Acts 4:32-35 * Psaim 133 * 1 John 1:1-2:2 * John 20:19-31 "Fellowship"?
"Grant that all who have been reborn into the FELLOWSHIP of Christ's Body" Collect for the 2 nd Sunday of Easter, BCP 224
"Fellowship" = "F," but it's MORE
All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had. Acts 4:32
† Fellowship = Sharing our S, T, and L Oh, how good and pleasant it is, * when brothers [and sisters] dwell together in unity! Psalm 133:1
 ♦ Fellowship = Choosing U, which is not U
Fellowship = Sharing F, H, and L Thomas was not with the disciples when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" John 20:24- 25
• Fellowship = Going to the estranged to I them back
Jesus said to Thomas, "Stop doubting and believe." <u>John 20:27</u>
+ Fellowship = F and R
