

Dear Friends in Christ,


Food Pantry Needs for the month of May are canned fruit, jelly/jam, and tomato soup.

New Ministry





Wow! It's hard to believe that Wednesday, April 14, we had our last Confirmation Conversations for this year! To say it was a challenging year is definitely an understatement, but the kids were troopers, enduring Zoom classes and the

uncertainty of the Pandemic. We have all learned to appreciate the joys of in-person learning and being with friends, even if it involves wearing a mask and social distancing.

This past month, Confirmation dove into Paul's letters and his impact on the early church. We finished this year, appropriately, with the final book of the Bible, Revelation. Although confusing and sometimes scary, Pastor Carrie explained that Revelation was really a message of hope to all Christians.

Revelation was actually written from a prison island, by prisoner John of Patmos. Followers of Jesus were kept in captivity on the island of Patmos, in order to prevent the spread of Christianity. Although they weren't allowed off the island, they were permitted to write letters to their friends and families. Knowing that these letters would most likely be intercepted by those trying to prevent the Good News of Jesus to spread, the letters were written in code - the "sevens" referred to throughout the book actually refer to the seven Christian churches in existence at that time. Although Revelation does have references to the end of time, it also provides encouragement to its readers to live a life centered with God and to believe in God's promises.

Once again, our prayers were answered! The day before the Wednesday, April 21 Confirmation Meal, Natalie Kruse, owner of Tradition Event Center, offered her facility for our use. This was a very welcome suggestion, as our original plan to hold the meal outside on the Church lawn promised to be way too cold, and our Fellowship Hall was not large enough for adequate Social Distancing. If you see Natalie, please thank her for her generous offer! The 8th Grade Confirmands and their families all enjoyed a box chicken dinner and ice cream in very congregation members in need. We thank Carol Marten and Mary Moore for co-leading this new ministry and welcome members who are in need or who wish to serve to contact them or the church office.

Additional Insurance

In support of the new Mary Martha Ministry, the council approved an increase in insurance coverage for about \$350 a year to protect property in the church members' care.

2018-2020 Audit

Deanna Nielsen is working with the Audit Committee and the Finance Committee to make plans for an audit for 2018-2020. The council approved their recommendation to rescind the decision made in September last year to use an external auditor since this would delay the audit further and since it was not added to the budget.



With the first quarter of 2021 now complete and select in-person activities again occurring at Faith Lutheran, it is a great time for a check of the financial health of the church. Through the first three months of 2021, general operating contributions to the church totaled \$76,238.73 from 148 giving units and other loose offerings, with expenses during that same time period totaling \$74,371.99. A very heartfelt THANK YOU to all of our Faith Lutheran family for the continued support of the amazing work being done even during the ongoing pandemic, and to our church leaders for effectively managing finances and expenses during this time.

The current financial health of the church is even more impressive when you factor in that most activities have been virtual during that time period. When looking back at the same time frame in 2020, contributions totaled \$92,808 from 188 giving units thanks to a significant number of additional in-person services before the start of the pandemic. As more in-person activities return and activity at the physical church building increases, so will expenses associated with these activities.

In addition, as we anticipate the end of the pandemic and the ability for more normal activities, Faith teams are actively planning for new and exciting programs and activities that will expand the impact of our church family and spread God's word. Wrapping Care Around Iowa Children

Martha and Marti first became foster parents in September of 2018, after their biological children expressed that they wanted to provide foster care as a family. They decided to become licensed through LSI Foster Care and Adoption and soon after, they welcomed a sibling group of three into their home.

"Our kids really wanted to look into foster care as a way to be able to help others as a family," Martha says. "Everybody had to sacrifice and pour in, and everybody was needed and brought something to the table."

The siblings stayed with the family for almost two years, until the opportunity came for them to find a forever home through adoption. Over the years, the siblings had become bonded to Martha and Marti, as well as their extended family and friends. The siblings are currently in the process of officially being adopted by a family close to Martha and Marti, so they can continue to stay connected to the important relationships they built in foster care.

The family has found a passion they can all share, and it's making a difference in the lives of Iowa children. "We always explain fostering as 'good' and 'hard.' You never want to take one away from the other, because it's both. It's the hardest thing we've ever done, but it's the best thing we've done," Martha says. "We've had the privilege of having the kids in our home and you have the responsibility and the privilege to take care of them in their time of need."


2021 Goals (actions in support of top priorities)
