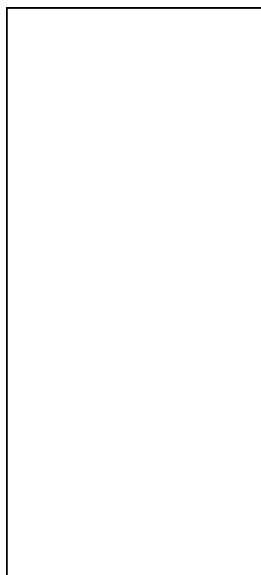

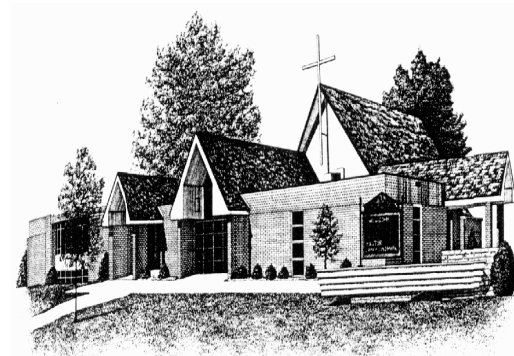

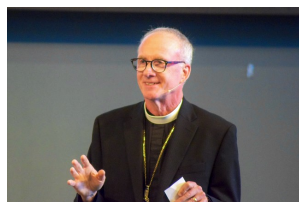

**One Bread, One Body.** This was the theme for the Southeastern Iowa Synod Assembly held May 10-11 at Lutheran Church of Hope in West Des Moines. Bishop Burke presided and shared with us that in Christ, who is the Bread of Life, we are One Body, and that God continues to call us to a hope-filled future.



The synod assembly is an annual gathering of pastors, deacons, and lay people which serves as the synod's highest legislative authority. At the assembly, we obtain synod information, elect nominees to leadership positions, reach decisions on specific matters, set priorities for the synod's ministry, and become more equipped to interpret the mission of the synod and ELCA within our local ministries.

Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate Pentecost. On this day the church celebrates its birthday – that is, the day the Holy Spirit came and lit a fire in us to be witnesses of the resurrected Christ to all people.

But what is the church? This seems to be a question that many people ask and wonder and argue about. It seems that defining the church is just as confusing in the 21<sup>st</sup> century as it was in the first century.

How are we the church? Who makes up the church? What is the goal of the church? What makes the church different from other organizations in society?

These are among the questions that we will be considering as we look at the Pentecost story and some other passages from scripture as we continue to seek to understand the mission of the church.

BBS will be held on Wednesday, June 12, at 7:30 pm in the backyard of the La Plante home (weather permitting – otherwise we will be inside). We invite you to join us and bring a friend and a beverage of your choice.



We were proud to see that **Katie Garner** from our congregation was asked to present a letter from Bishop Burke to the assembly. Katie is one of two youth who serve on the synod council.

**Inspirational speakers.** Rachel Alley, from ELCA Youth Ministry, served as the

Churchwide representative providing updates and stories of the work we do together within the ELCA. She shared that 48% of the population within our synod are under the age of 38 so it is essential to put strategies in place to help these young people discover and love our churches.



Wendy Davidson, an executive at Kellogg North America and an ELCA Lutheran, was a special guest speaker and shared her story of how she learned to refocus her life on personal priorities and live her life with God's purpose for her in her professional life after an unplanned sabbatical

from work. "If you walk with purpose, you will collide with destiny. Be intentional" was her message.

Renee Kiel, US Army Chief, Soldier and Family Ministry, shared stories to help us understand how we can support service members and families and how ELCA Chaplains can help. We also watched a video from Rev. Elizabeth Eaton, the ELCA Bishop, who spoke about standing against hatred and violence.



**Synod business.** There were 343 voting members at this year's assembly; 58% of the members were lay voting members. The assembly provided feedback to synod leadership to help them prepare for election of a new synod Bishop at next year's Synod Assembly May 1-3, 2020 in Coralville, Iowa. Round table discussions centered on three questions: what do we want the

new Bishop to know about us, what qualities do we need in the new Bishop, and what should the top priorities be for the new Bishop.

**Resolutions adopted included:** 1) Peace Not Walls: encourage ministers to learn more about the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and urge the 2019 Churchwide Assembly to advocate for associated humanitarian issues 2) Peace Not Walls: encourage ministers to learn more about financial support cuts and urge the 2019 Churchwide Assembly to advocate for associated fiscal issues 3) Public witness: stand against recent attacks on faith communities as agents of reconciliation and 4) give thanks for the synod assembly and ministries.

**The 2020 budget was approved** at \$1.2 million (plus \$1.27 million to Churchwide). This is a slight increase from last year to accommodate transition costs for the new Bishop. The Synod continues to give 53% to the Churchwide organization. Synod priorities are Congregational Vitality,

Leadership Development, Synodical Witness. The 2020 compensation guidelines were approved to include \$400 increase for pastors and deacons and a increase to Parental Leave to 10 weeks for primary care giver and 6 weeks for secondary care giver (from 6 and 2 weeks).

**Worship, Recognition, Partnerships.** The assembly gathered for a full worship service on Friday evening where Pastor Heather was one of the readers. Congregations, including us, brought 'One Bread, One Body' reusable shopping bags to be blessed. The bags were filled with items representing their local outreach ministries. Over \$4,200 were collected in the offering for the ministry partners of the synod. There was another short worship service on Saturday morning, and throughout the assembly we joined together to sing well known praise songs. By the end of the assembly, another \$5,500 was given to the ELCA World Hunger as a gift of thanksgiving and commitment.



**Forums** each day allowed participants to learn about partner ministries including topics such as bible study, youth ministry, environmental stewardship, refugees and immigration, and ecumenical relations. Videos were shown throughout the assembly to recognize congregational anniversaries, pastor anniversaries, and to remember those who passed. It was impressive to see the many ways the synod is serving the communities and the world!



#### Guest Preacher the Weekend of June 29 and 30

On the weekend of June 29 and 30, we will welcome Jenna Bergeson as our guest preacher. Jenna has been the missionary we have been supporting for the last two years in Hong Kong. She will be completing her service in July and will be finishing her seminary studies here in the United States. We look forward to having her with us as we wish her well on the next part of the journey.

The Service in the World Team has chosen our next missionaries to support. We will be supporting Rev. James and Carol Manfred Sack who are serving in Japan. Jim teaches at Japan Lutheran College, and Carol works with music-based pastoral care. We will be learning more about them in the months ahead.

#### Something Old, Something New

In the last couple of years, a request has been made that we use the setting of the liturgy from *With One Voice* (the blue book) that had previously been used here. Therefore, during the summer months, we will be using setting 5, Bread of Life, from *With One Voice*. We hope that you will enjoy using this setting again.

Also, because we all like to be familiar with hymns that we sing, we are going to begin choosing a lesser known hymn for several weeks in a row so that we can begin to add new hymns to our repertoire. We did this during Easter with *The Trumpets Sound*, *the Angels Sing*, and a new hymn will soon be chosen for the beginning of summer.

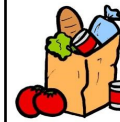

## North Scott Community Feed Our Children Ministry 2019

Feed Our Children Ministry has been established to provide a free lunch opportunity to our children in the North Scott community during the summer break. During

the summer, 741 children in our neighborhoods are underserved through the loss of the weekday free and reduced lunch program. Additionally, there are underserved children not yet school age, as well as those recently graduated. For some families, simply having more mouths to feed during the summer places additional stress on existing resources. Our goal is to provide a free, nutritious lunch to children in our community through this twice a week



ministry, on Tuesdays and Thursdays from June 11-August 22. We will assemble lunches at Faith Lutheran Church, 500 W. LeClaire Rd, Eldridge.

### **\*\*WE NEED YOUR HELP IN THREE AREAS \*\***

**\*Volunteers:** We need your help! Volunteers are needed to prepare and serve lunches. Preparations begin at 10:00 am in the kitchen at Faith Lutheran Church. Lunches will be ready for distribution at 11:15, in order to reach the children from 11:30 am-12:30 pm. There will also be distribution sites in Dixon, Long Grove, McCausland, Park View, Mt. Joy and Princeton. We need volunteers to pick up, deliver and distribute the lunches.

**\* Supplies:** We are seeking donations of sliced bread, cheese slices, smooth peanut butter, grape jam (not jelly – jam spreads better), potato chips, 100% juice boxes (not orange juice), Oreos, Rice Krispie Treats, Go-Gurts, string cheese, and fruit and applesauce cups. We also need sandwich baggies and paper lunch bags.

**\* Pray, Spread the word, and Listen:** Feed Our Children Ministry is successful when we actually get lunches into the hands (and bellies) of our children. Please pray for this ministry – for those in need, as well as those who prepare and serve. Please share the news of this ministry in and around your neighborhood. ## **God's Global Barnyard – Our Children- Lead Us in Abundant Giving**






Throughout the school year, our children have been giving their Sunday School offering toward God’s Global Barnyard in order to purchase animals to help create sustainable farming for our neighbors around the world.

When the children chose a goal of purchasing two oxen and a plow at the cost of \$1000, we felt that was an ambitious goal. However, they met that goal to the dollar, and we will be purchasing two oxen and a plow for a neighbor who needs them. In addition the children chose to purchase a piglet, a set of chicks and a pair of goats with the offering they gave at the beginning of the year. With the half of the Christmas offering that was designated for God’s Global Barnyard, we will also be purchasing another piglet, four additional sets of chicks, two roosters, honeybees and a family farm (a cow, a couple of goats, a dozen chicks, two pigs, farming tools, seeds and agricultural training and support). Thank you for your generous support of this project to share our gifts toward the abundant life Jesus came to bring for our neighbors around the world.
