

2021 August Vestry Minutes Thursday * August 19, 2021, * 6 pm

Present (in person or by ZOOM video conferencing): Rector Tom Rutherford, Senior Warden & Clerk Joyce Taylor, Junior Warden Chris Brown, Steve Borst, Wendy King, Ron Lancioni, Brian Seguin, Doreen Stachowski, and Sarah Wolfe; Treasurer Bob Tate and Media Minister Vita Mazzaluna.

Absent: Ron Bouton (illness), Marci Babione (visiting with family) and Wally Stewart (out of town) and Joe Eiden.

I. <u>FORMATION</u>: Sarah Wolfe led Compline. Based on 1 Corinthians 12:12-27, Tom Rutherford will talk about how the Messiah's Way helps the Messiah family be a healthy Body of Christ, "with each part doing its part," and he asked each of us, "What part of the Body do you see yourself to be?"

II. **INFORMATION:**

- A. Vestry Ministry Team Reports: (None)
- B. B. Staff Reports:

1.Children of the Messiah Preschool: The Financial Report was emailed separately.

2. Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports:

- a) As the summer is coming to an end, we are also wrapping up our "Quest" and "Does God speak" series. We have one week left in each. I have found that the concept of God speaking to them is a bit hard for many of them to grasp. We will be revisiting this and further elaborating on it in the near future. The quest to grow closer to God was much enjoyed. The addition of the stuffed animals for our children to "disciple" was a hit, and we will continue to use our fluffy friends as a tool until they lose interest. Some of the children have dressed them, made habitats, found small Bibles for them to use, and have encouraged other friends to stop by SHINE to adopt an animal of their own. I have depleted my stuffed animal stash due to so many friends wanting to participate and will be looking for donations to replenish.
- b) I would like to congratulate Taylor and Reese Smith on learning the most memory verses for this current series! They have learned a new verse every week and even sent me a video reciting the verse on the week that they missed church! I am super proud of them! They work together and with their parents with the family devotional I send home. Reese is not a reader but has worked to master each verse. I especially enjoy her pronunciation of Deuteronomy!
- c) While being in the middle of 2 lesson series, I have had time to work on other projects. I refreshed the nursery with fresh paint and selected a Bible verse, with the input of Preschool Director Barbara Ellerbe, to be painted on the wall. It will say "For this child we have prayed..." 1 Samuel 1:27. Deacon Julie and I provided a taco bar lunch for the preschool teachers who returned for preplanning. We also provided packed lunches for the Activate teens and adults who were on the mission work week project.
- d) I have begun the process of planning for Christmas events as it seems to take a lot of time to procure all of the materials and prepare the children. I need to focus on the large events as time permits as there are so many small things that occupy our time on a regular basis.
- e) To eliminate some of the frustration for the SHINE kids I have made new "Messiah Money" instead of using the combination of premade that had 100 and 500 denominations and my designer notes. Some of the kids were not understanding that 1 piece equals 1 "Messiah Money" even if it said 100 or 500. We are also all using the same Bible, as about 1/3 of the group are not confident readers. It helps to have them all on the same page number with the same translation. We have some great helpers, who will assist with pronunciation as they read along.

- f) We have gained 4 new SHIINE kids which is WONDERFUL. I am back to preCOVID numbers, even after losing a few to Activate. With that being said, I need a few consistent and confident volunteers so that we can break down into at least 2 age groups. As much as we all love the little ones, they require more assistance and redirection... as well as potty breaks. So, if anyone is feeling called to serve with the children, please contact me, and we can talk about what is involved with SHINE kids club.
- g) I am currently planning the Trunk or Treat event, the postponed Back to School Party, a grandparents' night and Christmas events. If anyone would like to assist with any of that, you do not need to wait for the next Messiah's way to sign up! Please email me or catch me at church!
- h) With all of the children returning to different schools and other events, I am going to return to the COVID protocols we had before. The room will be completely sanitized with bleach between each service, hands will be sanitized as they enter and exit the room, we will not be holding hands or playing games that involve physical touch, and the chairs will once again be distanced. The beginning of the school year always brings runny noses and coughs, and we don't want anything beyond the usual being shared. I will return to wearing a mask when I need to be within 6 feet of children under 12. I do however plan to have myself distanced while teaching so that a mask is not necessary, as it is difficult for the children to hear when I'm masked, and they need to see facial expressions when hearing a story. I have also asked the nursery workers to wear a mask for at least the next 30 days, and we will also have an attendance sheet in each room/service for contact tracing, should the need arise. I ask/require with kindness, that all volunteers with the children wear a mask for at least the next 30 days regardless of their vaccination status. I am not asking anyone, as it is a personal choice to be vaccinated or not, just be prepared to mask up if you want to volunteer with the children.
- i) We are asking that there be NO SHOES and NO EXTRA people in the nursery at this time. We share the nursery with the preschool, and we need to keep it as sanitary as possible since there are 6 babies age 1 and under in there daily.
- j) On a final note, our Safeguarding system has been revamped and previous learners were transferred over. Whoever is an active volunteer with an email address should have received an automated email to reset your password and login to the new system. After finally regaining my admin credentials and going through the tutorials, I should now be able to help anyone who needs it. I have added each new user, and will check in after 4 days to see if they have been successful with new system. They have suggested the refresher course be taken more frequently, so I will be going through the active list soon to send out reminders. The classes have been updated as well. In Advent, I will host a Safeguarding afternoon or evening to allow people to complete the courses as a group.

3. Facilities Minister Jeremy Adams reports:

- a) Interest in our facilities continues to grow! Thank you everyone for the prayers and for spreading the word about our beautiful campus. For the first time since the beginning of the pandemic, there is an event scheduled in our hall every weekend of this month. One recurring event that I'm personally excited about is a weekly Mommy and Me style music class starting Friday, August 13th at 10am, called Milestones through Music.
- b) Here's a condensed schedule of special events this month:
- August 6th Messiah School for the Arts Concert in the Parish Hall
 August 7th Wedding in the Sanctuary
 August 13th Milestones through Music with Mrs. Becky in Parish Hall
 August 14th Baptism in Sanctuary 11am in Sanctuary
 August 14th Private reception in the Parish Hall
- August 20th Milestones through Music with Mrs. Becky in Parish Hall August 21st - Private party in the Parish Hall (all day rental)
- August 27th Milestones through Music with Mrs. Becky in Parish Hall August 28th - Conference on Ministry in the Parish Hall

- c) We are also in negotiations with Horizon West Theater Company to host their twice weekly rehearsals for their upcoming show "Once Upon a Mattress." These rehearsals will start in September and run through the end of November with the show being performed on December 3rd and 4th.
- d) If you notice anything amiss with our campus please let me know.
- 4. Finance Minister Jane Cartelli reports: (None)
- 5. Media Minister Vita Mazzaluna reports:
 - a) Office Angel Dawn Wirbel did an amazing job cleaning up the Diving Deeper website posts so that they are all a standard format AND go all the way back to Week 1 of the current cycle! THANK YOU, DAWN!!
 - b) I have updated some of the firmware for the camera in hopes that we have less glitches. Only time will tell!
 - c) Volunteers for 9:30am and 7pm are still going strong! Thank you to those folks!
 - d) We're looking at upgrading our video camera in the Church, and transplanting the current camera to the Parish Hall, so we can livestream from either place simply, rather than having to set up and tear down our portable camera anytime we have an event in the Parish Hall. Camera prices are holding at about \$2,300. I would love input from the Vestry if they feel we should go ahead and make that purchase in the event that the electronics prices either do not come back down OR continue to go up as inventory depletes. I am attaching my proposal earlier than planned so that the Vestry can review, discuss, and pray. This is the "bare bones upgrade" proposal and does not include a 2nd camera or running of additional cables or conduit. That could be a second project and should really affect overall cost i.e. it's not cheaper to do everything at once since the camera replacement would just go where the current camera is located and would not require any wiring changes. SEE THE PROPOSAL AT THE END OF THIS AGENDA.

6. Office Minister Julie Altenbach reports she and the Office Angels:

- a) Helped prepare and organize the monthly Ladies' Dinner
- b) Prepared "Soup and Sharing"
- c) Teamed with Angela Lopez to prepare lunches for Activate Youth Mission participants for their weeklong project.
- d) Assisted with Rummage Sale preparation
- e) Met with Church Librarian Regina Seguin and ordered requested furniture for the library.
- f) We are sorting and re-organizing the filing cabinets in the office workroom
- g) Continued working with Media Minister Vita Mazzaluna to advertise different events at COTM
- h) Called West End Lock to repair two doors.
- **C. Dying Trees**: West Tree service will remove our trees and grind the stumps when we get to the top of their list of jobs.
- D. Apprentice Rector: The Wardens and several members of the Vestry, Clergy Team, and Staff met on August 2 with the Rev. Jonathan French, rector of Grace Church Ocala and the steward of the Diocesan Grant for Residents to talk about our application for that grant. Jonathan wanted to discover if we saw ourselves as a "teaching church" much like a teach hospital that trains new residents for practical medicine. He was encouraged to hear that it's not only the Rector who sees us as that.
 - 1. We got the grant! Jonathan and the Rev. Dr. Canon Justin Holcomb, the Diocesan Canon for Vocations will work out the details of how and when we'll start receiving the money.

- 2. Tom Rutherford is joining Jonathan, Canon Justin, and Bishop Greg Brewer at RADVOCO (the RADical VOCation Conference) in Dallas, Texas in September, which is a conference recruiting people to seek ordination as clergy. They are promoting our diocese, pitching the idea of Parish Residencies, and fishing for the person God has to be our Apprentice Rector.
- 3. Seminarian Laura Cook will also be there representing her seminary Wycliffe College in Toronto, Canada.

III. DISCUSSION- :

A. Upgrading our video equipment: live streaming our worship and other events has become another vital ministry and the "front door" through which most of our new visitors find us and check us out before coming in person. We assembled our equipment quickly in response to the emerging pandemic in early 2020, and now, 20 months later, we see some things that could enhance our video presence and presentation.

1. PLEASE SEE THE PROPOSAL FROM MEDIA MINISTER VITA MAZZALUNA AT THE END OF THIS AGENDA.

- 2. Vita researched the prices for all her suggestions and had those numbers for us.
- 3. She was at the meeting to answer questions and explain her proposal.
- 4. The vestry approved the purchase of the camera now to have the 2nd camera to allow for live streaming from both the church and the new parish hall, avoid a potential price increase and/or having to wait on a potential back order. We will revisit purchasing the other equipment as needed.
- B. The Stained-Glass Windows in the Prayer Chapel are deteriorating. Several of the chunks of glass have fallen out, costing several hundred dollars each to fix.
 - 1. Willet Architectural Glass Company cold called us to offer to appraise our stained glass and give us a bid for any repairs we might need. Tom Rutherford accepted their offer.
 - 2. Most of the windows need no attention, so we got appraisals.
 - a) The 11 windows telling the story of Jesus are worth \$9,075 each.
 - b) The 2 windows behind the altar with the crosses on them are worth \$10,725 each.
 - c) The round window over the choir area is worth \$21,600.
 - d) The two fish windows over the Narthex doors are worth \$4,500 each.
 - e) That's \$151,875 worth of windows!
 - 3. The 3 chunky windows in the prayer chapel are worth \$9,713 and need attention.
 - a) Willet will remove the windows, put in a temporary weather barrier in the openings, ship the windows to their workshop in Minnesota, disassemble them, clean them, reassemble them, ship them back, and reinstall them for \$17,217, and it would take 5-6 months to do the job.
 - b) OR... we can install up-to-code windows on the outside of the deteriorating stained glass to seal them off from the weather. Current building Codes will not allow us to just put plexiglass on the outside of those windows. We don't have a price for this option.
 - c) OR... we can brick up where the windows are and put statues in the alcoves. We have no price for this option.
 - d) OR... we can brick up the openings and stucco over them to have a bare exterior wall. We have no price for this option.

4. WHAT DO YOU THINK?

- C. **Painting the big cross at the corner of Tilden and Woodland:** When we had the lift to paint the bell tower, we also tried to paint the big cross... but gold metallic paint was not available at Sherwin Williams. Iggie the Sherwin Williams' guy came out to look at the project and give us options. They are:
 - 1. Paint it ourselves, which will cost about \$400 in materials PLUS renting a lift to get to it PLUS renting a High Volume Low Pressure Sprayer to apply the primer, 2 coats of paint, and sealer.
 - 2. Have a professional painter do the job. Iggie is sending a couple of painting contractors over to give us bids. That didn't happen before the vestry meeting so we didn't have those numbers to consider.
 - 3. WHAT DO YOU THINK?

IV. DECISIONS: (Usually based on the Discussion last month)

A. Upgrading our video equipment:

The vestry approved the purchase of the camera now to have the 2^{nd} camera to allow for live streaming from both the church and the new parish hall, avoid a potential price increase and/or having to wait on a potential back order. We will revisit purchasing the other equipment as needed.

 - 1. The Finance Committee of Don Greer, Treasurer Bob Tate, Finance Minister Jane Cartelli, helper Stephanie Abell, and Rector Tom Rutherford met on August 6 to discuss how to make the financial reports easier.
 - 2. Operating Income last month was \$14,539.45 LESS than Expenses, DECREASING our year-to-date SURPLUS to \$4,346.81.
 - 3. Building Fund net income last month was \$3,256.39 LESS than our \$11,996.01 monthly mortgage and other expenses, INCREASING our year-to-date DEFICIT to \$18,178.40.

Sanctuary Live Streaming Camera Upgrade Proposal 2021 Prepared by: Vita Mazzaluna, Media Minister, August 9, 2021

Live Streaming our 9:30am church service has allowed us to reach remote parishioners and church shoppers.

This proposal will discuss several options for upgrading our live streaming equipment, providing a better viewing experience, and simplifying the streaming process for our Tech Team volunteers.

Component and Software Discussion (see attached sheet for pricing breakdown):

PTZ (Pan, Tilt, Zoom) Camera

Resolution

We currently have a 10x Optical Zoom USB PTZ (Pan Tilt Zoom) camera.

Desired Upgrade: 20x Optical zoom NDI PTZ camera

We would like a higher resolution camera that can zoom in closer to improve the video quality and have more preset settings, so the volunteer running the livestream can switch between close-ups on people speaking, medium shots of the altar during the Consecration, the musicians and singers during musical numbers, and wide shots of the whole room to begin and end.

Interface

We would also like to upgrade to NDI (Network Device Interface) which means the camera is controlled over the cabled network, allowing us greater control with less cabling and higher/faster video quality.

We would also have the ability to provide power through the Cat 5/6 cabling due to POE (Power Over Ethernet) capabilities. This will allow us more placement flexibility as we would have the option to place the camera in a location in the sanctuary that does not have power available. If we upgrade to additional cameras down the line, NDI/POE would be beneficial for compatibility reasons.

<u>Software</u>

OBS (Open Broadcast Software)

The free software that we use to convert the video received from the camera to live stream quality/ specifications is called OBS (Open Broadcast Software). There are features available in OBS that would allow for a more professional level production but that we are unable to take advantage of with our current camera.

Camera controls – with the camera I am recommending, there is a free software download that will allow us to have up to 9 camera angle and zoom presets. Currently, we have 3 (wide, zoomed on altar space, zoomed and panned to the lectern). We would like to have the flexibility to have other views.

If we add additional cameras down the line, we would also be able to utilize smoother transitions between scenes.

USB Hub

A USB hub that allows us to plug in more accessories to the computer through the USB ports may be necessary to enable us to connect the Stream Deck and the other necessary devices to the laptop. They range from \$9-40.

<u>Stream Deck</u>

A stream deck is a device that allows scene switching in the streaming interface with the touch of a button.

A stream deck would be used in addition to the free OBS camera controls – the stream deck would just move the controls from the software to the push of a button instead.

Each button can be programmed to operate the camera, switch between Windows Programs, etc. This would allow us to set up the service order on the stream deck and label the buttons (likely numbered) so that volunteers would just follow along with the bulletin, pressing the coordinating button to transition the camera(s).

Ex. There would be a button for each camera angle/zoom, there would be buttons for switching between slides in PowerPoint, etc. Therefore, the volunteers would not have to worry about switching between remote controls or software program windows on the computer when they want to change camera views, potentially losing the correct timing of progressing the Power Point slides.

The button setup/labeling would make life MUCH easier for our volunteers, many of whom are nervous about the technology and who are not confident about being able to fix any glitches that happen during the service.






