

# Psalms of Praise: 100 and 150

THE OLD TESTAMENT \* Week 25 \* Opening Prayer: Psalm 100

I. “Songs of Ascent” – Psalms 120-134 –

II. Psalm 100

A psalm. For giving grateful praise.

<sup>1</sup> Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.

Psalm 33:3 – Sing to [the LORD] a new song; play skillfully, and shout for joy.

<sup>2</sup> Worship the Lord with gladness;

come before him with joyful songs.

<sup>3</sup> Know that the Lord is God.

It is he who made us, and we are his (OR “and not we ourselves”)

we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

<sup>4</sup> Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise;  
give thanks to him and praise his name.

<sup>5</sup> For the Lord is good and his love endures forever;  
his faithfulness continues through all generations. (See Revelation chapters 4,7,and 19-22)

III. Psalm 150

<sup>1</sup> Praise the Lord.

Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens.

<sup>2</sup> Praise him for his acts of power; praise him for his surpassing greatness.

<sup>3</sup> Praise him with the sounding of the trumpet, praise him with the harp and lyre,

<sup>4</sup>praise him with timbrel and dancing, praise him with the strings and pipe,

<sup>5</sup>praise him with the clash of cymbals, praise him with resounding cymbals.

<sup>6</sup>Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Praise the Lord.
