Dear Friends in Christ,

Council Business



Synod Assembly Summary

I had the opportunity to virtually attend the Synod Assembly. This was an opportunity I was really looking forward to after many years of hearing previous attendees share their stories with such enthusiasm. I was very disappointed that it was virtual, but grateful for the opportunity to participate with 138 other congregations across the region.



The theme was, **Baptized and Set Free**, which was a beautiful reminder of the grace of God in our lives. Activities and discussions provided opportunities for self-reflection to develop deeper understanding and encourage action. Specifically, discussions pushed us to consider how we think, see, and experience the world through our own lens and how that may restrict or limit our view. Considering this limited view, it is important to have *compassionate curiosity* and *appreciative inquiry*. This was a key takeaway as we all strive to understand how emotions shape our perceptions and our brain makes decisions about things automatically. We were encouraged to look at the world from the perspective of the cross. To see the world from those who have been pushed to the margins and from God who sacrificed his son for our lives. Additionally, to reflect and pay attention to what God is trying to say to us through scripture.

Here are some questions you might find helpful for your own self-reflection. I found these very difficult, yet interesting to work through.

What ways have you found helpful to see things from perspectives different than your own?

What do you see when you look at the world from the perspective of the cross of Jesus?

What can you do to see things from a "cross" perspective, that is, from the perspective of those who are "crucified" in (or by) our society?

What voices does your community have a hard time hearing?

What can you do, and your community do to hear those voices?

What might change if those voices are heard?

Who taught you what faith is about?

What did they teach you? How did they teach you?

Who would you like to teach?

How would you teach them? Will you?

Every day, each of us has a unique opportunity to genuinely model the love the God. The assembly was closed with inspiring words, including, God's love is for ALL in the entire world!

Thank you for the joyous opportunity to represent Faith Lutheran at this important event. Congratulations to Pastor Carrie and Katie Garner for being elected and for their future service.
