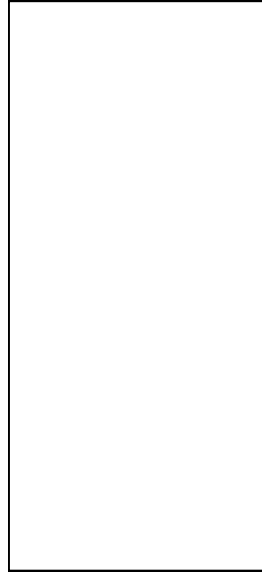

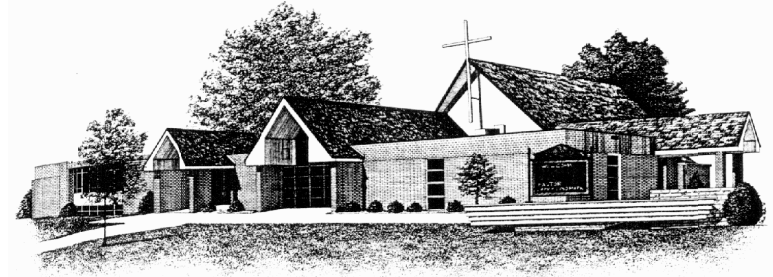

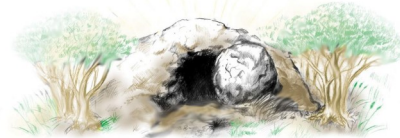

**Grace-Gifted, Faith-Lifted
 Called to Share, Seek, and Serve Christ**

Dear Friends in Christ,

What a place we stand in these days! Spring has sprung...finally! We are still in the midst of the global pandemic, and yet, there are signs of light at the end of the tunnel. We are still in Lent, but we are rapidly heading toward Holy Week and through Holy Week to Easter. What a place to sit.



Pastor Carrie's Easter Message

As I think about this place where we find ourselves in these days, I think about Jesus' words that we heard during worship on the Fifth Sunday in Lent. When told by his disciples that there are people who wish to see Jesus, Jesus responds, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit" (John 20:23-24). It is spring, and we, who are influenced in various ways by the agricultural life that surrounds us, understand the truth of what Jesus is saying. Each seed must be buried, must die to what it has been, in order to grow and become something new. Only then, can that seed bear the fruit that it was intended to bear.

Jesus, however, is responding to the question of those who wish to see Jesus, and Jesus' response, while strange, is saying that people will really see Jesus, will really understand what Jesus is all about when Jesus is glorified...the time that is coming only days after this conversation. However, for Jesus to be glorified, Jesus is telling his disciples that he must die. Like the seed, Jesus will die. Jesus will be buried. Yet, also like the seed, Jesus will rise again. Jesus will have new life. More than that, through this new life, Jesus will draw all people to himself and give the gift of eternal life.

Now, for those who were listening, this was an audacious claim. If Jesus is the Messiah, if Jesus is God in human form, if Jesus is God's Word made flesh, how can Jesus die? That is not what God does! To be honest, for those of us listening today, while we have heard this story over and over again throughout our lives, it still sounds audacious, crazy, even foolish. And yet, it is the truth of God in Jesus that we hold onto, especially when we find ourselves at crossroads of life as we find ourselves in these days. While our celebration of Holy Week and Easter will be different than it has been in the past, we will be celebrating the fullness of all that Jesus is and all that God has done for us through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We hope that you will join us for many of these services, whether you join us online or in person, as we give thanks for the audacious love of God for us and for the whole world

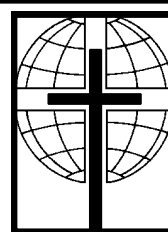
Food Pantry Needs for the month of April are tomatoes, fruit and muffin mixes.

evening at 5:00 pm, we will livestream worship, and on Sunday morning, we will have two in-person worship services, one at 8:00 am and the other at 10:30 am. We will wave our palms and hear the story of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We will also hear a dramatic reading of Jesus' passion according to the Gospel of Mark. For those who will be worshipping online, palm branches will be available for pick-up outside of the church on Friday, March 26, from 9:00 am to noon, and on Saturday, March 27 from 2:00-4:00 pm. We also invite you to have bread and wine or juice available for the celebration of Holy Communion.

On Maundy Thursday, April 1, and Good Friday, April 2, we will have in-person worship at 7:00 pm. These services will be livestreamed as well. For those who will be worshipping online, on Maundy Thursday, we invite you to have bread and wine or juice available to celebrate Holy Communion, and on Good Friday, we invite you to have 8 candles that you can extinguish with us and a cross upon which to gaze at the end of the service.

On Saturday, April 3, we will have an in-person Easter Vigil and quiet celebration of Easter at 5:00 pm which will be livestreamed. For those who will be worshipping online, we invite you to have bread and wine or juice available for the celebration of Holy Communion.

On Easter Sunday, April 4, we will premiere a pre-recorded Easter service online at 8:00 am. We will also have two in-person worship services that morning at 8:00 am indoors and at 10:30 am outdoors. For those who will be worshipping online, we invite you to have bread and wine or juice available for the celebration of Holy Communion.

In addition to worship for Holy Week and Easter, we have a couple of other opportunities to aid in your Easter celebrations. We will be offering Easter Brunch In a Box For Your Bunch to support the High School Mission Trip this summer, and we will be having an Easter Egg Hunt on the front lawn on Easter Sunday morning. More information on both of these offerings is found on pages 14 and 13, respectively.

As a reminder, space is limited indoors due to our COVID precautions, so please sign up for worship times for indoor services so that we can accommodate those who wish to worship in-person.



We look forward to gathering together around "the message about the cross [that] is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Corinthians 1:18) this Holy Week and Easter.

The Lenten Season and Holy Week are such an important and meaningful time in our lives of Christ. Thanks to our pastors, organists, musicians, vocalists, office crew, videographers, ushers, cleaning crew, worship and music team, and alter guild for serving during this time. A special ‘Thanks’ goes out to Sue and Neal who performed the ‘Dear John’ Lenten series and to Matt Peck for leading the videography!

We appreciate the work of the Finance Committee who developed an updated Audit Guide. The Audit Committee will use this new guide to do their audit this year, which will cover: 2018-2020.

Faith Stories

We are sharing our Faith Stories with one another this year. Linda shared her story last month, and Pastor Carrie shared her story this month. Like the online series ‘Why Jesus?’, this is an inspiring way to hear how Jesus is present in the life of others, and helps us to know one another better spiritually.

COVID-19 Update

The council approved a couple of changes to the COVID-19 policy: 1) to allow a vocal soloist with a face covering or a wind instrument soloist with a face covering and instrument bell cover in the choir loft during indoor worship and 2) to allow pastors to preach without masks outdoors while maintaining 15 ft distance or more (this was approved last fall, but not included in the policy).

The sub-committee will continue to meet monthly (or more) to provide recommendations to the council. They will continue to monitor community spread, vaccines administered, public health department guidance, and state and local rules. Our hope is that during the course of the year, we will be able to gradually increase in-person gatherings and eventually reduce precautions.

Other Council Business

The council approved the job description for a Mutual Ministry Committee. This committee is called for in our Constitution and By Laws, but was not yet established. Once the pastors and president have appointed 6 congregational committee members, the committee and their responsibilities will be announced in the Ambassador.

During Confirmation Conversations this last month, we studied the Gospel of John, the Book of Acts and learned about one of the most important people in the history of the Church, Paul.

Paul was a Pharisee who was a persecutor of the Church. One day, on the road to Damascus, Jesus appeared to Paul and it changed his life forever. He traveled the world (as they knew it) proclaiming God's Grace and the Good News of Jesus. Since "The Way" was not readily accepted by the Roman government, this found Paul often jailed for his outspokenness, and eventually had him killed. But not before changing countless lives to follow Jesus.

The Gospel of John elaborated on the miracles Jesus performed to convince that he is indeed God's son, the Messiah.

The Book of Acts tells how the Holy Spirit guided the disciples as they shared the Good News, welcoming everyone into this new church - Jews, and even Romans and Gentiles.

This year has really flown by. There are only three more classes and one Mentor Night remaining in this Confirmation year. On Wednesday, April 21 at 6:00, the 8th Grade Confirmands and their families will enjoy an individually boxed chicken dinner from Mama's Parlor on the Church lawn, followed by Confirmation on Sunday, April 25 at 10:30.

This month, the council approved four sections: personnel records, visitors, job classifications, and safe driving. These now supersede associated sections of the existing employee handbook.

The council approved a new Audit Guide that was submitted by the Finance Committee. It remains practical but a few audit items were added after reviewing resources from the ELCA.

The council held an annual boarding session that included an overview of our organizational structure, governing documents, policies, roles and responsibilities, how to have healthy communications, and how to speak in terms of the Word.

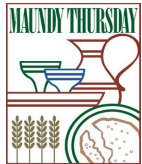

Second Sunday of Easter, April 10th & 11th

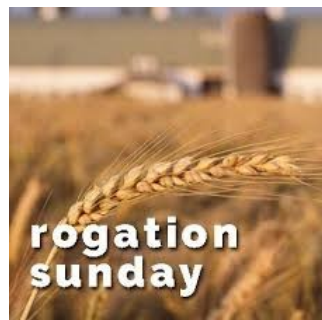

Nitty Gritty Ministries: Bearing One Another's Burdens

Can you imagine the amount of risk Jesus was willing take by entering Jerusalem? Jesus was willing to head directly to the cross. It is here where he suffered ultimate shame, humiliation and death. Why was he willing to risk so much? Wasn't he paying attention to what this was going to cost him? A simple cost benefit analysis may have been helpful for him. Surely, someone could have talked Jesus out of heading straight into Jerusalem and into his own death. When Jesus was in the garden praying to God he asked for the suffering to be taken away but "not my will, but thine, be done."








Sometimes I wonder what we are willing to risk and even suffer because of Jesus death on the cross. We say it makes a difference and trust that the Holy Spirit still changes hearts and lives today. But does it really make a difference in your life to know that God sent his only Son to be **YOUR** Savior and Lord? As a church, we confess and believe that Jesus died and rose from the dead three days later. Jesus is exactly who He said He is. He is our Savior and Lord; God's truth and assurance of all God promises.

On the cross Jesus died for you. New and abundant life in Christ are yours for the taking. What risks are you willing to take to bring Jesus life to others? There will always be people in this world who are willing to see people and their struggles but only as a dollar sign. Sick people see monetary profit in the struggle of others. This is a problem. As a community of faith we are oriented to be about God's Word of life and work in the world for the good of all. Are there any ministries that you'd like to see happening in our community? As leaders, we have been listening to the concerns of the community. Here are some ministry possibilities that seek to address some of the real needs and concerns of our neighbors:

- ♥A light housekeeping ministry for anyone who is not physically able to care for their home.
- ♥A meal ministry to show appreciation and care for members of the community, as well as for individuals and families facing hardship.
- ♥A ministry to address homelessness in the larger Quad City Area.
- ♥A ministry that advocates for fair funding of local school districts.
- ♥A ministry that serves the incarcerated.
- ♥A ministry that gives voice to the importance of mental health care needs and advocates for adequate and increased funding within the mental health care system.
- ♥A ministry that addresses the needs of the homebound and their caregivers.

Do any of these ministries meet your passion and the risks you are willing to take for Jesus? What other ministry areas has God placed upon your heart? We want to hear from you. Relationships and real people with names and faces matter to God and they matter to us.

Our call as Christians is heart work. We are willing to risk loving our neighbor because God loves us and calls us to joyfully bear one another's burdens.
