

We get to start our new Church Year with fewer restrictions from Bishop Greg Brewer as he is giving rectors more freedom to deal with the pandemic as is most appropriate in their setting.

**COVID** Rules Relax!

- + We may pass the plates at the Offering instead of the ushers using the long-handled baskets.
- + We may resume events with food! So Coffee Hours, Sunday Night Suppers, and Men's Suppers are back!
- + Sunday Suppers start November 28 with a Pot-Luck. Bring your Thanksgiving leftovers, and we'll help you get rid of them!
- + Women's Suppers will continue as they are now: Bring Your Own or pay \$15 for a catered meal.
- Men's Supper will stay the same for one more month: you may Bring-Your-Own or Pay \$15 for Barbecue on December 7. But Wally's Fish Fry will be back on January 4! And after that the guys will take turns providing the supper.

 We may resume Communion by Intinction (dipping the wafer in the cup of wine instead of drinking from the Common Cup). We'll do that by offering the individual servings of Communion that we've used through the pandemic on one side of the altar rail, and have the wafers and a chalice of wine on the other side for you to take the wafer and dip it in the cup. We'll have Dippers and Sippers! When the Bishop allows us to drink from the Common Cup, we'll return to our pre-pandemic tradition of letting you sip or dip on both sides of the altar rail.

For those who choose to continue to wear masks, avoid physical contact, and/or keep your distance from people, we respect your caution and will interact with you as closely or distantly as you are comfortable.

For those who choose to remain at home, or who miss a Sunday service, we will continue livestreaming our 9:30am and 4pm worship services and posting the 5pm Diving Deeper New Testament course online, and we'll continue offering Mail-Out Communion to our folks at home or who live too far away to be with us in-person.

The pandemic has not yet passed completely... but things are getting better!

Please continue praying for COVID to GO AWAY!

#### 2021 November Vestry Minutes Thursday \* November 18, 2021, \* 6 pm

I. <u>FORMATION</u>: Ron Lancioni lead Compline. Based on Psalm 136:1-3: "Give thanks to the LORD!" Tom Rutherford invited us to share what we are thanking God for in our life and in our Church right now.

## II. INFORMATION:

## A. Vestry Ministry Team Reports:

- 1. Outreach Team: Doreen Stachowski reports:
  - a) Our team has been busy with all of the preparations for Thanksgiving gift baskets, Foster Friends of Central Florida Christmas gifts, and the Edgewood Children's Ranch Christmas pizza party. We have been blessed to have a great group that serve God through this ministry.
  - b) Several parishioners signed up for our Team in The Messiah's Way.
  - c) Our next meeting is in early February, 2022 to plan our budget to assist the ministries we want to serve in the new year.

## 2. Ladies' Night Out: Wendy King reports,

- a) We had 19 vendors this year, including one that drove 560 miles to attend.
- b) 10 of our vendors were parishioners.
- c) Of the 57 items donated this year for our online auction, 10 items did not sell.
- d) 14 items came from our rummage sale.
- e) Six of the rummage sale items sold for a total of \$81.
- f) Last year we had 16 vendors and 33 items on our online auction, with only one item not sold.
- g) Our auction sales netted \$1,578.42 after expenses.
- h) Thank you to all of our volunteers and vendors who donated their time, talents, and gifts. We couldn't have pulled off this event without you.
- i) Thank you to the following companies who sponsored our event Babione, Kuehler, and Company; Signco, Architectural Signage Corp; Mike the Mechanic; Kelly's Foods; Celestial Center Massage; and Creative Concrete of Central, FL.
- j) And thank you to the following companies who gave large gifts toward our online auction: Plantation Jewelers; Palm Casual; Lake Meadow Naturals; West Orange Country Club; The Local Butcher; Driftwood Market; Writer's Block Bookstore; Polka Dotz Jewelry & Gifts; Trades of Hope.

# **B. Staff Reports:**

1. Children of the Messiah Preschool: The Financial Report was emailed separately.

#### 2. Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports:

- a) Children's Church: We are continuing with the "Jesus in Jeans" curriculum and have been learning that Jesus felt the same things we feel. He experienced fear, "bullying" and feeling alone, so he understands when we feel those things. We have talked a lot about the Holy Spirit living in us and being with us always and how that is a wonderful gift from God. We have welcomed a couple of new friends at the 9:30 service. They have been a wonderful addition! The children are showing a lot of enthusiasm for memorizing their focus facts and focus verses. 11 o'clock service has a group of regulars who love to ask deep questions. We sometimes take a detour from the lesson for the day, but that is fine by me! I have kids from both services and some who only attend SHINE in the cast for the Christmas pageant. We have been practicing every Sunday and it is going together nicely.
- b) SHINE: The bulk of our time has been spent preparing for Christmas, learning lines, positions, songs, and hand motions. I shopped Goodwill and found some really cool items to use as costumes and I will be letting one of our artists help with the scene setters. Trunk our Treat went really well. Many of our families and families from the preschool came out. We had loads of visitors who were thrilled with the availability of dinner for the kids so they were not eating only candy all evening long. We gave out 120 hotdogs, 100 bags of chips, 140 juice boxes, and many totes full of candy. Many of the participants are planning their themes for next year. HUGE high fives and many thanks to all of the participants and donors this year!
- c) Nursery: Our usual caregiver has requested a 3-week break as she is trying out a new, higher-paying job. In her absence, I have recruited Miss Kaila who works in the preschool. She is fabulous with kids and is super loving. In the event that Bailey does not choose to return, Kaila would like to stay on. I am praying for her mother and grandmother to attend our church as well. They visited at 11 o'clock one Sunday and really enjoyed it. We are lacking in high school-college age girls to sub in the nursery and babysit for our church members, if you would like to offer your services, please reach out to me via text or email.
- d) Outreach: Thanksgiving baskets will be packed and passed out this week. I will be visiting Dillard Street Elementary this week to drop off some baskets and will collect the names of children in need of Christmas gifts so I can set up the angel tree. I was contacted by a parishioner whose employer is looking to sponsor a family for Christmas. They asked if I knew of anyone. I was able to find a family of four children as well as a mother and grandparents who could use a blessing. Dillard Street has asked if we could sponsor one of their 12 days of Christmas for the teachers by donating a meal or treats. I will connect with Deacon Julie as we usually partner up for these activities.
- e) Upcoming events: Acolyte pizza party, Friendsgiving at SHINE, My heart grew three sizes Christmas party and The Christmas Eve pageant.

#### 3. Facilities Minister Jeremy Adams reports:

- a) Maintenance Minister Kara Altenbach "retired," and Matthew Barrett, son of parishioners Bill & Kathy Barrett (who made all the banners in the church), started this month in Kara's place. He's enthusiastic about helping the church by serving in this role.
- b) This month starts a busy season for our facilities that will continue into 2022. We hosted a Broad-way revue called "All Together Now" presented by the Horizon West Theater Company on November 12th. The Horizon West Theater Company youth theater program is presenting "Once Upon a Mattress" on December 3rd and 4th with rehearsals on the evenings of November 29th December 2nd. The Messiah School for the Arts winter concert is on the evening of December 10th.
- c) In addition to the many church events during the Advent and Christmas seasons, we have some private rentals on the horizon including an event on New Year's Eve, another theater rental in January, and three weddings in the first quarter of 2022.
- d) Thank you to everyone who has congratulated Garine and me in the past few weeks concerning our pregnancy announcement, and also another deep, heartfelt thanks to everyone that has come to talk to me about my call to the diaconate. I'm constantly humbled by the love and support that you all provide here at the Church of the Messiah.

- 4. Media Minister Vita Mazzaluna has requested a change in job title to Tech Minister. Tom Rutherford approved. She reports, things are certainly picking up! With more events and activities happening, some of the areas I've been working on have grown.
  - a) Office Minister Julie Altenbach and I have set up an advertising planning board in her office to track everything we will publicize. We call it the "Wall of Wow!" Please come check it out!
  - b) December 8th, Julie is going to assist me with presenting an Internet and Tech safety class for parishioners. With the holidays coming, we want to make sure our Messiah Family are not misled by phishing texts or emails that could certainly put a damper on the joy of the season. Regina Seguin knew of a fantastic resource for us so we will be using that and adding any "tidbits" that might be specific to our population.
  - c) I have spent a fair amount of time this month troubleshooting some livestream video quality issues. My husband Romeo, who is wise with computers, assisted by optimizing some router settings and lending us a switch so that the computer and camera are able to speak to one another more directly. I also installed some firmware upgrades. I did not realize we wouldn't receive notifications about those, so I have now added firmware update checks to my regular checklist.
  - d) We've had some mysterious glitches with our Sunday livestreams, but the livestream on November 14 was TOTALLY glitch free! Thank you, Romeo, PTZOptics support, and God (for answering MANY prayers!).
  - e) I helped Children's Minister Angela Lopez get her laptop able to print to the small printer she has in her office.
  - f) I have been gradually chipping away at creating "How-to" documentation for various aspects of our online services and will continue to work on that. The Livestream "How-to" has been updated, and I created a "How-to" for ensuring the correct profile is loaded in the Sanctuary for the sound board.
  - g) Romeo also installed some additional memory in the new computer and worked on a few other items for me.
  - h) Romeo and I conceptualized, and our son Donny designed and 3D printed a temporary mount for the USB camera from the Church to be installed in the Parish Hall. It's not the ideal height, but it will allow us to use the camera now while we search for a better option.
  - i) That camera is now mounted and installed! I will make all the tweaks this week, so we can go live from the Parish Hall.
  - (j) With the USB camera installed, we will now have a better livestream for the Messiah School for the Arts Concert on December 10.
  - k) I have been trying (and failing) to stay close to 10 hours/week. Since the beginning of September, I have only been at 10-11 hours three times. All other weeks I have been at 12-15+. The reason I am "failing" is that I keep having to push "to-do" list items to subsequent weeks and I was feeling behind, so I decided to just get the stuff done, even if that meant going over. I keep thinking that once I get "this next thing done" that I will be able to have a slow week, but it doesn't work out that way. I absolutely love what I do so this report is only that, to keep the Vestry apprised of the time being spent.

#### 5. Messiah School for the Arts Co-Director Garine Adams reports:

- a) Our next recital is December 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm. It will be livestreamed as well as open for the public. We are continuing to fill up our lesson schedules, so thank you all for the prayers!
- b) Drama club for middle/high school students meets weekly on Thursdays from 3-5 pm in the Parish Hall. Their first production will be sometime in May 2022. They've picked the director and are on their way to putting on a great show!
- c) The Friday morning Mommy and Me style class with Becky Sego is from 10-11 am on Friday mornings and is going great! Lots of laughter and smiles.
- d) Messiah Youth Band is playing music for our children's Christmas Eve service this year. We are very excited about leading the children in song.

#### 6. Office Minister Julie Altenbach reports:

Julie Altenbach reports she and the Office Angels:

- a) Hosted a thank you and orientation luncheon for Office Angels that served last year and the new Angels that will serve this year.
- b) Created a new schedule so the office is covered every day with everyone who signed up through Messiah's Way to serve as an Office Angel, and utilized the members who volunteered to be substitutes.
- c) Planned and ordered the Men's Supper from Ellie Lou's BBQ
- d) Our youngest Office Angel prepared the bags for Ms. Angela's Trunk or Treat. She is 13 and will be working on special projects.
- e) Worked with Messiah Librarian Regina Seguin to order furniture and supplies for the library.
- f) Worked with Tech Minister Vita Mazzaluna on an organizational system to keep track of all the ways we advertise and communicate events at COTM.

#### 7. Volunteer Youth Minister Garine Adams reports:

- a) The youth group is starting to grow! Our average attendance is 14 on Sundays. It's been really fun getting to know everyone, playing games, and learning about God's Word. We have been diving into the Identity and how to choose the right path over the past few weeks.
- b) Alive Ministries High School Boy's retreat is November 19-21<sup>st</sup> at North Florida Christian Service Camp in Keystone Heights, FL. The cost is \$75, and there are some scholarships available. We still have room for one more boy if you know of any high school aged guy that would like to make some new friends and have a great weekend with the guys. Please contact Garine Adams with any questions. I'll be heading out with the church van Friday night and return Sunday afternoon. Sign up at NFCSC.org as soon as you can. Spots tend to fill up quickly for these awesome weekends.
- c) The Girl's Retreat this past weekend went wonderfully, and the girls had a lovely time worshipping and growing in their faith. Each attendee came back wanting to share what they learned about their worth in God's eyes.
- d) We've begun planning our Summer 2022 Mission Week. Please check in with Garine Adams if you'd like to be a part or help with the funding. Did you know that more than half of our youth group speaks Haitian Creole? We are planning to stay in Florida and are looking to work with the people in the Pine Hills area as well as other places that are primarily Haitian Creole speaking areas of Central Florida so we can use our strengths and resources well. Father Soner and I are planning to start contacting the businesses in those areas as well as partnering with some outreach programs already in place.

- **C. Apprentice Rector:** There is nothing new to report and probably won't be until next spring, when seminarians are in their last semester.
- **D. Vestry Nominations:** Tom Rutherford gave the list of the 16 possible nominees to the retiring vestry members (Ron Bouton, Wendy King, Brian Seguin, and Joyce Taylor) to contact in early December to see if they're willing to stand for election.
- **E. Diocesan Convention** is Friday evening and Saturday January 28-29, 2022, in Daytona Beach. All our Clergy are delegates. We get three Lay Delegates and up to three Alternate Lay Delegates. One Lay Delegate needs to be a Vestry Member. Marci Babione, Chris Brown, and Wendy King volunteered, and Tom Rutherford recruited Jeremy Adams, Angela Lopez, and Mary Kay Predmore. Next month we'll choose which are Delegates and which are Alternates.
- **F. Tim Wetherington** reported to us about our investments of the gift from the Britt Trust. They have earned about \$100,000 since the gift was given!

# III. DISCUSSION (to help make a decision next month):

**A. West Tree Service** gave us a bid of \$5,800 to trim our oak and cypress trees and remove the Spanish Moss. Since West Tree is 6-7 weeks out on their jobs, Sarah Wolfe suggests we add this to 2022's budget now, and it may be January before they can get to us. Wally will check into the feasibility of doing this ourselves and get back to us next month with a report.

### IV. DECISIONS (usually based on the Discussion last month):

- **A. Endorsing Laura Cook for Ordination to the Transitional Diaconate:** This is the last step before her ordination! Vestry unanimously endorsed her.
- **B. 2022 First Draft Budget** was emailed to you last month, and we discussed it last month. The Finance Committee looked over it last night and recommends adopting it as presented. The vestry had several questions. Treasurer Bob will chase down those answers, and we'll reconsider this next month.
- **C. \$50,000 gift**: We received a gift of \$50,000 in memory of Lynne Passilla. Her husband Jim doesn't have anywhere he requests it go, so Vestry decides. The vestry decided to put the money into the operating account to decrease our deficit.

  - 1. Operating Income last month was \$25,793.69 MORE than Expenses, DECREASING our

year-to-date DEFICIT to \$18,040.85.

2. Building Fund net income last month was \$926.59 MORE than our \$11,996.01 monthly mortgage and other expenses, DECREASING our year-to-date DEFICIT to \$5,104.08.

The meeting closed with prayer and adjourned at 8:01 p.m.

This month I finished one book—<u>God's Gift of Christmas</u> by John MacArthur—and a DVD I found in the library—<u>Christmas With a Capital "C."</u>

The book had no really new information in it. It was very basic. But Dr. MacArthur put the cookies on the lower shelf so the children could reach them. And the points he makes after going through all the characters involved are still excellent points, the chief goal of which is to keep the reader from missing Christmas. It would be especially good for a child, to make it clear to him or her what Christmas is really about. (Of course, it never hurts for adults to review the basics, either.)

Pretty much the same can be said about the movie, <u>Christmas With a Capital "C."</u> The story is along the lines of <u>The Grinch That Stole Christmas</u>. A man comes to a small Alaskan town where his former high school classmate is now mayor. Having a grudge against the mayor (and against Christians in general and God in particular) he goes to court to stop the town from displaying the Nativity scene on public property. At first, panic sets in, until the mayor's wife convinces the mayor that Christmas doesn't really need these trappings, and that his classmate is right to expect Christians to behave differently. I personally enjoyed watching it.




