THE WORD OF GOD

READING

Isaiah 52:7-10

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace,
who brings good news, who announces salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns."

Listen! Your sentinels lift up their voices, together they sing for joy; for in plain sight they see the return of the Lord to Zion. Break forth together into singing, you ruins of Jerusalem; for the Lord has comforted his people, he has redeemed Jerusalem. The Lord has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations; and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

THE GOSPEL

Luke 2:1-20

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Response: Glory to you, Lord Christ!

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called

Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.' And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!'

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.' So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Deacon: The Gospel of the Lord.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The people are invited to participate praying the words in bold type.

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People **We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

We love to praise you, God of power and might, on this night above all, when the song of the angels still rings in our ears, the smell of the straw and the chatter of the shepherds surrounds us, when we remember the story we love to tell again and again. And through that song, sung by shepherds and angels and kings, another sound comes to us, piercing the night:

The cry of a newborn babe, the Lord of all Life come in humblest flesh.

In these last days you have come to us, taking on our broken image, entering our world as a helpless child, like the helpless children we had become. Like us, you were born weak, helpless, among strangers. And so also you died for us, helpless, weak, among strangers.

In taking on our form you transformed us and made us again your friends.

In taking on our life you transformed life, and made it rich with possibility.

In taking on our death, you transformed death, and set us free to love you forever.

On the night You were handed over to suffering and death, Lord Jesus Christ, you took bread; and when you had given thanks, you broke it, and gave it to your disciples, and said,

"Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this to remember me."

After supper, you took the cup of wine; and when you had given thanks, you gave it to them, and said, **"Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this to remember me."**

So we come to this table to be reunited with Christ. Send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts.
