"Mail-Out" Communion?

Never in my life did I ever imagine I would be a "tele-evangelist:" broadcasting our worship online to the world! Nor would it ever have crossed my mind to offer Communion in single-servings or at a Drive Thru, like McDonald's!

COVID-19 keeps trying to shut us down, but the Messiah stays ahead of the disease by prompting us to find new ways to serve you in his family.

The newest is Mail-Out Communion.

"MAIL-OUT"????? Why would we do something that outlandish?

Because only about half of our folks are attending in-person worship on Sundays, and another quarter are coming to Drive-Thru Communion after watching us online. That leaves 25% of us not getting the sacrament.

I don't want anyone to miss that grace.

On top of the Messiah folks not getting Communion, we have 300-1,000 people watching each of our online services: in English at 9:30am and in French at 4pm.

That's 600-2,000 folks seeing us that we don't see, and they're not just from the Messiah family or the West Orange community. They're checking in from all over the country – and internationally!

They're watching our service and singing and praying along with us, and they'd like to have the bread and wine with us, when we get to that part of the liturgy.

That's what prompted Mail-Out Communion.

Here's how it works:

If you're watching our worship, and tell us how many are in your family or watch-party, and live in the United States (we haven't figured out, yet, how to send bread and wine through the mail internationally!), and contact us by phone (407-656-3218) or email (Office@ChurchOfTheMessiah.com); we'll send you a month's supply of single-serving Communion for you and your family.

And we'll do that every month you contact us and request it.

While you're on the phone or email, please tell us how to pray for you, because we want to serve you that way, too.

Receiving Communion in front of your TV or computer is NOT the same as being here, but it's as close as we can get, given the dynamics of the disease and distance.

So far a couple dozen families are taking us up on the offer, and we're sending communion to several states. I anticipate those numbers will grow as we attract more folks to our online worship, and word gets out that communion is available.

And we're on it! We just got the shipment of our 6th thousand servings of communion, so we're ready to share the sacrament with everyone who's hungry and thirsty for God: in person, at Drive Thru, and now through Mail Out.

I love you all and hope to see you soon!

2020 September Vestry Minutes Sunday * September 27, 2020, * 2:30pm

Present (in person or by ZOOM video conferencing): Rector Tom Rutherford, Senior Warden Mary Kay Predmore, Junior Warden Chris Brown, and Clerk Joyce Taylor; Joe Eiden, Wendy King, John Peacock, Doreen Stachowski, Wally Stewart, Patty Tate, and Dawn Wirbel, and Treasurer Bob Tate.

Absent: Ron Bouton and Brian Seguin

FORMATION: Joe Eiden led Noonday Prayer. Based on 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and our Guidelines for Vestry membership, Tom Rutherford talked about the qualities we're looking for in potential Vestry nominees.

II. INFORMATION:

A. Vestry Ministry Team Reports:

- 1. Outreach Team Doreen Stachowski reports
 - a)Since we may struggle with food donations for the Thanksgiving food baskets, we will give parishioners the opportunity to give gift cards, or give financially to buy gift cards, and let the families shop for their own Thanksgiving meal. This means that 20 families, both inside and outside of the church, will receive at least one \$25 gift card for their meal. Larger families will be given more than one gift card, depending on how many people are in the family. We moved \$400 from the Dillard Street Partners in Education to the Holiday Food Baskets so we can do the same at Christmas this year and will stay within budget. Thanksgiving cards have been purchased and the gift card will be included. If you know anyone that is struggling due to job loss or any other reason, please let Doreen or Angela know and we will add them to the list for Thanksgiving. Parishioners are welcome to donate money or Aldi gift cards for this effort. Doreen will write up a notice for the bulletin/Messenger. Fr. Tom will look into creating a line item so that money could be designated for this cause.
 - b) The Edgewood Children's Ranch are deciding how we can help the children at Christmas. We have budgeted money for a Christmas party and gifts, however, due to Covid19, we will not have a party. We will buy one big gift for all of them, or decide once they have reached back out with suggestions.
 - c) An information and instruction memo will be included in the next Messenger detailing how to participate in Operation Christmas Child this year. You can build-a-box directly on their web site for \$25 including shipping. Thank you, Vita Mazzaluna, for pulling this together.
- 2. **Messiah's Way:** Brian Seguin and Office Minister Julie Altenbach report the online Messiah's Way sign-ups are working!

B. Staff Reports:

- 1. Children of the Messiah Preschool: Director Barbara Ellerbe reports:
 - a) COVID reduced their number of students initially, but some are trickling back. We got 3 new ones this month.
 - b) There was a burglary a month ago. The thief stole and cashed several payroll checks. The Winter Garden Police caught the crook, and Regions Bank repaid the Preschool for the criminally cashed checks.
 - c) The financial report was emailed separately.

2. Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports:

- a) Children's Church: Even with attendance fluctuating, we started a new lesson series called Average Pete. Not only are we leaning a lot about Peter, we are learning a bit about Elvis as an Elvis impersonator introduces us to our weekly Power Verse. The kids think he is crazy! It makes it really fun to repeat the verse several times as we try to sound like Elvis as well. I have been sending Sermon-at-Home sheets or recap notes of the children's lessons to parents via the REMIND app.
- b) The children have all started school using either face to face or virtual model. I have not heard of any illness with our kids even though a few of their schools have had positive cases of Covid.
- c) SHINE: We read a couple books by R.C. Sproul; The Priest with the Dirty Clothes and The Prince's Poison Cup. The books told the story of some children who were chatting with their grandfather who was telling them fantastic stories. In the stories the priest represented us and our dirty sin cover clothes. He got a brand-new white robe from the prince (Jesus) to wear before the King (God). The Prince's Poison Cup was about the prince (Jesus) taking on great suffering and dying to save the people that his father (God) loved. We made an origami cup and talked about all of the sufferings that were in the "cup of suffering" that Jesus took on for us. We will be talking about grandparents of the Bible and learning about praying the Anglican Rosary in the coming weeks.
- <u>d)</u> Future: With the canceling of public Christmas events, and the further postponement of many places opening, I have decided to go with a take home family Christmas project. I am getting the impression that many children will not be returning until they see things in the community returning to normal. So I am putting together a box of 4 weeks of activities, a family workbook and all of the supplies needed to complete the projects. I have started gathering the supplies and will get a few volunteers to help assemble them in November. I will see where things stand in Mid-November and decide if having a party will be possible/wise.
- e) I am participating in a virtual 2 day conference on September 21 and 22 entitled "Rooted," for children, youth and family ministry leaders. There will be opportunities to enter breakout rooms to video chat with others.

3. Facility Minister Jeremy Adams reports:

- a) This month, we're continuing our partnership providing training facilities for the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as providing space for All Souls Episcopal Church while they continue looking for a place to hold weekly worship.
- b) As you can imagine, we've had a lot of cancellations and rescheduling due to COVID-19, however, we're slowly starting to get more interest in rentals.
- c) It seems to be the season of roofing issues here at the church. The Parish Hall roof was repaired by Tanenbaum Roofing on September 9th and 10th. To my knowledge we have not had any further leaks since 9/10. There was also a sizable hole in the roof of the storage shed that was patched by Harry Hull, Chris Brown, and myself. Father Tom informed me that the roof at 227 N. Main St. is scheduled to be repaired in the near future. Prayers for water tight repairs are appreciated.
- d) As far as minor repairs around campus go, I've been keeping an eye out for any wasps nests that have been popping up and I've been cleaning out clogged gutters. My next project is to replace the dead light bulbs and damaged sound panels in the Parish Hall. If you have any ideas of things that could improve our campus please feel free to let me know.

4) Finance Minister Jane Cartelli reports:

a) Staff Pensions:

- (1) Last week I was finally sent the figures from the Episcopal pension fund for Deacon Julie's account. We owe \$9,563.61 in back payments and \$795.00 a month from now on.
- b) I am waiting for the application for Fr Soner's pension to be completed by the Pension Fund, and for them to send us the final numbers, but, based on the percentages the Diocese gave, we owe approximately \$7,500 for his 2019 pension and \$8,000 for 2020 for a total of \$15,500 to catch him up through the end of this year.
- c) When Children's Minister Angela Lopez moved to ³/₄ time, she became eligible for a pension after one year at that level. We owe approximately \$1181.25 to bring her pension current. Additionally, we have a match program. Angela can elect to add 4% of her salary to the pension fund, and COTM must match it starting in January. The good news is there is no requirement to match the additional 4% for the arrears period.
- d) Jeremy Adams is paid as an Assistant Music Minister and as a Facility Minister. The diocese says that the combination of both jobs will bring Jeremy to the pension level one year from the date he took over 1 Sunday a month for Linda. We have one year before we pay 5% to 9% of Jeremy's compensation into his pension. This is unless his hours go under 1000 regular scheduled hours a year. (2 ¹/₂ days a week).
- 5. 3% Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA's) for long-time staff to begin in 2020:
 - a) Children's Minister Angela has not had a raise since getting one dollar an hour raise in 2017. She moved from half time to ³/₄ time in 2018, but <u>that did not</u> increase her hourly rate. If she received a 3% COLA, it would increase her compensation \$709.00/year from \$23,625 to \$24,334. This would cost the parish \$709 plus \$54 in taxes (a year) plus an additional \$36 in pension, if she doesn't contribute to the plan, or \$58, if she contributes to it, and we match her contribution.
 - b) Music Minister Linda Ellison received an increase in 2020 and one Sunday off a month starting a few months ago. Her salary is \$50,000 a year and will stay the same, since she's getting that Sunday a month off.
 - c) Rector Tom Rutherford's last raise was in 2019. If he receives a 3% COLA, it will cost \$3056.23 plus \$550.12 a year in additional pension. There are no payroll taxes for his position.
 - d) Office Minister Julie Altenbach, Facility Minister Jeremy Adams, Maintenance Minister Kara Altenbach, and Finance Minister Jane Cartelli started their jobs in late 2019, so they weren't being considered for this cost of living adjustment to begin in 2020.

4. Music Minister Linda Ellison reports:

- a) Those of us who serve in Music Ministry are very glad to welcome some additional singers who are willing to assist in leading music: Valerie Rice at the 9:30 am service, and Debbie Rutherford at 9:30 am and 11 am (returning after a necessary hiatus). Also, Patty Tate will soon be returning to sing with us at the 11 am service. We also continue to be thankful for the singers and instrumentalists who have faithfully been serving for the past many weeks.
- b) I'm exploring an interesting book called "Extravagant Worship" by Darlene Zschech, who wrote "Shout to the Lord." Psalm 78 tells us that King David shepherded the people of God with "integrity of heart" and with "skillful hands". Ms. Zschech says: "My heart's desire is that as God searches the earth, he will find me to be an extravagant worshiper". That is the desire of my heart as well, and my prayer for us at Church of the Messiah.

- 5. Office Minister Julie Altenbach reports this month was busy with:
 - a) Preparing the Messiah's Way Launch
 - (1) I created a Digital Ministry Fair and put it on our YouTube Channel, as well as running it on the TV in the Narthex and having it run during our services on Sunday.
 - (2) Preparing copies to be printed for folks that would rather do it that way instead of digitally
 - (3) I reset the 4 Chromebooks we have to be used for our Messiah Family to sign up for Messiah's Way. I set up tables in the Narthex Sunday the 13th and 20th to help people sing up with the Chromebooks (or with hard copies if they preferred)
 - b) Called to update any members without an email listed in our directory and if no email was available, added those names to our list of members to have Messengers and announcements mailed to them
 - c) Handled the hospitality side of the Diocese Conference on Ministry
 - d) Preparing the funeral reception for Patty Robertson's father, Ed Cortez. The Office Angels called the people who signed up on Messiah's Way to help and coordinated the food, and we set up the Parish Hall. (I was able to buy some pretty plates with the gift card I received for taking part in the marketing phone call with Constant Contact)
 - e) In preparation for being home after my cancer surgery, I prepared the bulletins and the Messenger going into October. My Office Angels were amazing at helping and being willing to cover for me while I am out of the office
 - f) I have created a book with all the contact information, how to do the daily and monthly tasks, and general knowledge to run the office. I made a copy so I can work from home and if needed, help the Office Angels if they have questions
 - g) Thank you for your prayers, love, and support. The Office Angels helped me create a schedule to have someone in the office while I am recovering. I appreciate the people on this ministry team, and truly am blessed by their service.

C. School for the Arts: Garine Adams reports:

- 1. We're doing well going into the coming Fall. Our student numbers are growing by a few each month, and everyone is in gear to have a great concert on December 18th.
- 2. The monthly drum circle has had a consistent handful of folks drumming their worries away each month on the first Fridays at 6:00pm.
- 3. We are working with the preschool to bring seasonal music classes in the near future.
- 4. We are are excited to announce a new hip hop/jazz dance class in the works. If you know of anyone looking to start learning more about music/art/dance/theater please don't forget to send them our way.
- **D. COVID-19 Response:** We launched a new ministry this month: Mail Out Communion to parishioners who are self-quarantining, even from Drive Thru Communion. We contacted everyone we hadn't seen in a while to offer Mail Out, and half a dozen replied they'd like it. We sent them enough individual servings for the rest of this month and let them know we'd continue sending a month's supply at a time, as long as they contact us to ask for it. Mailing the boxes costs about \$4 each. We also picked up some former parishioners who have begun watching us online, and we sent communion to them also. Now we're going to offer it to those who live far away, with the expectation that they'll watch the service and take communion when we get to that part of the liturgy.
- **E. Bradford Fisher's ordination process:** Bradford met with the Standing Committee, and they loved him!

F. Vestry Nominees: Please come next month with suggestions for folks to invite to stand for election to Vestry in January 2021. We're looking for people who love Jesus and the Messiah family, are active in a ministry in the parish, and demonstrate leadership skills. Tom Rutherford will screen the names for pastoral concerns and to see if they appear to be tithing. He will invite those who qualify to stand for election and to attend vestry meetings to see how we operate.

G. Insurance: The end result of the research into a more cost-effective insurance policy for the church was that there is no financial benefit to changing insurance companies.

III. DISCUSSION (to help make a decision next month):

- A. Funds the Payroll Protection Program freed up for other projects. While the US government loaned/ gave us \$123,000 with the PPP, after covering the back pensions for Deacon Julie, Father Soner, and Children's Minister Angela, and paying the Preschool teachers and our mortgage interest, it appears we may have \$26,000 of our regular Operating Funds that the PPP freed up. We won't know that for sure, however, until the US government clarifies what the PPP money can be used for and how much of that loan will be forgiven – or how much we will need to give back. In the meantime, the Money Team of Joe Eiden, Don Greer, Wendy King, Tom Rutherford, Brian Seguin, Doreen Stachowski, and Dawn Wirbel are still chasing down the costs for possible projects. We will not make any decisions about this until October ...or later, when all the numbers get nailed down. In the meantime, a list of the projects the Team is considering – and their costs – were emailed separately.
- B. **Media Minister**: COVID-19 has made our online presence more vital than ever. That's won't change when the pandemic passes. Therefore, Tom Rutherford wants to add a part-time Media Minister to the staff.

IV. DECISIONS (usually based on the Discussion last month) (2 minutes):

- **A.** The roof of the house at 227 North Main Street. We decided by email communication to contract with Stanley's Roofing for \$9,860 to coat the roof with silicone. The job was completed on September 25th. It carries a 10-year warranty.
- **B. Gift of a mini-van:** A parish family gave the church a 2010 Honda Odyssey 8-passenger mini-van with 123,000 miles on it.
 - 1. We discussed several options for it last month:
 - a) Sell it and use the money for something else.
 - b) Keep it as a Church mini-van to help provide transportation for the children, youth, and French congregation (Father Soner volunteers to keep up with maintenance and upkeep).
 - (1) If we do this, Tom Rutherford would like the Rector's Discretionary Fund to be reimbursed for fixing the A/C.
 - (2) Insurance through the Church Insurance Company would cost \$1,440/year for full coverage or \$1,080 for liability only.
 - (3) Volunteer Youth Minister Murph Borno writes: *Having this type of resource would be highly useful when we eventually return to a post SARS-CoV-2 environment. From a youth ministry perspective, having an 8-passenger vehicle would simplify and enhance our ability to do group events away from the church. It would eliminate, or reduce, the number of vehicles and drivers required for events like mission work, fun outings, the Lift-tour, concerts, Soul in the City and Camp Wingmann events. It would also be useful in transporting cargo and other material to local parishioners or others. I would also add that there is potential added benefit for the DART if called upon to respond to a disaster. Cargo space as well as the ability to load people would come in handy, especially post-disaster.*
 - c) Keep it to give to a parish family in need, when the need arises.
 - d) The vestry decided to keep the van for the rest of this year and see how much it is used. If it's not used, we will reconsider in January and perhaps sell it. People who drive it will have a driving background check to ensure they're safe drivers.

- **C. Father Richard Gonzalez** volunteers 15 hours a week as a non-stipendiary Priest Associate. In return we agreed to pay for his wife's medical insurance until she turns 65 and can receive Medicare in 2021. In a conversation with the Diocesan Administrator Earl Pickett about a separate medical insurance question, Tom Rutherford realized we could bring Richard on staff and pay him the amount of her insurance and call it "Housing Allowance," and it would be tax-free income for Richard. Making this change is revenue-neutral for the parish. The vestry agreed to this change.
- **D. Deacon Julie Altenbach's compensation:** The same deal applies to Julie. If we call a portion of her compensation "Housing Allowance," it becomes tax-free income for her, while remaining revenue-neutral for the parish. The vestry agreed to this change.
- **E.** Cost Of Living Adjustments (COLA) for longtime staff: After several months of discussion, vestry decided to give Fr. Tom and Angela Lopez a 3% COLA retroactive back to January 1, 2020.

V.<u>MEETING MINUTES & FINANCIAL REPORT</u>:

- A. Minutes from the August meeting: APPROVED
 - AugustFinancial Report from Treasurer Bob Tate:
 1. Operating Account: Giving in August was \$3,843.57 MORE than expenses. That INCREASES our SURPLUS year-to-date to \$63,452.13.

2. Building Fund net income in August was \$8,953.43 MORE than our \$11,996.01 monthly mortgage and other expenses, DECREASING the DEFICIT year-to-date to \$3,092.08.

The meeting closed with prayer and adjourned at 3:45 pm.







And he's camped ten miles away.




This month I've read one marvelous book I borrowed from the Church Library: <u>Out of the</u> <u>Salt Shaker & Into the World</u> by Rebecca Manley Pippert, and viewed as much of the DVD "No Safe Spaces" on my cell as Twitter allowed me to watch. (I have the DVD on order.)

Out of the Salt Shaker really struck a nerve with me. Some of you may know that my "evangelical" style as a teenager and a new believer was to tell my colleagues they were going to Hell if they didn't believe as I did; and for some unfathomable reason, I didn't find this message very effective. (Actually I had been a believer as a child, but for some reason turned away until I was about 16. I think a big part of my problem was anger with God for what He did to Jesus. But I tuned into the Radio Bible Class with M.R. DeHaan, back in the days when there were Christian programs on regular radio on Sunday. There I learned that everything that happened had been prophesied, and that satisfied me at the time. It was YEARS later that the light went on, and I realized that the culprit—the reason for what happened to Jesus—was ME!) So anyway, I was a very reluctant "evangelist" (or thought I was) for a while, though I think even then I had no trouble telling others what God had done for me. And I think I realized that I needed a relationship with people before I could really talk to them. Of course, it helped that the Gospel moved the 18 inches from my brain to my heart! Plus I may have realized that I was only responsible for sowing seed—making it grow was God's job.

Anyway, Mrs. Pippert does a masterful job of demonstrating that "technique" is irrelevant; love is the key, (Ding, ding ding!) And she does provide some reassuring approaches to "letting other beggars know where the Bread is." This should be just as "natural" as discussing anything else instead of being treated as a "duty,"


