Lectionary for Today: Genesis 1:1-5; Psalm 29; Acts 19:1-7; Mark 1:4-11

Reflection & Questions:

Today we celebrate Baptism of the Lord Sunday. At the beginning of his public ministry, Jesus presents himself to John to be baptized in the Jordan. This a Trinitarian event: as Jesus emerges from the water, the Holy Spirit descends from heaven as a dove, and we hear a voice naming Jesus as God's beloved Son. In ancient Christian tradition, the Baptism of the Lord is closely connected with the Epiphany (the story of the Magi following the star to find the Christ Child), as both are manifestations of God's saving purpose through Jesus Christ; accordingly, these celebrations are adjacent to one another in the Christian calendar. The Baptism of the Lord also foreshadows the season of Lent, as the Gospels tell us that Jesus was driven into the wilderness for forty days after his own baptism. Today, we not only remember Jesus' baptism, but also give thanks for the baptism we share with Christ. Do you remember your own baptism? The baptism of children or grandchildren? As we participate in the Reaffirmation of Baptism today, what new signs of God's grace to you see and hear?


