

Dear Friends in Christ,

CHURCH COUNCIL

We are grateful.

We would like to welcome three new members to our Worship and Music Team. Carol Judge will be leading our Faith Families. Lucas Golinghorst will be leading our livestream crew for worship. Linda Szemkus will be taking the lead of Altar Guild. We thank these new members for responding to the call to serve in this important ministry. We are grateful for Nancy Meyer who is retiring from leading the Altar Guild.

We are thankful for Tom Bauer for agreeing to share his time and talent to develop a safety policy for our congregation.

We continue to be thankful for all of those who gather for worship online, at home or in person as well as those who serve in worship. We also give thanks for those who have gathered to join or serve for Sunday school, confirmation, and youth. Gathering together is an important part of being a church family.

Council Business.

Communications/Sharing: Joni King shared her Faith Story with council this month, including how she felt called to help with our Youth Ministries over the past three years. Gary King visited the council for a few minutes to share his thanks and to share a suggestion he has with us.

Updates: We reviewed the result of the Audit (2018-19-20). The Finance Committee will work to improve our processes based upon the results of the audit. We reviewed the status of the Mutual Ministry appointments, the Nominating Committee work, our Annual Review Action Items and our Congregational Wide Goals. Pastor Carrie shared a summary of the Non-rostered staff Annual Review. Our employees gave us feedback that they are grateful for their work in this place, especially during the past two years.

Actions: The council and teams have submitted a preliminary budget for 2022. The finance committee has reviewed it and has given their feedback. We are working to clean up unused or unnecessary line items, ensure that remaining items have required supporting details, and include items that are necessary to grow in our ministries. Council discussed the fact that two people were injured in our building recently. We need to learn from this and work to prevent future injuries. Incident reports are being filed with our insurance and Tom Bauer will be leading efforts to define a safety policy that will help us to be more safe. We performed our annual membership review, which helps us to know who our active

of Jesus birth. **Children will be practicing Christmas carols during Sunday School beginning the middle of November**. We hope you come make a joyful noise with us.


Families Celebrate Advent and Christmas 2021-22

MICHELLE MESS – "My greatest memory was in 2019, when the adults painted the propane tanks! Every Mission adult participated, whether they were artists or not. The results were so good! The camp loves it when we come, because we are a creative and organized group. We get a lot done and have fun doing it."

MARY MOORE – "Having just lost my husband last year, I was at a place in my life where a different experience was needed. I needed something else to think about, so I asked Pastor Carrie if I could ride along. I think what touched me the most was the last morning; the counselors had everyone join in a large circle. They then had everyone join by holding part of a big ball of yarn. We were all connected by the same string. Then they cut the yarn between each person. They told us to take the yarn home and begin our own chain. Also Ranger Z was such a sweet person. Never criticized, but complemented the kids, and made suggestions of how a job could get done easier."

HO NELSON - "I brought a football along, and the boys loved it! I looked forward to the evening, so I could socialize with the kids. I always made them laugh. We had a rolling good time!"

DENISE WESTENDORF – "I liked the adventure! I was able to do things differently than I would have at home. I used power tools and operated the lift, then turned THAT over to Tom!"

39 energetic youth from Faith Lutheran Church arrived at Lutheran Lakeside Camp July 18 for a week of fun and fellowship. In addition to this group of young people, adult first timer, Mary Moore, joined veteran camp mission trip adults, Tom Bauer, Donna Darnell, Carrie Keppy, Nina Looney, Michelle Mess, HO Nelson and Denise Westendorf. These adults traveled to the camp to do volunteer work in

whatever capacity the camp needed. This is a recap of Lutheran Lakeside, through the eyes of these special adults.

After taking pictures and a prayer for a safe trip, 8 vehicles left the church on July 18. The caravan then proceeded to Lutheran Lakeside, stopping once to eat a box lunch at St. Peter Lutheran Church In Pocahontas, Iowa, along the way. Once they arrived at their destination, the students unloaded the vehicles and everyone proceeded to their cabins. The adults were assigned rooms in the Lodge, a large building with bedrooms on both sides, a common living room area, small kitchen and bathrooms. The men were assigned rooms to one side, and the women to the other, with 3 adults to each bedroom. Also sharing the lodge were two additional pastors.

Most of the work was done in the morning. HO Nelson and Donna Darnell were assigned jobs in the office, sorting and filing camper applications and doing some computer work. The other adults repaired hinges and rope systems on all of the cabin windows and spent time repairing the planter at the entrance of the camp. They pulled out rotten cut-off telephone poles and replaced the broken Plexiglas in the planter, in preparation for new landscape work that would be done next year. The adults also power washed and put a coat of polyurethane on the propane tanks (in 2019 our group, with the help of Joni Schneider, transformed plain white propane tanks to fun objects - a Yellow Submarine, a hotdog, a watermelon with a lady bug and butterfly and an aquarium). Manning saws, branch loppers and doing good old hard physical labor, they worked with our High School Mission kids to haul brush and clear trails, creating space for the new Frisbee golf course. (Ranger Z was thrilled that Carrie Keppy could operate a tractor!) They also helped to serve meals and clean up afterwards.

After lunch, these adults had their choice of camp activities with the kids; tiedying shirts, crafts in the Craft Barn, swimming, sailing, zip-lining, rock climbing, roller skating, or just hanging out and relaxing.

Following supper, time was spent in groups, first playing games with the Faith Lutheran group, then with the camp group as a whole, doing more swimming, boating, and riding boogie boards, culminating every night with the entire group around the campfire for prayer, singing and generally wind-down time. Often, the adults spent this time getting to know our other adult Mission workers, either in the quiet of their lodge, or in one
