


Grace-Gifted, Faith-Lifted Called to Share, Seek, and Serve Christ



Dear Friends in Christ.

If you are anything like me in these days as we enter the Lenten season, you look at the world around us and you wonder about all that is going on. We have been in a pandemic for nearly a year with views on how to get through it varying wildly. In so many ways, our country is divided, and it is hard to know how to pull the pieces together in a new way to move forward. Messaging about how to live life and who is right about whatever and how to find happiness is all over the place. We miss being together. We want to see an end. And all of this can be so overwhelming.

In the midst of all of this, we seek to live an authentic Christian faith. We seek to show the love of God in a world that seems so chaotic and upside down. Sometimes, it feels like a mammoth task to consider what living our faith in today's world could look like when it does not look much like what we have always done.

If there is someone who knew something about trying to live faith in a world that seemed to be set against him, it was the apostle Paul. Being a Roman citizen, Paul had some advantages that others living under Roman occupation did not have; however, because Paul was such an outspoken apostle, always proclaiming the good news of Jesus against the Roman understanding of the emperor as god, Paul often found himself in a lot of trouble...often imprisoned for not bowing to the society around him.

As Paul began teaching others about God's amazing love for all people through the life death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, as Paul began bringing together new communities of faith who wanted to live into this freedom that Christ brought into the world, these communities also began to find themselves in trouble. They began to argue about how best to live in "the Way" as it was called in those days. Often, these communities would write to Paul for advice, and Paul would write back great letters to help guide them in their living.

One of these letters that is attributed to Paul is the letter to the Ephesians. Paul had spent much time teaching and preaching in



EPHESIANS 4:32, NIV

Answer: Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. Ephesians 4:32, NIV

Ephesus, and he had a fondness for the people there. It is clear that they were beginning to ask some big questions about how to live counterculturally in a powerful culture and wondering when Jesus might come back. Many scholars now believe that this letter may have been written by one of Paul's students as an introduction to all of Paul's letters after Paul's death, based on some stylistic differences. Nonetheless, this letter is one of the most important letters among the Pauline writings. It lays out Paul's theology of God's grace and love through Jesus Christ and then provides instruction on how to live a life shaped by God's grace and love. Ephesians reminds us that through faith, we are all part of the body of Christ, and we are called to love one another as Christ is love. How this looks for each of us will be different as we figure out our place, our relationships, our power and our purpose, but the values of inclusion and putting others before yourself endure through it all.

These are still questions that we ask today, and during Wednesday evening Lenten services this year, we will hear people like us asking some of those pressing questions to Paul himself and hearing Paul respond based on his writings from his letter to the Ephesians in our drama series, "Dear Paul." It will be interesting to hear Paul's perspective on our world today.

As has become our tradition, we will also be singing *Holden Evening Prayer* during this Lenten season. Because this is a sung

liturgy, the Worship and Music Team has decided to hold our Midweek Lenten Worship online only on Facebook, our website, and our YouTube channel at 7:00 pm each Wednesday evening. The *Holden Evening Prayer* service can be found on our Facebook page and on our website.

We invite you to tune in, sing with us, and hear what Paul has to share with us in these days.

We would like to thank the 54 voting members who participated in our first online Annual Meeting on January 31, 2021. We also owe gratitude to the council members who served that day by collecting ballots and counting votes.

Thank you for your generous donations to our '2021 Souper Bowl' food collection. We provided 127 cans of food to the North Scott Food Pantry. We also appreciate the effort of the Service in the World Team who sponsored this collection.

We appreciate the efforts of the Endowment Committee for providing council with recommendations to distribute the past year's earnings from our endowment fund investments. They did a great job thinking through how to distribute the \$1,115 while meeting the requirements of our bylaws.

Return to Indoor Gatherings with Precautions

Over the past month, we have been returning gradually to indoor gatherings with Confirmation Conversations, High School Youth, Sunday worship, and Ash Wednesday worship. At our February meeting, council voted to return fully to Phase 2. In-person gatherings outdoors and indoors with precautions.

We are so thankful that the community spread of COVID-19 is down to levels similar to last September/October. However, the spread is still within the 'high risk' category as defined by the CDC and so we will still follow our precautions. We will continue to provide online and at-home options for those people who prefer not to join in-person gatherings.

The decision on whether a gathering will be online, in-person, at home, or a combination of these methods will be made by the teams and/or leaders responsible for the gathering. Their decision will be made based upon their ability to a) find congregation members to serve in required support roles, b) host the gathering within constraints of the precautions to reduce risk, and c) provide the most meaningful ministry experience.

Summer Camp Registration is Here!!

Registration for summer camp at Lutheran Lakeside, Spirit Lake, Iowa, is now open. We will be going the week of July 18-23. There is Junior Camp for those who have completed grades 3-5, Confirmation Camp for those who have completed grades 6-8, and High School Servant Trip for those who have completed grades 8-12. Everyone needs to register on the Lutheran Lakeside website (www.lutheranlakeside.com). Faith will

pay \$150 of the registration fee for every youth registered through Faith.

Confirmation Conversations students took a break from studies to spend time with their adult Mentors on Wednesday, January 27. The following Wednesday, the students were

thrilled to leave the Zoom Confirmation classes behind and return to live (in-person) learning. This has been taking place in the Church Fellowship Hall, following CDC guidelines. A handful of students still participate on Zoom, due to quarantining or personal reasons.

Regardless of the excitement, we have been centering their thoughts on learning about to Gospels of Mark, and the following week, the Gospel of Luke. We learned that Mark was probably the first Gospel written, and the Gospel of Mark was responsible for much of what we know about Jesus. The Gospels of Matthew and Luke "borrowed" from Mark (sometimes word for word) in their Gospels, adding more details to the information obtained from Mark's Gospel.

February 17, we did not meet, due to the Ash Wednesday Service, and will resume studies on February 24, with the Gospel of John.

The High School Youth have been meeting live in the Youth Room since January 20. As they have gone in-person, the number of attendees is slowly returning.

The kids spend time during our meetings playing games, catching up and just enjoying each other. We may do a Bible Study at some point in the near future.

Mission Trips have been put on hold, due to Covid, so we have been discussing other possibilities for the High School kids to do this summer. This includes High School Youth attending Camp at Lutheran Lakeside for a custom camp/mission experience. This would take place the same week as our younger youth will also be attending Lutheran Lakeside camp.

Other Council Business

The council approved the proposed disbursements of Endowment earnings from the past year as follows: \$225 to Lutheran Lakeside, \$225 to SEIA Synod Derecho Disaster Assistance, \$120 to the University of Iowa Hospital Chaplaincy Outreach, \$320 to ELCA Disaster Fund, and \$225 to Faith Lutheran's Capital Improvement Fund.

The council agreed with a recommendation from Deanna Nielsen, that we don't have the need to request a potentially forgivable loan from the Small Business Administration Payroll Protection Plan. We are thankful that our congregation is financially sound compared to many other congregations.



Tuesday Afternoon Bible Study



Lenten Worship

This year's Lenten drama series will begin on Wednesday, February 24, with an introduction and overview of Paul's letter to the Ephesians. The following four Wednesdays, we will hear some words of wisdom from Paul himself, as he continues writing (and answering!) letters in the 21st century. He's sure to have a unique perspective on today's world. Join us as we experience together this year's drama series entitled, "Dear Paul" as part of our Lenten journey.

During Holy Week, we will have a series of worship services that will guide us from Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm/Passion Sunday through the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday, the crucifixion on Good Friday, the time of waiting on Holy Saturday, and the celebration of the resurrection on Easter Sunday.

While all of the details on where and when these Holy Week services are not fully determined at this time, we will find a way to celebrate the fullness of Holy Week and Easter together.

On Palm/Passion Sunday, Saturday and Sunday, March 27, and 28, we will begin worship with a form of a congregational procession with palms, and then make the journey through the passion with Jesus as Mark tells the story. On Thursday, April 1, we will celebrate Maundy Thursday, with worship at 7:00 pm. Friday, April 2, we will hear the story of Jesus' passion from the Gospel of John as we journey with Jesus to the cross during the Good Friday service at 7:00 pm. On Holy Saturday, April 3, we will worship at 5:00 pm to experience together the Easter Vigil and a quiet celebration of the resurrection.

Finally, we will reach the climax of the season, the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord, on Sunday, April 4. The times and plans for these services are still being made. We also plan to have an Easter Egg Hunt in the front yard for the children sometime that morning.

We invite you to join us on this Lenten journey as we grow our faith together.
