Mark 8:31-38

Disqualified? NO!

✦ How old is “too old?”

When Abram was 99 years old, the LORD appeared to him and said, “I am God Almighty; walk before me faithfully and be blameless. Then I will make my covenant between me and you and will greatly increase your numbers.”

Genesis 17:1-2

✦ How young is “too young?”

✦ How late is “too late?”

Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations, just as it had been said to him. Without weakening in his faith, he faced the fact that his body was as good as dead – since he was about 100 years old – and that Sarah’s womb was also dead.

Romans 4:18-19

✦ How early is “too early?”

✦ How good is “good enough?”

Yet Abraham did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God, being fully persuaded that God had power to do what he promised.

Romans 4:20-21

✦ How bad is “too bad?”

 - ✦ For grace to do even better in faith, hope, and love in the area you talked about in #4 above.
