




Dear Friends in Christ.

Often, we think of summer as a time for rest and relaxation, a time to get away from the routines of the school year, to enjoy life a little. And while that is true in some sense, it also seems like summer has gotten busier through the years with summer sports, mission trips, sports camps, 4-H camps, Girl and Boy Scout camps, church camps, vacations, VBS, summer food ministries and all of the other things that we try to cram into our



"free time" during the summer. Even though these are really good things to be doing that help us to grow and are places where we see God at work, sometimes these events simply wear us out.

There are also the realities of the world around us that can weigh us down. There are medical diagnoses that crush us and those we love. There are stories that we hear about the treatment of migrants on our borders that we find hard to believe. There are the realities of farming struggles due to the rainy weather patterns. There are homeless and hungry people all around us. And these are but a drop in the bucket of the things that we hear about in our lives, on the news, in social media and beyond that sometimes make us wonder how we can face it all.

I do not know about you, but I have to admit, that there are times, during the summer and otherwise, when I get a little overwhelmed with all that is happening, and I begin to wonder where that down time, that time for rest, relaxation and reflection have gone. I wonder how I can get it back.

And then I remember Psalm 46:10: "Be still, and know that I am God!" I remember that I am not the one ultimately in control, even though I am trying to keep a thousand balls in the air. I remember that in the midst of it all, I need to take time to be still and to remember that God is God. Easier said than done, right?

So what are some ways that we can be still and know God in the midst of the crazy schedules and the busyness of life? Here are a few ideas that I have come up with that help me along the way.

- 1. Take a moment in the morning to welcome God into your day. I joke that my morning prayer is, "Thank you, God, that I have not sinned yet today. Now, I pray for your help as I put my feet on the floor and begin my day." However, that is not too far from the truth. Inviting God into our days often helps to keep us focused in the midst of whatever we will face during the day.
- 2. Take time in the evening to reflect on the day. Think back over the day and remember the joys you shared and thank God for those moments. Consider the worries and concerns that arose during the day, and hand those over into God's care, asking for guidance with how to work with

- 3. Find a quiet place to just be once in a while. We all have those places in our homes or in nature where we can go to just be quiet by ourselves for a while. One new place that is now available is the new location of our outdoor chapel. Now located under the trees on the southwest corner of the church building, it could be a good place to sit and reflect when you need time to be alone.
- 4. Find a place to worship even in the midst of the crazy travels you are making. Gathering with others in worship can help to bring focus in the midst of the busyness. Gathering in worship can help us to remember that we are not alone. Gathering in worship in places other than where we call home can remind us that God and the church are bigger than where we often find ourselves. I am sure that there are a number of other ways in which you can and have found time to be still and know God in your life, and all of them are good. North Scott Community Feed Our Children Ministry 2019



This year, we served lunch beginning on Tuesday June 11, and will continue to serve every Tuesday and Thursday through August 22 (except July 4th). On our first day 39 volunteers unloaded a van full of bulk grocery items (purchased with your donations and grants – thank you!), organized the storage room, then made and delivered 164 lunches to children in Donahue, Dixon, Eldridge, McCausland, Mt Joy, Park View, and Princeton.

At this rate, we expect to serve in excess of 3,000 lunches this summer! Over the last two years we have been blessed in many ways through this



ministry. Not only are we feeding children in our neighborhoods, but we are making connections. We have experienced and witnessed new and rekindled friendships with members of Faith that are "regular" attendees of different worship times. Volunteers have made new friendships and strengthened bonds with our brothers and sisters in Christ at other North Scott area churches, as well as with several youth in civic groups, sporting teams, and activity clubs. It is music to the ears and food for the soul to hear the conversations and laughter in the kitchen from our intergenerational volunteers while they work together to show God's

love to His beloved children in our community.

At some of our locations you might see other activities happening during lunch. At Faith, the Scott County Library Bookmobile will be open in our lot during the majority of our lunch dates. Families can pick up a lunch and a new book to enjoy together. Zion Lutheran Church in Princeton will offer "old fashioned" games to the kids when they pick up lunch, such hopscotch, jacks, marbles, four-square, kickball, cat's cradle, and hula hoops.

At Eldridge United Methodist Church, children may attend a Youth Works youth program right after lunch, and at Hope in Dixon, children will have opportunities to hear bible



stories with Pastor Dianne. This Ministry is fostering many opportunities for churches in North Scott to build relationships in their immediate neighborhoods and to plant seeds of faith!
