As we begin a new church year, this Advent marks the end of an extremely tumultuous calendar year. COVID-19, civil rights protests, the U.S. Presidential election—these events, among many, many others, are disrupting and reorienting our lives. In the midst of great loss and hardship, new possibilities and realities are being revealed to us. Often, our dreams are wildly disorienting—they don't always make sense, They throw us off kilter. Sometimes they are deeply disturbing, and sometimes they help us uncover our deep knowing. Similarly, Advent is a setons of trusting that God's deep wisdom will guide us from disorientation toward the wonder, awe, and praise of Mary, "My soul magnifies the Lord!" (Luke 1:46b)

In this week's text (Luke 1:26-45), we recognize what preceded Mary's song of praise: news that was disorienting and bewildering, possibly threatening her life. Together, Mary and Elizabeth find courage and comfort in spite of their unusual circumstances. We, too, are called to carry, support, and encourage one another's dreams.

As you reflect on today's text:

- What are God's dreams for our world?
- Where and how do we glimpse God's dreams unfolding in our lives?
- What does it mean to be a faithful dreamer—immersing ourselves in God's holy imagination and taking action to make change?

<u>General Fund Financial Update through November</u>. Here is a summary of the Church's financial status through November (the last month for which information is currently available).

Overall, the Church's general fund receipts and expenses to date are tracking appropriately with the budget.

Through November, the Church's general fund receipts were roughly \$5,762 less than budgeted. An analysis of general fund offerings in November shows \$7,740 received, including one prorated annual pledge. Offerings through November have averaged about \$8,775 per month. For the past two months, offerings have lagged behind the year-to-date average.

Expenses for the year through November have been roughly \$13,877 less than budgeted. About \$5,500 of this difference came from not having an office assistant for several months. Had we had this personnel expense, the excess of receipts to expenses would be about \$2,600.

In November general fund expenses totaled nearly \$11,167, while general fund receipts for the month totaled nearly \$14,127. Thus, monthly receipts were about \$2,960 more than expenses.

Altogether actual year-to-date receipts continue to exceed year-to-date expenses, currently by \$8,115.51. It would appear that total receipts for 2020 may be around \$144,000 and total expenses around \$137,000.



<u>Stewardship Pledge Update</u>: As of December 18, we have received 11 pledges, totaling <u>\$39,820</u> toward our 2021 Operating Budget of \$152,363.25. If you have not yet had the opportunity to make a pledge toward our mission in the coming year, please prayerfully consider doing so now.
