Grace-Gifted, Faith-Lifted Called to Share, Seek, and Serve Christ



Dear Friends in Christ,

We are about to embark on our annual Lenten journey, beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 2. To be honest, the Ash Wednesday service is one of my favorite services of the year as it is, perhaps, the time when we stand before God and are most

honest about who we are as God's creation. My favorite element of this service is the time when we come forward to have ashes imposed upon our foreheads, and we hear these words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Remember that you are dust...We are called back to the story of creation in Genesis 2 when God gets down and dirty and creates from the dust of the earth the very first human, Adam, and then from Adam, a helpmate in Eve. Out of the dust God molded and formed humanity as those with whom God could and would be in relationship. God invested God's self to create us from the beginning. Throughout time, God has continued to invest God's self in leading, guiding and redeeming all those whom God as made, even becoming human in Jesus Christ to live among us, to teach us God's abundant love, to die for us to show us just how far God is willing to go to forgive our sins, and to rise again to give us the promise of eternal life. At our very core, we are the dust from which God has created us.

And to dust you shall return...Perhaps in these days more than ever, we are aware that the day will come when we will return to the dust from which God created us. We know that all that we are and all that we do in this life is only temporary, and in the end, we will all die, be returned to the dust, and rise in God's glory with Christ. In between these times of being created from dust and returning from dust, we seek to live our lives doing the good that God has created us to do, serving God and serving our neighbor out of that deep love that God has poured into us.

However, the other reality of Ash Wednesday is that we know that we do not live this life perfectly. We all do things in our lives that separate us from God and one another, the very definition of sin. Some of these things we do intentionally. Others of these things we do with the best intentions, but we fall short of our goal. Still others of these things we do completely unintentionally, never knowing the hurt that we leave in our wake. In these last two years, I have become all too aware of the ways in which I fall short. There is no handbook that ever could have prepared me for all of the changes, decisions and struggles that we have all faced throughout this pandemic. Throughout this time, I have made decisions that have hurt others. As I have sought to care for everyone, I know that I have caused pain to some. I am aware that I have hurt people unintentionally along the way. I am painfully aware that I have fallen short in many areas throughout this time, and I ask for your forgiveness and for God's forgiveness so that we can move forward together in proclaiming God's word in this place, in this community, and into the world.

On Ash Wednesday, we take the time to name this reality of falling short in our lives as we confess our sins before God and one another in a deeper way that we do in weekly worship. We join the words and heart of David as we recite together Psalm 51, pleading with God, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me" (Psalm 51:10). We will confess before God the ways that we have sinned in thought, word and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We will name before God the ways in which we have not loved, we have shut our ears, we have been unfaithful, we have been self-indulgent, we have neglected prayer and worship, we have neglected human need and suffering, we have had uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and we have failed to care for creation. We will ask God to restore us and forgive us all of our sins; however, we will not hear words of absolution on this night.

Throughout Lent, we will continue to hear the promises of God for us, forgiven sinners that we are, and then, on Maundy Thursday, we will gather again for worship and to hear the words of absolution, of the forgiveness of all of our sins, spoken to each of us individually. May this dance of confession and forgiveness free us to hear God's call to each of us as God seeks to gather us together as God's people to do God's work in the world.

Join us for the fullness of this Lenten journey, as we remember together who we are and to whom we belong as God's beloved children born out of dust and returning to dust through the grace of God in Christ Jesus.

A new COVID policy will take effect on March 1st. The most notable changes include:

You Heard? •Face coverings are *recommended* but not required at all times in the building except:

•8am service: masks will be required.

•Choir members will be masked while singing and instrumentalists will take proper precautions.

•Those assisting pastoral acts that are unable to distance shall be masked

•Those ministering to children under five years old shall be masked

•Food received in the building will be served using precautions, not buffet style.

•Please consider wearing a mask if you are in a small group setting and masks are requested by someone in the group.

Lutheran Lakeside Early Bird **Registration Ends February 28!!**

We are heading to Lutheran Lakeside for summer camp July 17-22. There is Junior Camp for those who have completed grades 3-5 and Confirmation Camp for those who have completed grades 6-8.

Summer Camp tabs for more information about the theme and daily schedule for camp. When you are ready to register, click on the Camp Registration tab. If you have been to camp before, you will have an account already set up. If you are new to camp, please create an account to register.

The total cost for a week at camp is \$470 for the first child. If you send more than one child from your household, there is a \$15 sibling discount for the second and subsequent children. A \$100 deposit is due at the time of registration. There is an Early Bird Discount of \$50 for all those who register by February 28. As in years past, Faith will cover \$150 of the cost of camp per child (including friends that they might invite). Therefore, the out-of-pocket cost, if you register by February 28, would be \$270 for your first child and \$255 for any additional children from your household. When you check out, use the Sponsorship Code 52748-22, and the \$150 discount will be applied to your account. Also let Pastor Carrie know when you have registered so that she can make sure that the discount is applied and have an accurate count of who is planning to go to help with the organization of transportation.

Also, adults are invited to join us for the adult mission trip to do work around the camp that week as well, so if that is something that would interest you, please let Pastor Carrie know.
