Questions for conversation with your family, Home Group, or a friend

- 1. When you were a child, what was your family's relationship with Church or Jesus? How did that influence you... or not?

- 3. Tell about a time you were disappointed with God. What did he do or not do? What did you do in response? And how has that experience influenced your relationship with God?
- 4. Who is someone in your life, that you're concerned about their salvation? What are you doing to nudge them toward Jesus?

PRAY:

- → Thanking God for those folks in your life who have loved you by "showing up."
- ◆ From #3 above: If you are still disappointed with God, tell him... and forgive him. If you now understand that situation and are no longer disappointed with God, thank him for getting you through that experience.
- → For that person you mentioned in #4 to soften toward Jesus, and for opportunities to nudge them toward Jesus by loving and serving them.
