

In an attempt to lessen the spread of COVID-19, the Mayor of Orange County and the Bishop of our Diocese have both issued proclamations requiring us to wear a face-covering (mask, bandana, neck gaiter, etc.) when we're together.

I know that. You know that.

That's why I haven't made a big deal about masks: We ALL know the guidelines.

Some of us follow them fastidiously. Others of us... not so much.

But since we all know the guidelines, and we all have access to the same information about the disease and the risks of catching it, I have chosen to trust you to pray, think, research, and make your own decision about what you think is the best way to avoid and fight the pandemic.

And just as I don't harangue you about wearing seatbelts in your car or paying your taxes, I'm not going to be the "Mask Sheriff" telling you what you need to put on – or leave off – your face.

Instead, about masks, I'm following the Anglican stance on lots of things:

#### All may. Some should. None must.

ALL MAY wear a face-covering at any event in the life of our parish family, and we have masks available in the Narthex if you arrive without one, or forget yours, or leave it in the car, and want to don one.

**SOME SHOULD** wear a face-covering, due to age, health, pre-existing medical conditions, or concerns about catching or unknowingly spreading the disease.

**NONE MUST.** We're all grownups, and we all have the capability, the right, and the freedom to examine the evidence and make our own decisions about our own health, which includes whether or not to wear a face-covering.

I take this stance because different ones of us have reached different conclusions based on that same evidence:

We have folks who are not attending worship in person, because we don't require masks.

We have other folks who are attending, but who wouldn't, if we did require them.

We have folks who are scared to death of the disease... and for good reason.

We have others who think the concerns about the pandemic are overblown.

We have folks who have not left their homes, except for doctor's appointments, since last March.

We have others who have not changed any of their habits or routines.

We have folks who haven't seen family or friends in person for months.

We have others who touch and hug and interact with family and friends with impunity.

We have folks who think our bishop and government have not gone far enough with their orders to fight the disease.

#### 2020 November Vestry Minutes Sunday \* November 22, 2020, \* 2:30pm

**FORMATION**: Chris Brown led Noonday Prayer, based on Luke 2:8-12, Tom Rutherford invited us each to share how Jesus was born into our lives.

#### II. **INFORMATION:**

#### A. Vestry Ministry Team Reports:

- 1. Outreach Team Doreen Stachowski reports
  - a) All Christmas ministries were completed to include:
    - (1) Dillard Street Elementary School Partners in Education
    - (2) Christmas food gift cards for 20 families
    - (3) A group Christmas present for the Foster Friends of Central Florida
    - (4) 51 Christmas gifts for the Edgewood Children's Ranch
    - (5) Angel Tree gifts for children whose parents are in prison
  - b) In addition, and within budget, we were able to buy presents for a family within the Church that was struggling this year and needed help for their 3 children.
  - c) Volunteers worked with the Christian Service Center sorting food to ship to their downtown location.
  - d) Volunteers worked with the Apopka Pregnancy Center to coordinate a Christmas party for the mothers and their children.
  - e) There is so much need in our community and we will have an Outreach meeting in February to decide where we will allocate the budget for 2021. The letters have started to come in from different charities asking for our help.
  - f) God has really blessed the Church of the Messiah and the Outreach team with the love and compassion and willingness to work all hours by our Children's Minister Angela Lopez. Thank you, Angela, for your giving spirit and love of our church and community!

2. **Messiah's Way:** New Ministries begin November 29 (the 1st Sunday of Advent). Please utilize your volunteers this year.

- B. Staff Reports:
- 1. Children of the Messiah Preschool: The Financial Report was emailed separately.
- 2. Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports:

a) The kids in Children's Church both in person and virtually have been traveling around the world to learn how Christmas is celebrated in other countries, or what other winter holidays are observed. We first took a plane to Israel and learned all about Hanukkah. We are learning geography, history, and customs as well as our own Advent traditions. From Israel we took a train to Holland, then a cruise ship to Australia. We still have to travel to Mexico and the Congo. I have been inserting pictures of the kids into my Google classroom lessons, it's been a fun way for the kids who are in person to see friends they miss, and my virtual kids get to see themselves included in the fun. We made a cork Holy Family ornament to add to the church Jesse Tree. The kids will take their ornament home after Christmas.

- b) In SHINE we are going deeper into the traditions of kids around the world. We had chocolate gold coins from the dreidel game. We had several types of Dutch candy, some with fruit and nuts, some with marzipan, hazelnut cream, and some lovely Dutch cocoa truffles. On Advent 2 we decorated the Jesse tree with beautiful purple ornaments and some handmade felt Jesse Tree ornaments that I purchased from the Silver Shekel downtown. We each took 2 ornaments and looked up the corresponding Bible verse before we hung them on the tree. Our pajama and toast party was a hit! It was the largest crowd I have had at SHINE since March! We played Christmas games, had Nutella toast with chocolate milk and shared loads of laughs. We will be painting ornaments next week and learning about piñatas!
- c) There has been a lot going on in the lives of the kids: lost pets, headaches, testing at school, medical tests, and of course the ongoing stress of the Corona Virus. Many of the kids are continuing to ask when things will be normal and why the virus has not gone away yet. They have been great about praying for each other and asking for prayers.
- d) I have been very busy with outreach, we bought Wal-Mart gift cards and goodie bags for 51 kids at Edgewood Ranch. Doreen Stachowski and I delivered them to the Director. As a church we provided gifts for 31 Angel tree kids. I have been contacting the guardians of the children and coordinating the pick-up of the gifts. Several Daughters of the King joined me in praying for the families and distributing gifts and literature to about ½ of the families. The remaining gifts will be distributed throughout the week. As partner in education with Dillard Street Elementary we have been sponsoring children for Christmas for the past 3 years, this year the budget was a bit tighter, as I was working only off of previously raised funds. I was still able to provide 3 toys each to 10 kids. We had a parishioner ask for assistance with gifts for 4 children and since there was room in the outreach budget, we were able to shop for those children providing each with 2 outfits, 3 toys, 1 stuffed animal and one blanket each. We also passed out 20 grocery gift cards to families within the church. Everyone has been very generous, and the recipients have been very appreciative. It truly has been a blessing spreading joy around the community.
- e) For the Children's Christmas Eve service there will be a narrated slide show called "Miracle in a Manger". I have been blessed with several volunteers who are baking cookies for everyone at that service. Thank you to the Daughters of the King sisters who stuffed the goodie bags with books, treats and prizes that tie in to the message!!
- f) The ADVENTure boxes have been a huge hit! I passed out 30 of them and have seen many pictures of happy creative kids working on the activities. As I run into the kids around town, they tell me what they have played or read the previous day. I offered something very similar to this for EASTER, and the families enjoyed it. I think this is something I will continue, possibly on a smaller scale, even after the pandemic passes. It offers a lot of flexibility and sets the scene for family fun time.

#### 3. Facility Minister Jeremy Adams reports:

- a) This month we hosted the Horizon West Theater Company's children's production of Elf Jr. The show went well with minimal issues and they are actively looking for future availability for more rentals. Thank you to everyone that helped to be gracious hosts to their organization!
- b) I will be reaching out to our previous renters in the new year to see if they have any needs for our facility in 2021. Overall, rentals have slowed down considerably since March, however, with the new COVID vaccine looming on the horizon, I anticipate that our rental schedule will start to pick up again after Easter next year. If you know of anyone who needs a hall for a party or any type of event please let them know that we are open.

- c) Many of the rentals for the kitchen have not panned out due to licensing issues on the client side. We're able to rent the kitchen to any licensed caterers or private chefs. Unfortunately, the bulk of the leads we've received are from food trucks looking for a commissary kitchen, which we are not interested in, because it would subject us to surprise health inspections and storing some of the food trucks' equipment...and we don't have any extra storage space.
- d) This month we've had some touch up work happen around the church that I'd like to mention. THANK YOU to the following volunteers:
  - (1) Bobby Field brought his pressure cleaning company out to clean our sidewalks and walkways, and he is planning on coming around once more next week.
  - (2) Chris Brown and Wally Stewart repainted the parking lot stripes.
  - (3) Wally also inspected our irrigation system to get us ready for the "dry" season.
  - (4) Bill Adams repaired several plumbing issues.
- e) Tanenbaum roofing came out to inspect the Parish Hall roof once more and were unable to find a leak. The replacement sound panels are in, but I'm waiting for one more strong storm to see if the leak reappears. So far I haven't seen any further evidence of leaks in the roof since Tanenbaum roofing last visited. Either way, I plan to have the panels up before the Christmas Eve Eve service on December 23rd.
- 4. **Finance Minister** Jane Cartelli reports: The U.S. Government keeps tweaking the rules for the Payroll Protection Program. We're still waiting until they solidify before we do anything about applying for forgiveness of the loan.
- 5. Office Minister : Julie Altenbach reports her and the Office Angels' recent projects:
  - a) Helping Children's Minister Angela Lopez prepare her Advent-in-a-Box project for our parish children.
  - b) Distributing the Ladies' Night Out Auction Items
  - c) Preparing the Christmas Service Bulletins
  - d) Helping the Outreach Committee with the Angel Tree gift distribution
  - e) I was able to record the narration for the Preschool Christmas Program
  - f) Promoted the Messiah School for the Arts Winter Concert and our Christmas Services on social media
  - g) I continue to mail communion and check in with folks that are staying home.
- 6. School for the Arts: Garine Adams reports:
  - a) As we end the year, we are thankful for still being able to create and participate in our arts community. Thank you for all the prayers and support throughout the year. 2020 was a year of many challenges, but also many blessings. This year we've taught 689 lessons and 33 group classes and counting. We've given \$1,946.45 in scholarship funds and provided funds for two of our students to attend weekend long bible retreats. Our weekly lesson student number has grown to 21 individual lesson students, and we have 5 arts teachers on our weekly payroll. Our third and final recital of the year is coming up this Friday and will be livestreamed for those who'd like to watch from home at 6:30pm, December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2020 through Facebook and YouTube. We started a Hip Hop dance class for middle school age students that is starting to grow in popularity this past November too. Look out for more dance classes taught by Isabella Eaton!
  - b) In March 2020 we began offering virtual lessons that has opened our "doors" to out of town students from all over the state. Also, our Youth Band had the pleasure of having our first full evening concert playing worship music for the Messiah Ladies Night Out in addition to providing offertory music for the 9:30am and 4pm French Service.

#### c) Future plans for 2021

- (1) Shakespearean YouTube Series starring our very own Ken Anders
- (2) Virtual Revival for Youth on February 19th, 6:30pm (Interdenominational)
- (3) Spring, Summer, Fall Recitals
- (4) Messiah School for the Arts Youth Band First United Methodist Church youth partnership
- (5) Adult Tap Class
- (6) Preschool movement/dance class
- (7) Acting/Theatre class
- (8) Continuing to grow and expand our student base
- C. **COVID-19 Response:** Music Minister Linda Ellison has expressed concerns about how close the computer operator is to her as she plays at 8 & 9:30, so Facilities Minister Jeremy Adams spent \$60 on longer cables, so the computer can be farther away.
- **D. Bradford Fisher's ordination process:** He's doing Field Education at the Episcopal Church of St John The Baptist in Orlando and will be away from us through Pentecost (May 23, 2021). He's scheduled to be ordained a deacon in September 2021.
- E. Vestry Nominees for 2021-23: Tom Rutherford invited the 20 folks you suggested last month to stand for election. The following 5 agreed to be nominees: Marci Babione, Steve Borst, Ron Lancioni, Vita Mazzaluna, and Sarah Wolfe.
- F.Annual Report from your ministry Team: Please write a less-than-one-page report of what your Team did in 2020 – a paragraph or two will be fine! Please email them to <u>JulieAltenbach@ChurchOfTheMessiah.com</u> by January 8, so she can produce the Annual Report to be available Sunday January 17, so folks can look over it before the Annual Parish Meeting Sunday January 24 at 5:30pm in the Parish Hall.

#### IV. DECISIONS (usually based on the Discussion last month):

- A. **2021 Proposed Budget:** The Finance Committee recommended adopting the Budget as presented. Vestry APPROVED. The Budget will be publicized in the monthly *Messenger*, the weekly email blasts, and the Annual Report.
- B. Housing Allowance Resolutions for our clergy: The Internal Revenue Service allows clergy to receive a housing allowance as non-taxable income. The clergy tell us how much of their compensation should be allocated to Housing Allowance, and the Vestry formalizes that in resolutions in December. The Housing Allowance is revenue neutral for the parish: it doesn't affect the total amount paid to the clergy person; it just divides that amount into the two categories. Father Soner Alexandre doesn't need one of these, because we provide a house for him, which the IRS doesn't count as taxable income. Vestry APPROVED the resolutions.
- C. Thank You gifts for our salaried program staff: Since we appear to be ending 2020 with at least a \$29,000 surplus (SEE THE NOVEMBER FINANCIAL REPORT), Tom Rutherford encouraged us to give the salaried Program and Logistics Staff (Jeremy Adams, Soner Alexandre, Julie Altenbach, Jane Cartelli, Linda Ellison, and Angela Lopez) a Christmas gift to recognize their extra-efforts through COVID-time. Tom is NOT asking for this for himself; in fact, he's asking us not to give him one. Vestry APPROVED a \$250 gift card in gratitude for their hard work during this difficult year. We gave gifts cards, because if we gave them cash or a check, that would be taxable income.

#### V. MEETING MINUTES & FINANCIAL REPORT:

A. Minutes from the last month's meeting: APPROVED.

- B. Last month's Financial Report from Treasurer Bob Tate: APPROVED
  - 1. **Operating Account**: Giving last month was \$10,129.03 MORE than expenses. That INCREASES our SURPLUS year-to-date to \$29,153.61. HALLELUJAH!
- 2. **Building Fund** net income last month was \$1,034.52 LESS than our \$11,996.01 monthly mortgage and other expenses, INCREASING the DEFICIT year-to-date to \$19,043.79.

Some of the things Vita will be doing as our Media Minister include:


\*Work under the supervision of the Office Minister as a team member with the Rector, Clergy, and other Staff in the ongoing mission and ministry of the parish.

I didn't get much reading done this month, but the children's book I <u>did</u> read is excellent: <u>The</u> <u>Lights in the Church</u>, by Marilee Joy Mayfield, with beautiful illustrations by Max Dolgany. It's a charming story about two children, a brother and sister, who get lost in the snow. They follow the hoof prints of the deer to a lighted church. The scenes in the stained glass windows come to life, reliving the miracles of Jesus before the children's eyes. It is written in what I would call informal poetry. (That is, the meter is not exact by any means, but it adds charm, just the same.) And it has a wonderful surprise conclusion. I think any child would be enchanted with the story and the illustrations. It came too late for the December newsletter; but as it turned out, the story isn't specifically Christmas. It's just a wonderful teaching tool for children.



Now that we understand a bit about dementia lets discuss some early signs of dementia.

While dementia is not only about memory loss it is one of the first signs we may see in our loved ones. We may realize that our loved ones may forget simple things, such as what they were doing or where they are going. Memory loss which affects their day to day functions should be cause of concern. Short term memory loss, which is characterized by a person's ability to remember events probably twenty years ago but is having difficulty to remember what happened ten minutes ago.

Caregivers should take note if the person in their care begins to have difficulty in performing everyday tasks. Simple tasks such as buttoning a shirt, or brushing one's teeth. If these tasks seem to frustrate the individual one should take note. It should also be of some concern if routine tasks take longer to perform and cause the person to become frustrated.

While we may think that it is expected that someone would get frustrated if they are unable to perform routine tasks, we must also be aware that with early signs of dementia a person becomes easily agitated. They may have some difficulty expressing themselves or saying the right words, saying what they are thinking may not be easy. You may be speaking to the individual and they may not comprehend what you are saying.

With all these changes taking place with our loved ones, we may observe a lack of enthusiasm or interest in performing any activities. They may sit in front of the television without even knowing the name of the show they are watching, what they are looking at or how long they were sitting there. If they can tell you the name of the program it will be a while before they can relate any details.

While these are some of the early signs of dementia, we must not assume that it is dementia. However, if you notice more than two or three of the above signs or you notice any of these changes you should begin to document the changes. We cannot assume the presence of dementia, however it may be time to take consider the possibility and get a support team for your next course of action, which may include a conversation with firstly with your love one followed by the family doctor.
