

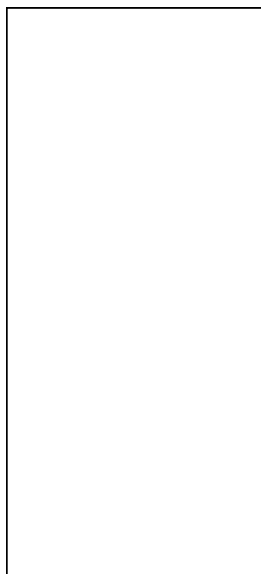

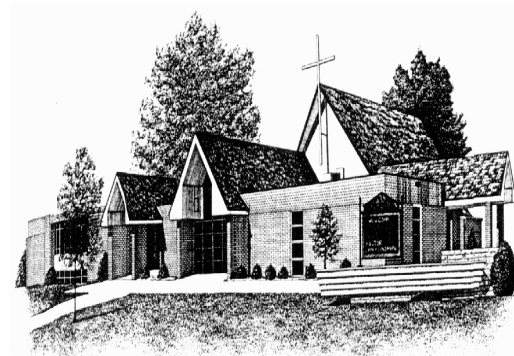

**Grace-Gifted, Faith-Lifted
Called to share, seek, and serve Christ**



Dear Friends in Christ,

January 23 marked 15 years of ordained ministry for me, which is an exciting milestone. As I shared in my sermon on January 26, the lectionary texts appointed for that day were the texts that I chose to use for my ordination service. And these are great texts for ordination. Isaiah 9:1-4 declares that “[t]he people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined,” and what else are we to proclaim to the world that God’s light shines into the shadows of our lives, particularly in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. In this portion of his first letter to the Corinthians (1 Corinthians 1:10-18), Paul appeals to the church saying, “Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose,” and, to be honest, we all need to be reminded of this, both clergy and laypeople alike, that Jesus and what God has done for us in and through Jesus is what is central to who we are, and the details and leadership ought not divide us. Finally, the Gospel reading from Matthew (Matthew 4:12-23), we hear the call story of Simon Peter, Andrew, James and John away from their lives as fishermen into a new life as disciples of Jesus, and there is, perhaps, no better text to use to reflect on a call to ministry. And while these texts, particularly this story of Jesus calling the disciples, have been meaningful texts for me and have helped to inform my ministry over these last 15 years, it was not until reading through the texts this time around that I caught in something that Jesus says a promise for you and for me and for all people as we each get up and follow Jesus.

What jumped out to me this time is that when Jesus approaches Simon Peter and Andrew who are casting their nets into the sea, going about their daily work, Jesus calls out to them, “Follow me, and I will make you fish for people” (Matthew 4:19b) Now, in this translation, there is a tinge of “Get up, come with me, and I am going to force you to do this thing for me.” However, in the Greek, the words that are translated “fish for” in the New Revised Standard Version actually are a noun and a preposition better translated, “fishers of,” making a better translation of Jesus’ call to Simon Peter and Andrew, “Follow me, and I will make you fishers of people.” Hearing it that way, instead of hearing a sense of forced submission, what I heard was a promise from Jesus to create out of Simon Peter and Andrew who Jesus needed them to be.

The beauty of this is that Jesus took these fishermen with the dirt under their fingernails, their grimy, wet clothing, their little education and low socio-economic status and saw something in them that he could use. Jesus did not ask them for credentials, or ask them to go shower up, or even ask if they were available to leave their life of fishing to become what Jesus wanted to create them into. Jesus simply invited them to come and follow, and promised

that he would make something new and wonderful from them.

And Jesus does the same for us, Jesus takes us as we are and creates from us what Jesus needs us to be. The most beautiful realization of this comes when we celebrate baptism, particularly the baptism of infants. Infants have done nothing to earn God's love: they have not served on any committees or done any great feats, they have not saved any lives or won any great prizes. And yet, in the waters of baptism God names and claims them as beloved, the Holy Spirit promises to reside within them, and Jesus promises to walk alongside them, always creating them into who God created them to be and who Jesus needs them to be in any given time and space. Jesus takes them as they are and is always creating something new out of them.

This is true for all of us who have been baptized. Jesus takes us as we are and makes us into who Jesus needs us to be where we are. As Mark Betterson once said, "God doesn't call the qualified. God qualifies the called." And this is true for us as individuals and as a community together. Jesus has called us and will qualify us to do the work that God needs us to do in this place at this time together – and that is an exciting thought!


As we continue into this new year, may we hear where Jesus is calling us to follow; may we be molded into the people and the community that God needs us to be in this place at this time so that we can shine the light of God's love into the shadows of the world around us, and may we be a sign of God's love and hope and promise for all to see.

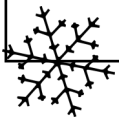

10 COMMANDMENTS MILESTONE:

Jesus says: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind." Join Pastor Carrie as she leads conversation and learning with all 2nd graders and their parents. Together children and families explore God's Top Ten List and discover the gift of God's love, which provide guidance for navigating life. **On February 16th at 9:15 am**, 2nd graders and parents are invited to this class. HOLY COMMUNION PREPARATION

Holy Communion is a gift from God! But what is it? How does it work? All students (2nd grade and older) who have not yet received their first communion are invited to come, learn, and experience the goodness of God.
