

The Standing WHAT????

At the Diocesan Convention in 2021, I was elected to the Standing Committee of the Diocese. After Diocesan Convention this year, the Standing Committee elected me as its President. Here's what that means.

The Standing Committee (SC) is a "council of advice to the Bishop," it has a role in ordinations, and some other responsibilities. Our national Canons (church law) require one in each Diocese. There are 7 members: 4 clergy and 3 lay.

As a council of advice to the Bishop, we meet monthly to pray with and for him, to let him bounce ideas and issues off us, and to offer our wisdom as seems appropriate.

In ordinations, we have several assignments:

We certify that people who are seeking ordination have satisfied all the requirements of the Canons (we have a checklist to follow), and we interview each person to ensure there is "no sufficient objection on medical, psy-chological, moral, or spiritual grounds" to ordaining them.

Those interviews are serious, because we are one of four entities who can say "Yes" or "No" to whether someone continues toward ordination or not. The person's Rector, their Vestry, and the Bishop are the other 3. If any of those four say "No," that person will not be ordained.

We also weigh in on every Bishop Election in the 111 dioceses of the Episcopal Church. When a diocese elects someone to be their bishop, a majority of the current bishops and a majority of the Standing Committees in those dioceses must consent to that election before the person may be consecrated a Bishop. If less than 56 bishops or 56 Standing Committees withhold consent, the electing diocese has to start all over and elect someone else to be their bishop.

And the final two BIG roles of the SC – and the ones we do the least – is to be the "Ecclesiastical Authority" in the absence of a bishop and to design and oversee the process of electing a new Bishop when the old one retires or dies. "Ecclesiastical Authority" means SC makes all the decisions assigned to the Bishop, if the bishop dies or resigns suddenly, before the diocese has time to elect a new bishop.

The last role of the SC is to oversee elections of new bishops... which kicked in this past January when Bishop Greg Brewer announced that he's retiring in July 2023. For the next 16 months we will be searching for the person God has to be our next bishop, to carry out an election for that person, to work that bishop-elect through the consent process, and get him or her consecrated.

Our national Canons are vague about HOW to do a bishop's election. They pretty much say only "The Standing Committee will oversee the election." That leaves it up to each SC to design and carry out a process that fits its own diocese, and that's what our SC has been doing since this time last year, when Bishop Greg let us know his retirement date. Since then:

- We formulated the rules for our election: who may nominate someone and how.
- We chose 15 people from around the diocese to be our Search Committee: to accept nominations, get to know each nominee, do background checks on them, and present a slate of 3-5 candidates by the end of this September.
- We appointed Father Chris Rodriguez, rector of Trinity Church in Vero Beach, and my predecessor as President of the Standing Committee, as Chair of the Search Committee. He has 7 lay persons and 7 clergy on that team, and they are feverishly at work on their tasks.
- We hired Father Gary Butterworth as our Election Consultant to help us through the process. Dioceses don't do these elections often enough to get good at them our last one was in 2011 and Gary is trained by the Episcopal Church to know all the nooks and crannies of such elections, so we don't drop any balls or let anything slip through the cracks.
- Gary led a 2-day retreat with the Standing Committee and the Search Committee to help us get to know one another and orient everyone to the tasks ahead.
- We laid out a timeline for the Search, Election, and Consecration, and got dates from the national office of the Episcopal Church. We can't consecrate a new bishop without the Presiding Bishop there as Chief Consecrator, so we needed to get on his calendar!
- We built a website to communicate all the details of the process: www.DCFSearch.org

We did all that BEFORE Bishop Greg formally announced his retirement at Diocesan Convention this past January.

Since then, we've chosen a Transition Team, who will shepherd our candidates when they visit us in-person this fall; put on the Electing Convention on January 14, 2023; help our bishop-elect find a new home and move; and coordinate the Consecration on June 10, 2023.

These next 16 months will be BUSY for our Standing Committee, and as the President, they'll be EXTRA busy for me as I shepherd the Standing Committee as we shepherd our Diocese.

B. Staff Reports:

- 1. Children of the Messiah Preschool Director Barbara Ellerbe emailed the Financial Report separately.
- 2. Children's Minister Angela Lopez reports:
 - a) In Children's Church we finished up our series on the BIG questions Jesus asked. Several of the girls learned the memory verses and received prizes from the treasure box. We enjoyed a Valentine lesson in which we learned John 3:16 and talked about God loving us first. We will be moving on to a series called NORMAL? Before transitioning to Lent.
 - b) SHINE kids have been continuing to "Eat this Book". We are working through Matthew right now. The kids have been using art, Legos, and short skits to recreate the lessons we read out loud. Each week they are giving a selection of scripture to read aloud to their family. Doing this gives them 5 bonus points towards the Sky Zone trip.
 - c) I have been working on VBS and have several volunteers in place. I am still looking for more! I will create a VBS information station on the kids table in the next couple of weeks to stir up interest and to circulate my wish list.
 - d) This month I am participating in the Bible Creative Conference. 3 days of guest speakers equipping and encouraging Children's Ministry workers to teach and reach. I also have the great privilege to judge a 5th grade oration contest at Dillard Street Elementary. I participated in the Dio Convention viewing party, served at a funeral and attended a speaking engagement of one of my favorite Christian authors. I participated in the vestry retreat dinner and attended a 3-hour outreach meeting. It has been a busy few weeks, just the way I like it.

3. Facility Minister Jeremy Adams reports:

- a) The new year has been off to a great start for our facilities. What I'm most excited about is newly forming partnerships with the community. The Nurture Place will be offering Caregiver Yoga on the 2nd and 4th Monday each month starting at 8:30am in the Parish Hall, one of our neighbors approached us about moving their homeschool German class to our Parish Hall once a week, and I've been working with the local Daughters of the American Revolution chapter to potentially host a tea party in our Parish Hall. This is in addition to the Horizon West Theater Company renting the Youth Hall on Thursday evenings and Saturday mornings, the Messiah School for the Arts Drama Club meeting in the Parish Hall every Thursday at 3pm, and Becky's Milestones through Music preschool class every Friday morning at 10am.
- In the next month we have the Virtual Youth Revival in the Parish Hall (2/18/22) two weddings (2/19/22 and 3/12/22), a funeral (2/19/22), a Daughters of the King Deanery meeting (2/26/22), a study session for Diaconate Postulants (2/28/22), Diocese Vestry Training (3/5/22). Looking a little further ahead, we'll be having a campus workday on March 26th. - 4. Finance Minister Jane Cartelli had nothing to report.
- 5. Messiah School for the Arts Co-Director Garine Adams reports:
 - a) Our next recital is April 8th at 6:30pm. It will be livestreamed as well as open for the public. We are continuing to fill up our lesson schedules, so thank you all for the prayers! We are pleased to welcome our newest music teacher to our team, Kevin Wellmaker. He's an elementary music teacher by day, and ukulele, piano, and voice instructor for us in the evenings. He will be taking on Gariné's students as she prepares for maternity leave.
 - b) Drama Club for middle/high school students is having a performance on May 13th of" Clue." Come be part of this event. Doors open at 6:30pm.
 - c) Our Friday morning Mommy and Me style class with Becky Sego from 10-11am on Friday mornings is going great! Lots of giggles.
 - d) Messiah Youth Band played for our second Youth Revival February 2022, and we plan to continue this event each year.
- 6. Music Ministers Linda Ellison and Jeremy Adams had nothing to report.
- 7. Office Minister Julie Altenbach reports: We added two new Office Angels and are blessed to have many honorary Office Angels, who help with special projects. In January we:
 - a) Compiled, prepared, and published the Annual Parish Report
 - b) Coordinated with the Diocese and with the help of Father Tom and Debbie Rutherford, ordered and set up a small reception for Laura Cook and the other Ordinands and their family and friends at her ordination.
 - c) I went to Canterbury Retreat Center and assisted the Diocesan Staff for the Virtual Diocese Convention
 - d) Ordered lunch and set up breakfast in the library for our Diocesan Delegates and Clergy as they gathered to watch the convention online.
 - e) Helped set up the tables in the library with Church Librarian, Regina Seguin. (Look for information about an Open House)
 - f) Continued to coordinate with Tech Minister and ministry leaders to inform and advertise the different events for COTM.

8. Tech Minister Vita Mazzaluna reports:

- a) I created instruction pages for how to set up the live streams each week and how to separate out the sermon from the livestream recording each week.
- b) I programmed a button onto our website that links directly to Laura Cook's ordination livestream and kept it up through the end of February.
- c) We did a livestream for the Annual Meeting and I ran the tech booth during the meeting.
- d) I updated the Virtual Youth Revival registration from last year and created an updated details and registration page as well as scheduled the livestream. The Youth Revival is on February 18.
- e) The Tech Class co-facilitated with Office Minister Julie Altenbach in February had 7 participants. We showed the class how to navigate our website to find various links and documents as well as how to best navigate the COTM YouTube and Facebook pages AND how to sign up for Amazon Smile so that any qualifying Amazon purchases earn COTM some donation dollars! We are excited to have people attending and are looking at dates for March now.
- f) Children's Minister Angela Lopez got a tip from other Children's Ministers about a "hack" to notify her when it's time to wrap-up Children's Church on Sunday and head back to the main service. It utilizes Smart plugs/devices that work over WiFi. We are working on getting her test system setup using a Smart Plug that I had at home and a super fun neon Hippo. We are having an issue with being able to get on the same WiFi network at the same time because the Youth Hall does not pick up the guest WiFi and the Sanctuary needs the secure network for the livestream. My husband Romeo is working on mapping out all the routers and trying to figure out the issue. (Which, of course, will help the campus WiFi overall, not just for "the hippo.") He may seek out some volunteer teammates to diagnose the issue and help with labeling/mapping/cleaning up the current network infrastructure. If anyone enjoys doing that sort of thing and would be interested in helping with that, let me know and I will hook you up with Romeo. vitamazzaluna@churchofthemessiah.com
- g) COTM had a power outage on Saturday February 5 that zapped the HVAC computer system. Romeo replaced the power supply on the computer and got it back up and running. However, the HVAC unit seemed to have been affected and MC² (the company that supplied our HVAC controls) fixed the issue.
- h) I have submitted to Google Nonprofits for access to the COTM Nonprofit account so that I can submit an online advertising grant. We hope to be able to use that for drawing folks to our services and parish events as well as to the facilities rental spaces.
- i) I also participated in a meeting with Facilities Minister Jeremy Adams, Office Minister Julie, Wendy King, and Stephanie Abell regarding ideas on publicizing and drawing the public in to see our facilities' rental spaces.
- j) As requested by Jeremy, I created advertising for a bulletin insert, the web homepage slider, and our Sunday ads slides to ensure that our Messiah family knows about the Parishioner rental rate of \$20/hour AND that they can utilize spaces for free for Bible studies and other ministries.

9. Volunteer Youth Minister Garine Adams reports:

a) Our Youth Revival in February was virtual for the second year in a row, and we plan to be in person for 2023. This year we have most of the central Florida Episcopal Churches involved as well as a few interdenominational churches in and around our area.

- b) We've begun planning our Summer 2022 Mission Week. Please check in with Gariné Adams if you'd like to be a part or help with the funding. We will be bringing our youth with us to North Florida Christian Camp in Keystone, FL, for a week of worship arts and service camp for high school age students, join our Diocese for Soul in the City outreach week in DeLand, and having a week of helping the community in Pine Hills. All of these are the weeklong projects that are in addition to some one day fun events like tubing, grilling, and outdoor sports this summer. While Gariné is out on maternity leave, a few parishioners that volunteer with the youth will step in to teach on their specialties each week to help our youth with things like finance and boundaries. We continue to meet from 5-6pm on Sundays in the youth hall, and some of us stay for supper at 6pm.
- C. Apprentice Rector: Tom Rutherford is in conversation with 5 potential candidates.

V. DISCUSSION (to help make a decision next month):

- A. **Our Investments:** Ron Lancioni and Wally Stewart pitched a plan to increase the return on our investments. Vestry had some questions, and Tom Rutherford will contact Tim Wetherington, our financial advisor for answers.
- B. The Lots on Woodland Street: We have a parishioner interested in buying them and might be willing to pay what we paid for them in 2006: \$300,000. Vestry authorized up to \$300 for Tom Rutherford and Beth Ann Carr to get an appraisal.

VI. **DECISIONS (usually based on the Discussion last month)**:

Diocesan Assessment: Vestry agreed that the Diocese may send the full assessment from what we pay them to the Episcopal Church.







I have two-and a-half books to review this month. I found the one I had intended for February: *Marriage: To Have And To Hold* by June Hunt; I read *I Heard God Laugh* by Matthew Kelly; and I got half-way through the book that the Messiah Book Club will be discussing next Thursday (Feb. 25th): *Find The Good* by Heather Lende.


I'll start with <u>Marriage: To Have And To Hold</u>. Obviously I thought it would be appropriate for February, but unfortunately, it's a month "late," if such information can ever be considered restricted to a certain month! Anyway, we all know how much planning goes into every detail of a wedding; doesn't it make sense to devote even more attention to the marriage? The book begins with God's definition of marriage, view of the marriage covenant, purpose for marriage, design for marriage, and heart for marriage. Then it addresses the differences between male and female tendencies, the basic desires of husbands and wives, and the Biblical basis for submission (each to the other). Then it talks about how unrealistic expectations can destroy a marriage, what makes up troubled vs. happy marriages, and solutions for avoiding or resolving the issues involved. I would definitely recommend it (as I would <u>Love, Period</u>, which I reviewed last month) for engaged and married couples.

The second, <u>*I Heard God Laugh*</u> by Matthew Kelly, is about developing a relational, conversational type of prayer. He talks about his own prayer journey, beginning with his tendency to pray, "Listen, Lord; Your servant is speaking." (Sound familiar? I must confess that I've done that a <u>*lot*</u>!) But he has a page on which he lists seven suggested steps in prayer (p.41), and he challenges the reader to commit to 10 minutes of praying a day in this way for 21 days. He promises that it will transform anyone's life the way it did his.

Finally, I'm halfway through <u>Find The Good</u> by Heather Lende, but that's more than enough for me to recommend it. The whole book seems to echo St. Paul's admonition in Philippians 4:8: "Finally brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things."

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PRESCHOOL & NEWS


