WE RECEIVE GOD'S WORD

READING FROM THE HEBREW BIBLE

Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, "Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING


The people are invited to participate praying the words in bold type.

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant.

Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

CHRIST CHURCH TUTORING PROGRAM - Children in our community have a deep need that people in this congregation are wonderfully equipped to meet: offering one-to-one tutoring online. Covid adjustments in our educational systems have left many children at risk of failing. Neal Bankenstein, who works with vulnerable children and families in the Charles County Public Schools, is helping us launch a tutoring program to give kids some extra help.

He and other administrators will refer children to us; we'll match them up with tutors who are comfortable with the needed subject matter, and we'll set up a time for tutoring to happen on Zoom. DIOCESAN CONVENTION - ONLINE Saturday, Jan 31, 8:30 am - 3:30 pm & Friday, Jan 29, 6:30 - 8:30 pm

As an Episcopal congregation, we are part of a larger entity - the Diocese of Washington (EDOW).

Convention is the yearly legislative meeting presided over by the bishop with the clergy and elected representatives of all congregations. It votes on the diocesan budget and other matters regarding the mission and ministry of the diocese. This year's convention will take place online via Zoom.
