm with a Potluck Lunch. It's usually at 5pm, but if it were at that time, the French Congregation couldn't attend, so Tom Rutherford moved it to a time when they can. Please be there to help set up and tear down, and distribute and collect ballots (if we need to have an election).

The retiring Vestry (Stacey Beck, Steve Borst, and Don Greer) will count ballots if we have an election.

Our 4 nominees for the 4 open positions are Chris Brown, Joe Eiden, Doreen Stachowski, and Wally Stewart. 9 folks declined to be nominated, including one from the French service. Pictures and bios of each nominee are in the Sunday bulletins this month.

The 2019 Annual Report is available Sunday, January 19, a week before the Annual Meeting. Thank you for getting your ministry team reports in on time.

Vestry Retreat: is Friday night, January 31 from 6:30-9pm (starting with supper) and Saturday morning February 1 from 9am through Lunch. Please mark your calendars is now No others received.

Staff Reports:

Children of the Messiah Preschool: The financial report was emailed separately.

Children's Ministry: Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports:

- A) We finished the year strong with several Christmas parties and activities. The kids had a great time getting to know Paul Daniel who has recently joined our crew as a special events volunteer!
- B) I have been working to get the last few volunteers updated with their Safeguarding God's Children sexual exploitation prevention training and keeping up with all of the additions to Messiah School for the Arts. Our compliance has improved drastically.
- C) We had our first VBS 2020 strategy meeting and ironed out the schedule, music and rotations. I have emailed a few outstanding

on for another VBS. We will begin working on our "Kingdom Kommunication" rotation as soon as I get commitments. We are discovering many more details that need worked out when writing our own VBS materials. It is an exciting challenge.

- D) In SHINE we are working on 1 John and what it means to be a Christian. The kids love finding and highlighting key words in their Bible, so we pick a new word each week. We also have a short video from Phil Vischer.
- E) In Children's Church we are talking about how Jesus is for everyone and finding Jesus in everything. We have a video series in which Disco Dan and ChaCha Charlie teach the Power Memory Verse, and Skittles the rapper teaches the Watt's Up (main point of the day). The kids have loved the characters, and it's wonderful to see them get excited and dance along to the music. I recently had an issue with the video and contacted the publisher to let them know my kids were going to revolt if I didn't get Skittles back for the following week
- F) Dillard Street Elementary has nominated us as Partner of the Year for 2019. I submitted all of our paperwork and we will see what happens, but it is wonderful to be nominated out of all businesses who partner with the school. I will keep everyone updated.
- Office Minister Julie Altenbach reports: This month, with the help of my Office Angels we have:
- A) Created and prepared the bulletins for the Christmas Services and the Flower Bulletin for the poinsettias.
- B)Continued to work with TechSoup, an organization that offers tech at discounted prices for nonprofits. We bought computers, monitors, and software from them at deep discounts... and discovered that their customer service is abysmal, especially when one of the monitors and one of the computers didn't work, and it took 2 months to work out returning them for replacements.
- C) I was honored to be the narrator for the Messiah Preschool Christmas program. This included the rehearsals,

- the dress rehearsal for Brookside Retirement Community and the evening performance.
- D) Helped prep the crafts for the Advent for All Ages Sunday evening programs.
- E) Created a digital commercial slideshow that plays on the TV in the Narthex during the week and on Sundays.
- F) Prepared the Altar Guild and Daughters of the King Manuals.
- G) Called and followed up with technical issues with Carrier about our air conditioning unit.
- H) Greeted and helped the people calling about, or setting up for rentals.
- I) Ordered special bulletins to be used next Christmas at a discounted price.
- J) Worked with Mandy from, Just for Deaf, to make sure the interpreters have what they need for the 7:00 worship, including bulletins ahead of Sunday and their own Book of Common Prayer.
- K) I am getting more comfortable in the weekly tasks, and with the help of so many Office Angels, I am able to do more as Office Minister and Deacon, like meet with both parishioners and others in the community to talk, listen and pray.
- L) Our hospitality table is now the recipient of many donations from lots of people, which makes the treats all the sweeter.
- M) I am working to create a table with information that is both informative and inviting for visitors .
- N) In this New Year, I will continue to investigate and implement ways to make our guest feel welcome and a part of our church family.

Music Minister Linda Ellison Reports:

- A) Members of the Messiah Music Ministry all sang and played with all their hearts and souls for all the various Christmas services, and the Messiah Worship band led music for a crowd of over 3,000 at Light Up Winter Garden. It was a great outreach event.
- B) While I was away following surgery

for a fractured wrist, I did a lot of composing, and read two new books that will be useful for Music Ministry: Training Singers and Extravagant Worship.

C) Now that Christmas is over, the members of Music Ministry are looking forward to learning new repertoire to introduce into our worship services.

Diocesan Convention: is January 24-25 in Winter Haven. Our Lay delegates are Anthony Beckford, Janice Hull, and Dawn Wirbel, with Bradford Fisher going as an Alternate Delegate. All our Clergy, except Father Soner Alexandre (who is licensed to serve in our Diocese, but not Canonically Resident) are delegates.

<u>DISCUSSION</u> (to help make a decision next month):

The Christmas Offering last month was about \$12,300. Vestry determines what we do with those funds and discussed the options, including giving it to an Outreach project, saving it to see if a need arises later this year, helping our seminarian Laura Cook, bonuses for Staff, increasing the Youth Budget, or various repair projects to our facility.

Youth Budget: Volunteer Youth Minister Murph Borno requested we increase the Youth Budget, since we're saving money by not paying a Youth Minister. His request is for 10% of the salary of the paid Youth Minister, which is \$2875. Murph noted various projects and events he has targeted for the coming year, including the annual Mission Trip.

DECISIONS (usually based on the Discussion last month): Diocesan Pledge: We are required by Diocesan Canons to pay to the Diocese a percentage of the Plate & Pledge Income we reported on last year's Parochial Report, which was \$602,810. That percentage is determined annually by the Diocesan Board (the "Vestry" of the Diocese) and, by Canon, cannot

exceed 12%, which would have us owe the Diocese \$72,337 (paid in 12 monthly installments of \$6,028.10). The percentage proposed by the Board this year is a teeny bit less than 12% and will be approved by Diocesan Convention next weekend. VESTRY DECIDED TO PAY WHATEVER DIOCESAN CONVENTION REQUIRES AND NO MORE.

MEETING MINUTES & FINAN-CIAL REPORT :

Minutes from the December meeting: APPROVED

December Financial Report from Treasurer Rodger Watson: Approved.

Operating Account: Income was \$157,245.81 MORE than expenses and turned our \$77,661.85 year-to-date deficit into a \$79,583.96 SUR-PLUS! THANK YOU, JESUS!

2. Building Fund: Net Building Fund income (gifts, fundraising, and facility rental income, less expenses) was \$100,336.94 MORE than what we needed to cover the mortgage of \$12,891.97 and gave us a \$55,140.59 SURPLUS for the year. Thank you, Jesus, AGAIN!

Roger Watson: On behalf of COTM and the Vestry we extend our heartfelt thanks to Roger for his service as Treasurer. Roger has been a blessing to us all of us for many years and we want to extend our appreciation as he retires from this position. We are also grateful that Bob Tate has stepped forward to assume this position.

Meeting adjourned with prayer @ 3:30 pm.
