During the 2015 Synod Assembly, seven workshops will be offered around the overall assembly theme of "Walking together in Christ: For the sake of the world." Each workshop is 75 minutes in length and will focus in-depth on some aspect of our call to be servants of God in the world. #1: "Ask Me Anything:" A Conversation with Dr. John Nunes
