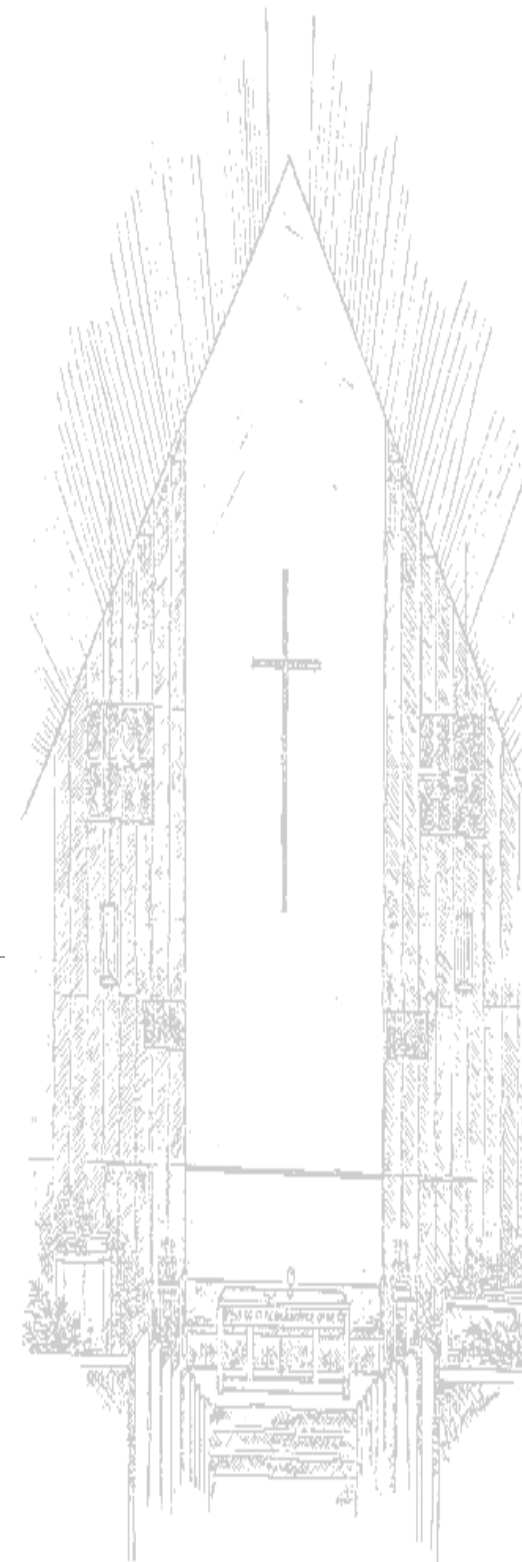

In the Bulb There Is a Flower 250

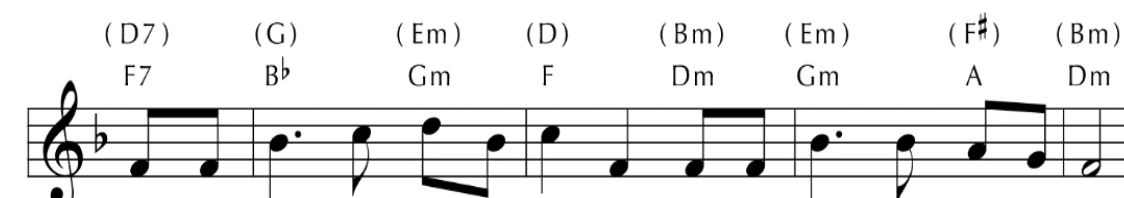
Hymn of Promise
