



It is also a commitment to share with others in response to Jesus' command "You give them something to eat." When members bring their offerings to church on the appointed Sunday, all of those coins "make a joyful noise unto the Lord" as they are received and dedicated. All of the funds received go to support the work of the Corbin Presbyterian Food Pantry.

Book Group Movie Night – Sunday, June 9 at 6pm in the Library—The movie is "Mother's Day," a 2018 BBC drama based on the aftermath of the March 30, 1993 IRA bombing in Warrington, Cheshire, England. It tells how the actions of two mothers on opposite sides of the Irish Sea are brought together in the wake of this tragedy which killed two young children and injured dozens more as they were shopping for Mother's Day cards and gifts. It stars Vicky McClure as real-life Dubliner, Susan McHugh, who organized one of the largest peace rallies in Irish history just days after the bombing, and Anna Maxwell Martin as Wendy Parry, whose 12-year-old son, Tim, was killed in the attack. The film depicts the complexity of the "Troubles" that plagued Northern Ireland, Great Britain and the Irish Republic and the courage of these women whose actions ultimately played a part in the 1998 Belfast Good Friday Peace Agreement.

What happens when our expectations of how things should be are not met? When our world falls apart? How do we press onward when our tightly-knit plans unravel into loose threads? What do we become when our identity—or the path we're on—comes undone or changes direction? What if all of this is not the end we fear it will be?

In our unraveling, sometimes life surprise us with unexpected joy, love, and hope—with a new beginning we couldn't have imagined. Sometimes we need God to unravel us, for we long to be changed. This worship series explores 12 biblical stories of unraveled shame, identity, fear, grief, *and* joy, dreams and expectations. These are stories where God meets us in the unraveling of our plans—and us—into something new.

- Jeremiah 29:1-7 Encouraging the Israelites in Exile to Plant Gardens & Build Houses (When Dreams Unravel)
- John 4:1-29 The Samaritan Woman at the Well (Unraveled Shame)
- John 20:19-29 Doubting Thomas (When the Unimaginable Happens)
- Exodus 1:22, 2:1-10 Moses' Mother Gives Up So He Can Live (When Our Plans for Our Children Unravel)
- Job 28:12-28 Job's Lament and Loss (Seeking Understanding When Everything Has Fallen Apart)
- Mark 5:1-20 Jesus Heals a Legion, a Man Possessed by Demons (The Unraveling of the Mind)
