READING FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT

The exploits of the early church

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a

cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

It is right and good to praise You at all times, Almighty God. You are the Love in which we were created; the Life that fills all life; Your Spirit in us empowers our praises, as we join with creatures in heaven and on earth in your song of love:

Holy, holy Lord, God of power and might.Heaven and earth are full of your glory: Hosanna in the highest.Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.

You are holy, most Holy God, and yet You have always walked with your people. When we turn away to pursue our own ways, you call us back to your way of truth and life. You made a way for your people through the waters; You made a way for your people through the wilderness; You made a way for your people through famine and war and exile. You are making a way for us through this time of disease and disruption.

In the fullness of time You sent Your own Son, Jesus Christ, to be the Way for us, Truth revealed, Life we are given in You. He called men and women to join Him in His ministry, broken, imperfect people transformed through His friendship into followers. And after His resurrection, He sent upon them His own Spirit, and gave them authority over demons and disease and death itself, sending them out in love to make disciples of all nations. So you call us to nurture your people, equipping us to release our gifts and joy for your mission of love, restoration and wholeness.

On the night He was handed over for us, our Lord Jesus Christ sat at supper with his friends. He told them they were chosen for joy, chosen to bear fruit, fruit that will last. He promised to be with them always, his life filling their lives as the vine nourishes its branches. And then He took bread, and gave thanks, broke the bread and gave it to them, saying,

"Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this to remember me."

After supper, He took the cup of wine; and when He had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this to remember me."

And so we remember, and are remembered, made whole again as Christ's Body. Send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, making them for us the Body and Blood of Christ; as in these last days You have poured out Your Spirit on all flesh.

Send your Spirit upon the offerings we have in our homes, that we might share in this feast of love and blessing. Send upon us your Spirit, to empower our ministry. Give us the fruits of patience, kindness, commitment; fill us with Christ's life, who himself showed us how to pour ourselves out for the world, whose life ever renews ours.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen.*
