

# THE ONLINE OFFERING MOMENT TOOLKIT

This unprecedented season in the life of the Church requires a major shift in how we conduct worship services and every element that the worship service contains. Just as we are learning to preach, worship, gather, and pray together in new ways, we must also engage in new rhythms around receiving the offering.

This toolkit is specifically designed to help you create new offering practices that effectively engage the hearts of your givers while also fitting into the culture and context of your church.

# **TOOLKIT TIPS:**

- Templates can be used in any order—start with the one that best fits your context.
- Customize these by adding stories and language that resonate with your givers.
- Use pictures and videos whenever possible. Did your church hand out hygiene kits this week to people experiencing homelessness? Show a picture and tell the story!
- The offering moment is a part of worship. Don't throw it in with the announcements or tack it on at the end of the service just because you don't know where else to put it.
- Just as you plan the set of worship songs, plan for your offering moment. Create the script and prep the person who will be delivering this important worship element.
- Use footers on the bottom of the screen during the offering moment with directions (website address or "text to give" instructions)
- If you are using audio only, make sure to read the website name and church mailing address
- Lean into the "newness" of this and allow church leaders and congregants to get comfortable with new practices. Everyone is learning.

When used effectively, offering moments can become a highlight of the worship service. We've seen churches break into applause when they hear reports of how their sacrificial gifts are being used to accomplish Kingdom work. Be boldly joyful about asking God's people to give God's money to support God's work in and through your church.



We are preparing to receive our offering this morning—this of course looks different than it does when we are all in the building together. But it is an important part of our worship service, and we want to continue to make space for this.

We know that some of our faithful givers are experiencing financial hardship as a result of the pandemic. Many people are struggling to live in this "new normal" and trying to figure out how to care for their families during this season. If you need to refrain from giving today, please do. Grace abounds.

There are others who are able to give today—maybe it's less than what you were able to do a few weeks ago, but you still want to tithe on the income God has provided. And there are also some of you who may feel called to increase your giving during this season.

Whatever your situation, we are so grateful for your ministry partnership.

# **TEMPLATE #3 - EASTER**

As we prepare to receive the offering today, let's reflect for a minute on the idea of generosity. What does generosity have to do with Easter? Everything.

The Easter story demonstrates generosity in countless ways.

- Jesus, the Son of God, gave up his life on a cross so that we could live. This is extravagant generosity.
- A group of women who loved Jesus, gave their time and some precious oils, spices, and perfumes to prepare Jesus' body for burial. This is extravagant generosity.
- Joseph of Arimethea, a follower of Jesus, provided a tomb so that Jesus' body could be buried with honor. This is extravagant generosity.
- And, of course, after he had been dead and buried for three days, Jesus triumphantly rose from the grave to give us the gift of eternal life and unending hope. This is extravagant generosity.

Easter may just be the most generous day of the year!

Our response to God's generosity to us is to generously give back to him. We are about to receive the offering just as we do each week. As we continue to live in this "new normal" of gathering virtually for worship, many of us are adjusting our worship habits accordingly.

For instance:

- Some people are enjoying worshipping as a family in their pajamas on Sunday morning while they participate in the service.
- Some in our community who typically work on Sundays have shared that it's been great to engage in the worship service on Monday or Tuesday—they don't have to "miss out" on worship just because they work on Sundays.
- People who used to attend this church but have moved away are grateful to be re-joining our community virtually.

In this "new normal," people are also adjusting their giving habits. Since the basket is no longer passed down the row (fill in your church's method for receiving tithes & offerings in worship \_\_\_\_\_\_), people are doing these things instead:

- Setting up recurring gifts online
- Using their phones to" text to give or give via the app while participating in the virtual worship service
- Mailing checks to the church—sometimes with a note of encouragement for our staff
- Setting up automatic giving through their bank

Throughout these changes and adjustments, isn't it good to know that God is concerned with our hearts, not our appearances or our methodologies?
