The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. Celebrant Lift up your hearts.



"Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for to remember me."

After supper, he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks,
 he gave it to them, and said, **"Drink this, all of you:
 This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you
 for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this to remember me."**

Recalling his goodness and perfect love, **we come to be fed and renewed.**
 Send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts.
Let them be for us the Body and Blood of your Son.
 Fill us with your Holy Spirit. **Make us ready at all times
 to speak of the hope that is within us through knowing Jesus.**

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him,
 in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God,
 now and for ever. *And all the people said: AMEN.*

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

**Our Father in heaven, holy be Your name,
Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.
