Dear Friends in Christ.

I want to start with a huge "Thank You!" As you will see in the Council report, considering all that 2020 held for us, we were able to end the year very well, meeting the obligations to which we had committed and more. Thank you for your generosity and all of the ways in which your faithfulness to God's calling in your life made that possible so that we could continue to share in God's mission in this place, albeit in very different ways than we had planned.

It is hard to believe that we have already made it to the month of February. Time seems to be going faster, which I have to admit is not a sad thing for me as I am ready to see some warmer and longer days. However, sometimes it seems like it is going too fast, especially when the things that we may normally be doing in these times are having to be done so differently.

When I think of February, of course, I think of Valentine's Day, that day when we celebrate the love that we have, particularly for our significant others, but also for our children and grandchildren, our friends, our neighbors, and others in our lives. As I was thinking about this day that is set aside for celebrating love and reflecting on the ways that we might celebrate that love this year, these words from Jesus came to mind:

[Jesus] said to [the lawyer], "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." (Matthew 22:37-40)

If we remember the story, this saying comes toward the end of Matthew's Gospel when the religious and secular authorities have had just about enough of Jesus, and they are trying to find a way to trap him so that they can discredit him and remove him from the spotlight. In the middle of one of these times of testing, a Pharisee, a lawyer, asks Jesus a question to test him, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" Now, there are somewhere around 630 laws in the Hebrew scriptures, and so the idea of asking Jesus to come up with just one seems preposterous. How could Jesus choose only one? Are they not all important?

But Jesus skillfully comes to the solution. Obviously, the first and most important commandment is the first one in the law of Moses – you shall love the Lord your God with everything you have. This should not have been a surprise, for God's people loving God and God loving God's people

Dialogues On Race 2.0



In light of recent events in this country surrounding issues of race, this past fall, a small group of members and friends of Faith gathered to have a conversation about the difficult topic of race in this country in a safe environment using a study called *Dialogues on Race*. Over the last several months, you have had the opportunity to read testimonials from the participants in that group here in the Ambassador. As you have read, this small group grew so much in our understanding of race and so valued

the opportunity for conversation on this important topic with others with varying viewpoints on the issue that we would like to offer this opportunity again for others to join the conversation. Therefore, Pastor Carrie La Plante will lead another series of these conversations on Zoom beginning Sunday, February 7. These conversations will begin at 10:30 am on Sunday morning, and we will aim to keep to 60 to 75 minutes of conversation. The study will last for eight weeks.

is the reason to follow any of the laws. However, Jesus cannot simply leave it there. Jesus goes on to add that there is another commandment that has to go right along with the first, and that is that you must love your neighbor as yourself. You must see the needs of those around you as being just as important as your own. On these two commandments all of the rest of the law and the prophets hang, Jesus tells them. You see, all of the laws, all of the warnings that the prophets bring, all that Jesus ultimately is about is showing us how to best love God and love our neighbors so that we can live together when we are the best of friends and when we cannot seem to see eye-to-eye.

The Greek word that is translated as "love" in these verses is agape ($\dot{\alpha}\gamma\dot{\alpha}\pi\eta$). This kind of love is the unconditional love that God shows for us, and that we are called to show God and one another. It is the love that we are called to show our neighbors, *all of our neighbors*, each and every day, whether next door or around the world, whether we can agree with one another or not. And believe me, I know just how hard this can be, and it is all that much harder when seeing eye-to-eye seems to be nearly impossible some days. Still, Jesus calls us to love one another at all times, to love one another and care for the needs of each other even when we might not like one another all that much.

I am quite convinced that there are days that God does not like us so much, especially on those days when we insist on our own ways, when we think we can do life on our own, when we do things that hurt other people. However, I am also quite convinced that no matter how much God likes us on any given day, God always loves us, God always wants the best for us, God always protects us. And I believe that is what God calls us to do for

one another. Even in our disputes and disagreements, Jesus asks us to continue to care for one another, seek the best for one another, and protect one another from harm. This is how we show the love of God and shine that light for the world to see.

This Valentine's Day, may we shine that kind of love in the world, showing our love for God in the ways that we love and care for our neighbors, all of our neighbors. What a celebration that will be!


Thanks for your Financial Support of our Ministries in 2020!

As you may recall, at the end of November, we were concerned about whether

or not our operating income would cover our expenses for the year. We are very excited to tell you that we had record offerings in December and ended the year ahead of expenses by about \$2,200. We are so blessed to have financial stability when so many congregations are struggling to meet financial obligations



Overall, we underspent our planned budget by about \$76,000. Since our planned budget is aspirational, we typically operate below our budget in most areas. However, were able to meet




our operational expenses, and still donated almost \$49,000 to budgeted missions. Our largest area of underspend was about \$22,000 in family ministry largely due to canceled camps and mission trips beyond our control. We pray that this year, our family ministries are made possible again!

Summer Camp Registration is Here!!

Lutheran Lakeside is moving ahead with plans to hold camp this summer with precautions in place, and registration is now open. We are planning to attend camp during week 6 which **July 18-23**. There is Junior Camp for those who have completed grades 3-5 and Confirmation Camp for those who

have completed grades 6-8. This year, registration is risk-free, so if you register now, and either the camp cancels due to COVID or you decide later not to send your child due to COVID-related concerns (numbers increasing, need to quarantine, diagnosed with COVID, etc.), you will receive a refund of any money that you have already paid, unless you decide to donate it to camp. How we will get to camp will be determined at a later date.

For more information about camp, please go to www.lutheranlakeside.com and click on the Summer Camp tabs for more information and the Register Here tab if you are ready to register. The total cost for a week at camp is \$465 for the first child. If you send more than one child from your household, there is a \$15 sibling discount for the second and subsequent children. A \$100 deposit is due at registration. There is an Early Bird Discount of \$50 for all those who register by February 28. As in years past, Faith will cover \$150 of the cost of camp per child (including friends that they might invite). Therefore, the out-of-pocket cost, if you register by February 28, would be \$265 for your first child and \$250 for any additional children from your household. When you register, be sure to let them know that you are going with Faith Lutheran Church so that they apply the \$150 discount. Also let Pastor Carrie know when you have registered so that she can make sure that the discount is applied and have an accurate count of who is planning to go to help with transportation plans.

Also, adults are invited to join us for the adult mission trip to do work around the camp that week as well, so if that is something that would interest you, please let Pastor Carrie know.

On January 6, Confirmation students returned from Christmas break. Classes continued on Zoom . We began the New Year with studies in the New Testament, learning about Jesus and Matthew. The kids just want to be with their friends, and have so little opportunities to do so during this Covid outbreak.





Please join me in thanking and praying for our essential workers in our congregation for their selfless acts of shining their light for Jesus.






