

BETTER NUTRITION, BETTER TOMORROW

Our annual BFW Offering of Letters and Bread for Bread Bake Sale will be held TODAY, September 22 in the Fellowship Hall. Please stop by the BFW tables at the Coffee Hour after the service to sign and add comments to letters addressed to our NY delegation of U.S. Senators and House members, advocating that they protect programs vital for people struggling with hunger, malnutrition and poverty in our country and around the world.

Our 2019/2020 Offering of Letters will focus on global nutrition funds and urge Congress to support the bi-partisan Global Nutrition Resolution (H.Res.189/S. Res. 260) increasing global nutrition funding to \$250 million. This would provide more than 10 million women and 7 million children with nutrition programs, The surviving millions are at risk of irreversible stunting of body and brain development. For 151 million children under the age of 5 in Central America, South Asia and sub-Saharan Africa, stunting is a life sentence. Our BFW Offering of Letters will express our concern for this worldwide suffering and encourage our elected Congressional members to support the 2020 Global Nutrition Resolution. (www.bread.org)

- 4. To create an environment which reflects current society where participants can experience the impact of either having privilege or not having privilege, based on random and arbitrary characteristics.
- 5. To foster an understanding of the inter-relationship between power and privilege in relation to various cultural venues.
- 6. To enable participants to engage in thoughtful dialogue about ways in which to foster cultural appreciation throughout the church.

The participants are guided through five activities designed to enable each to recognize their own personal level of cultural humility in a non-threatening and non-judgmental environment. Lunch will be provided.
