




Grace-Gifted, Faith-Lifted Called to Share, Seek, and Serve Christ



Dear Friends in Christ,

After the last 18 months, we all undoubtedly have been feeling the need to gather again. Many of us have been able to begin to see family that we have not seen in more months than we want

to count. We have begun to be able to enjoy sporting events again. Many of us have had the opportunities to get away for a while and enjoy some vacation time. These opportunities to gather and spend time with those we love once again have brought new life to many of us.

The same thing happens when we gather in church. When we gather, we find ourselves with others who live into and believe the promises of God. We see the face of Christ in those around us. We find that we not alone in the joys and the struggles that we face. We are restored and rejuvenated in our live together.

In Paul's letter to the Ephesians, Paul encourages the people in the church in Ephesus to continue in faith even in the midst of the struggles that they are facing in life and community. Paul is encouraging them to work together, to care for one another, to live into the promises that God provided for them in Jesus Christ. In the midst of this encouragement, Paul writes these words, "I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God" (Ephesians 3:18-19).

As a pastor, I believe that is what we hope and pray for all those whose paths we cross in this life, even for ourselves. We pray that all of you would have the power to comprehend the vastness of Christ's love for you and for all people. We pray that we all might be filled with the fullness of God's love to carry us through every day, through the bad and the good. The truth is, I am not sure that we can every fully comprehend just how much God loves us, and sometimes, it is much harder than others.

If I am honest, these past 18 months have been a struggle for me in this area. There have been times of anxiety, impatience, worry, depression, curiosity, frustration, sadness, grief, and all kinds of other emotions that have, at times, blocked my ability to comprehend God's love for me even as I continued to preach that promise for all of you. Maybe you have felt that way too, hearing the promise for you, but wondering about its truth in the midst of all that you have been facing in your life. My friends, the struggle is real and true, and I want you to know that you are not alone in this.


Dear Friends in Christ,

- · Am I willing to go wherever God sends me to serve the least of these, to advance his kingdom? (Isaiah 6:8)

We embody love by fully joining God in his biblical mission in the world which forsook comfort in pursuit of the coming kingdom of God.

Let us pray: Loving God, you have claimed us as your people. You have called us to be people of prayer, to love our neighbor as ourselves, to serve the least among us, and to make disciples. Fill us
